#### 1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 At its meeting of 19 July 2016, following consideration of the Manchester City Council Climate Change Action Plan and Emissions report the Neighbourhoods and Environment Scrutiny Committee agreed to establish a Task and Finish Group to undertake a detailed investigation into the issue of air quality (see minutes NESC/16/13).
- 1.2 The proposed name for the group is the 'Air Quality Task and Finish Group'. The term 'Task and Finish Group' is used to refer to subgroups which carry out an investigation and report their findings.
- 1.3 This report sets out a programme of work to investigate the areas identified by Committee members.
