The Council welcomes the work of the Healthy Schools Team who work with schools on sex and relationships including issues such as domestic abuse, child sexual exploitation and female genital mutilation.

We believe that the work of the local authority is vital in making sure Manchester's young people are equipped with the knowledge and confidence to ask for help and support.

Council resolves to continue the work to promote healthy relationships within every Manchester primary and secondary school.

Council resolves to continue to prioritise this work with young people across the city by working with partners such as GMP, GMPCC, Unity Radio and other partner agencies. Although schools and academies do currently discuss domestic abuse CSE and FGM is covered very briefly within PSE and citizenship curriculum, as little as one 50 minute session or lesson is used to cover such serious topics, and almost no time at all left to discuss domestic abuse in same sex relationships or cultural difference within different ethnic minority groups due to the restraint of the national curriculum.

There is a direct correlation between poverty and domestic abuse, with the pending cuts coming and further destruction of the benefits system there will almost certainly be an increase of reports of abuse and even more unreported cases.

Although there is great work going on in our city through our partner agencies still 1 in 5 young people will be exposed to some form of abuse. Domestic abuse is a factor in 60% of all serious case reviews.

More needs to be done.

Manchester City Council expresses support for the Human Rights Act and the positive impact it has had on rights protection of individuals in the UK and welcomes the guidance the Human Rights Act provides for public authorities in ensuring policies are developed in line with international human rights standards. The Council calls on Government to retain the Human Rights Act, the protections within it and the UK's international obligations under the European Convention on Human Rights.

15. Notice of Motion - European Union referendum

This Council:

Welcomes the upcoming referendum on Britain's membership of the European Union and the opportunity it provides for a debate on this issue with the people of Manchester.

Recognises the significant investment there has been in Manchester over the last two decades as a result of funding from the European Union and continued investment over the next seven year EU budget cycle. Investment which helped to rebuild Manchester after the 1996 bomb, which has helped to create thousands of jobs, supported hundreds of local businesses and funded cutting edge research and innovation in our universities.

Acknowledges the major role of the European Union in advancing many of the social and employment rights we now take for granted - the guarantee of four weeks paid annual leave, strong health and safety protection in the workplace,

statutory maternity rights and paid parental leave and protection from discrimination, to name just a few.

Notes with concern the many risks involved in leaving the European Union and the impact 'Brexit' would have not only on jobs and investment in Manchester but also on the employment, social and consumer rights and protections our residents enjoy as a result of EU membership.

The Council resolves to:

Ask the Executive to produce an economic impact study to highlight the effects of EU membership on the city of Manchester and the risks of 'Brexit'.

Request that the Chief Executive explores ways in which the council working with partners could better promote European investment in local projects, organisations and businesses - and report the findings to the Economy scrutiny committee.

Recommend to the Executive that the council hosts a summit bringing together representatives from trade unions, local businesses, universities and civil society organisations to discuss the referendum campaign and the impact possible outcomes would have on the city.

Information about the Council

The Council is composed of 96 councillors with one-third elected three years in four. Councillors are democratically accountable to residents of their ward. Their overriding duty is to the whole community, but they have a special duty to their constituents, including those who did not vote for them.

Seven individuals with previous long service as councillors of the city have been appointed Honorary Aldermen of the City of Manchester and are entitled to attend every Council meeting. They do not however have a vote on the decisions.

All councillors meet together as the Council under the chairship of the Lord Mayor of Manchester. There are seven meetings of the Council in each municipal year and they are open to the public. Here councillors decide the Council's overall strategic policies and set the Council budget each year.
