Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance	Risk of public nuisance from litter, increased footfall and noise from customers.

Agreements between parties

Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance:

- The premises and immediate surrounding area shall be kept clean and free from litter at all times the premises are open to the public;
- No rubbish, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 22:00 and 07:00 hours;
- Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly;
- Litter bins shall be provided at the premises in sufficient capacity to ensure that customers can adequately dispose of any litter.

Proposed licensable activities and opening hours to be granted

- 1. Vary the layout of the premises in accordance with the plans attached to this application;
- Remove the non-standard timings for Good Friday and Christmas Day;
- 3. Extend the hours for late night refreshment on a Friday, Saturday and Sunday so that they are in line with the hours for the sale of alcohol;
- 4. Remove Conditions 1, 5, 7 and 9 of Annex 2.
- 5. Remove Condition 1 of Annex 3 and replace with the following: 'The management will carry out regular perimeter checks to ensure that regulated entertainment is not causing a nuisance at nearby noise sensitive premises.'
- 6. Remove Condition 3 of Annex 3.
- 7. Amend Condition 4 of Annex 3 so that it reads as follows: 'The forecourt area will not used after 23:00 except for access/egress and/or for smokers.'

The premises licence has recently been transferred to a new operator and the purpose of the above is to ensure that the licence is fit for purpose. The conditions referred to above are either outdated, duplicated by alternative legislation or not relevant to the style of operation of the premises.

Description of proposed variation:

- 1. To extend the hours for the sale of alcohol and provision of regulated entertainment on Fridays and Saturdays until 04:00, and on Wednesdays & Thursdays until 02:00. Late Night Refreshment on Fridays & Saturdays until 04:30, and on Wednesdays and Thursdays until 02:30; and
- 2. To remove Conditions 8 to 11 of Annex 3 of the premises licence as a consequence of the above amendments being authorised

For information – the conditions requested to be removed are:

- On Friday and Saturday trading hours for the provision of regulated entertainment (films and recorded music) shall be: 1000 – 0200.
- On Friday and Saturday trading hours for the provision of late night refreshment shall be: 1000 0200.
- On Friday and Saturday trading hours for the supply of alcohol for consumption both on and off the premises shall be: 1000 0200.
- On Friday and Saturday opening hours for the premises shall be: 1000 0230

Representations received	
Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance	The LOOH team raises concerns that granting the application with the current operating schedule is likely to lead to issues of public nuisance. The team propose four conditions, which relate to the issues that they believe could potentially arise, "to assist the applicant in promotion of the licensing objectives".

Agreements between parties

Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance:

- There shall be a documented smoking and dispersal polices agreed with the Manchester City Council Environmental Health section, implemented at the premises and a copy lodged with the Council's Licensing Unit.
- 2. There shall be no admittance or re-admittance to the premises after 03:00 hours.
- 3. When the premises are carrying on licensable activities after 02:30 hours, at least 2 registered door supervisors are to be on duty at each door used for entry or exit.
- 4. The Nitenet radio link shall be operated from 22:00 hours until the premises have closed. The radio shall be kept in good working order, operated by a responsible member of staff and used to report incidents of crime and disorder to the CCTV control room and other radio users.
