Gaddum Centre (incorporating The Roby)	Provide a range of mental health support services within the community for adults registered with Central Manchester GP practices
Alternative Futures Group (Millbrook Independent Hospital)	Inpatient beds for people with mental health needs who need rehabilitation support
Creative Support (Barlow Moor Road & Birch Grove)	Accommodation with staff support for people with mental health problems who are not yet able to live independently

Making Space: Beyer Lodge	Nursing home accommodation with nursing input for older people with a complex mental health problem
Making Space: Monet Lodge Independent Hospital	Hospital care for older people with complex mental health problems

Approved Mental Health Professional (AMHP) Service *Community engagement and mental health support service (*Not Statutory)

Alzheimer's Society	Advice and support for people, their families and carers, living with dementia
Bangladeshi Women's Organisation	This group delivers support primarily to Bangladeshi women who are living with mental ill health. Based in central Manchester, with outreach to other areas.
LMCP Care Link	Support group, offering advice and an outreach worker for South Asian women with Mental Health ill health in the Longsight and Moss side area of the city
Manchester Mind – Café	Deliver a café in two centres across the city. The café's offer a range of work and volunteering opportunities for people living with mental ill health

Manchester Mind – Advice	An advice service for residents with mental health needs, providing information and advice around benefits, debts, housing and signposting to other services.
Mood Swings	Helpline - provides support for people including family, friends and employers for people experiencing mental health ill to become well. Support can be face to face, by phone or email
NEESA	Mental Health advice, support and outreach for South Asian women primarily in North Manchester — offering volunteer opportunities and access to health education sessions.
St Luke's Art Project	Provide centre based art activities for residents in and around central Manchester with metal ill health issues

Creative Support	24 hour and daytime supported accommodation for people that have experienced mental ill-health and need support to help them regain their independence. Range of services for different target groups and needs – male, female, BME, young people. Visiting and floating support services to support community living.
Great Places Housing Association - Next Step Palatine Road	24Hr supported accommodation for people that have experienced mental ill-health and need support to help them regain their independence
Irwell Valley - Morris Court	Daytime supported accommodation for people that have experienced mental ill-health and need support to help them regain their independence
Making Space	Visiting / Floating support service for people that have experienced mental ill-health and need support to help them regain their independence

Challenges

- Long Waits for some services, and thus limited access and not as responsive as needed
- Fragmentation of providers across the city, which can result in difficulty for patients in easily accessing the right help
- Fragmentation in transition for young people to adults
- There are still some people in receipt of care offered out of area (outside of Manchester)
- There is a need to provide more proactive and less reactive care, so people can get evidenced based care as early on as possible
- There is a need to ensure that services deliver improved outcomes for people – with more of a focus on recovery and to have an improved quality of life
- Financial challenges within the system
