Greater Manchester Police	The operating schedule which accompanies the application offers conditions but GMP believes that some of these need to be worded more robustly so as best to demonstrate that the 4 Licensing Objectives won't be undermined. Conditions are proposed which address the specific concerns.	
Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance	The objection proposes conditions to "mitigate some of our concerns around neighbours being disturbed". The proposed conditions reflect the specific concerns.	
Manchester City Council Trading Standards Service	The applicant has proposed conditions however Trading Standards considers that more robust conditions are needed. The conditions that are proposed reflect the	

specific concerns of this team.

Agreements between parties

Greater Manchester Police:

The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points and the street environment will be covered, enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recording shall be kept available and unedited for a minimum of 28 days with the date and time stamping. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present on the premises at all times when they are open to the public and must be able to produce / download / burn CCTV images upon request by a police officer or an authorised officer of the licensing authority. Any footage must be in a format so it can be played back on a standard personal computer or standard DVD player. Where the recording is on a removable medium (i.e. compact disc, flash card etc.), a secure storage system to store those recording mediums shall be provided.

The Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that a written notice of authority is kept at the premises for all staff who sell alcohol. The notice shall be made available for inspection upon request of the police or an authorised officer of the licensing authority and all staff selling alcohol must be in possession of formal identification to enable to verify their identity against the notice.

The premises shall display prominent signage indicating at any point of sale, at the entrance to the premises and in all areas where alcohol is located that it is an offence to buy, or attempt to buy, alcohol for a person under the age of 18. (a similar condition has been proposed by Trading Standards – please use composite condition at end that incorporates the wording of both)

In addition to any other training, the premises licence holder shall ensure all staff are trained to prevent underage sales, to be aware of and prevent proxy sales, to maintain the refusals log, enter sales correctly on the tills so the prompts show as appropriate and monitor staff to ensure their training is put into practice. Documented records of training completed shall be kept for each member of staff. Training shall be regularly refreshed and at no greater than 6 monthly intervals. (Trading Standards has proposed 2 conditions regarding training / records of training. Please use the conditions proposed by Trading Standards as they include some additional wording)

Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance:

A notice will be on display requesting customers respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises quietly.

Staff shall monitor customers smoking outside the premises on a regular basis and ensure patrons do not cause a public nuisance. A documented smoking policy will be put in place, as agreed with the Manchester City Council Environmental Health section, implemented at the premises and a copy lodged with the Council's Licensing Unit.

Trading Standards:

The Challenge 25 scheme must be operated including at the point of delivery to ensure that any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall provide documented proof that he/she is over 18 years of age. Proof of age shall only comprise a passport, photo card driving licence, an HM Forces warrant card, or a card bearing the PASS hologram.

The premises shall display prominent signage indicating at any point of sale, at the entrance to the premises and in all areas where alcohol is located that the Challenge 25 scheme is in operation.

The premises shall display prominent signage indicating at any point of sale that it is an offence to buy or attempt to buy alcohol for a person who is under 18 and for a person under the age of 18 to buy or attempt to buy alcohol. (a similar condition has been proposed by GMP – please use composite condition at end that incorporates the wording of both)

In addition to any other training, the premises licence holder shall ensure that all staff are trained to prevent underage sales, are aware of and prevent proxy sales, maintain the refusals log, enter sales correctly on the tills so the prompts show as appropriate, and that they monitor staff to ensure their training is put into practice.

Documented records of training completed shall be kept for each member of staff. Training shall be regularly refreshed and at no greater than 6 monthly intervals. Training records shall be made available for inspection upon request by a police officer or an authorised officer of Manchester City Council.

A log shall be kept at the premises to record all refused sales of alcohol for the reasons that the person(s) is/are, or appear(s) to be, under 18 years of age. The log shall record the date and time of the refusal and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The log will be available on request by the police or an authorised officer of Manchester City Council. The log shall be checked on a regular basis by the Designated Premises Supervisor to ensure that it is being used by staff and each check shall be recorded in the log.

Composite condition regarding underage sales and signage regarding underage sales (incorporates wording from both GMP and Trading Standards:

The premises shall display prominent signage indicating at any point of sale, at the entrance to the premises and in all areas where alcohol is located, that it is an offence to buy or attempt to buy alcohol for a person who is under 18 and for a person under the age of 18 to buy or attempt to buy alcohol.

To prevent this they have proposed a number of licence conditions.

- 1. Customers will not be permitted to remove from the premises any drinks supplied by the premises (alcoholic or otherwise) in open containers except for consumption in any delineated external area as shown on the plan attached to the licence.

I have found the owners of Mala to be extremely supportive to members of our building and communicate with everyone openly on our building facebook page. I believe the measures they are putting in place of giving everyone a direct line to complain if needed a positive sign showing that they truly believe there should be no issues but also if there are a commitment to dealing with them. They also had an open evening for any members of the building to attend and showed the level that any music played would be at which I couldn't hear from during or even really until we got inside.

The opening hours are more than reasonable and will move crowds away from the building at a good hour for those concerned about sleep issues.
