5 **[10.05-10.40] Manchester Town Hall and Albert Square: 'Our Town Hall'** The report of the Deputy Chief Executive (Growth and Neighbourhoods) **was previously circulated.**

6 **[10.40 – 11.15] Manchester Central** Report of the City Treasurer

This report provides an impact assessment of the proposed closure of the Town Hall on Manchester Central; a Manchester City Council owned business which currently provides conferencing and catering services to designated spaces of the Town Hall and Central Library. The report summarises the impact of the potential closure on Manchester Central's people, profit, shareholder return, brand and strategic offering, along with mitigating actions identified. The report also highlights the potential opportunities for Manchester Central post development.

[11.15 -11.50] The Council's Budget Response to the result of the EU referendum – Withdrawn This report has been withdrawn from the agenda of this meeting.

The Committee received a paper in December 2016 on matters arising for European Funding following the Referendum result. Since that time there has been no change with the City Council and City partners still accessing the ERDF and ESF funds allocated to it for the period 2014-20 and still accessing other EU funds where they fit City priorities. This is in line with HM Government assurances that the UK can continue to seek EU funding and deliver EU funded projects up to the point that the UK leaves the EU and that, after that date, the Government will honour any funding agreements for projects provided they continue to offer value for money and are in line with national priorities. Further updates will be made after the triggering of Article 50 which is expected by the end of March 2017.

Information about the Committee

Scrutiny Committees represent the interests of local people about important issues that affect them. They look at how the decisions, policies and services of the Council and other key public agencies impact on the city and its residents. The Resources and Governance Scrutiny Committee areas of interest include finances, Council buildings, staffing, corporate and partnership governance as well as Council tax and benefits administration.

The Council wants to consult people as fully as possible before making decisions that affect them. Members of the public do not have a right to speak at meetings but may do so if invited by the Chair. If you have a special interest in an item on the agenda and want to speak, tell the Committee Officer, who will pass on your request to the Chair. Groups of people will usually be asked to nominate a spokesperson. The Council wants its meetings to be as open as possible but occasionally there will be some confidential business. Brief reasons for confidentiality will be shown on the agenda sheet.

The Council welcomes the filming, recording, public broadcast and use of social media to report on the Committee's meetings by members of the public.
