Meeting of the Council

You are summoned to a meeting of the Council which will be held on Wednesday 15 October 2014 at 10.00 am in the Council Chamber, Level 2, Manchester Town Hall Extension.

10. Motion – Votes for 16 and 17 year olds

We call on the City Council to:

- 1. Support the recent proposals by Manchester Youth Council to extend the franchise in all elections to 16 and 17 year olds.
- 2. Ask the government to back the policy announced by the Labour Party, in the spirit of their actions in the Scottish Referendum and extend the franchise in all elections to 16 and 17 year olds.
- 3. Work with Manchester Youth Council and Manchester Schools and Colleges to enhance citizenship education for all young people in Manchester.

11. Motion – Legal Highs

Council notes the increase in use as a popular recreational drug of nitrous oxide commonly known as "Laughing Gas", the taking of which is not illegal.

The recreational use of "Laughing Gas" does have a detrimental effect on users health and can lead to oxygen deprivation, causing loss of blood pressure, fainting and heart attacks and prolonged use can cause anaemia, bone marrow suppression and poisoning of the nervous system.

The misuse of "laughing gas" coincides with an increasing use of legal highs which has seen deaths more than double in the last four years, resent figures reveal they killed more people in 2013 than ecstasy.

This council calls on the Chief Executive

- To initiate a public awareness campaign on the harmful effects of 'Laughing Gas' and other legal highs, funded from the public health budget.
- To lobby Government to introduce legislation that bans the sale of all 'psychoative' (brain altering) drugs and then exempts some, such as alcohol and tobacco.

Information about the Council

The Council is composed of 96 councillors with one-third elected three years in four. Councillors are democratically accountable to residents of their ward. Their overriding duty is to the whole community, but they have a special duty to their constituents, including those who did not vote for them.

Seven individuals with previous long service as councillors of the city have been appointed Honorary Aldermen of the City of Manchester and are entitled to attend every Council meeting. They do not however have a vote on the decisions.

All councillors meet together as the Council under the chairship of the Lord Mayor of Manchester. There are seven meetings of the Council in each municipal year and they are open to the public. Here councillors decide the Council's overall strategic policies and set the Council budget each year.
