
How we work




- Community based outreach model
- Utilising and strengthening local assets across Greater Manchester
- Working with local groups and providers within each locality to engage with those most marginalised or seldom heard
- Strength based approach of improving knowledge, skills, confidence and access to sexual health services



- One to one support provided by skilled and experienced advisers
- Health and Wellbeing Assessments for people newly diagnosed to ascertain levels of knowledge, understanding and emotional response to diagnosis
- Online referral system easy for clinic staff to refer
- Counselling and Peer Mentoring



- Utilising community assets (people and place) across Greater Manchester to increase access to empowering workshops, resources and services
- Equip our community with the skills and knowledge to make informed decisions to reduce their risk of STI and HIV exposure
- Diagnostic and holistic approach to address health inequalities faced by our community

- Pharmacy based point of care testing across Salford and Manchester to complement their provision of sexual health services in the community
- Dried blood spot home sampling kits distribution in high risk venues
- Asset based community development
- Online bookings for point of care testing

- Further consolidation of relationships with clinic staff to ensure that everyone receiving a diagnosis of HIV has access to support, advice and information
- Continuing to play a part in the wider ambition of ending HIV in a generation
