We recognise too the magnificent response to this tragedy from people already at the scene, from first responders, from a vast range of public service workers, and from many ordinary members of the public.

We further recognise the exceptional way in which Manchester people from all parts and from all communities that make up this great city, came together in sympathy, in defiance and in unity.

The events of May 22 and the days after have made us aware that though the city has many award ceremonies that other than the Freedom of the City, we have nothing to recognise outstanding and exceptional contributions.

Therefore Council resolves to ask the Chief Executive
