1.0 Introduction

1.1 This report details proposed changes to the remit of some of the Council's Scrutiny Committees, following consultation with all six Scrutiny Chairs, the Executive Leader and Strategic Directors

2.0 Background

- 2.1 Whilst each of the six Scrutiny Committees have a wide remit of areas that come under their individual area of responsibility, it has been recognised that some of the Committees have a greater number of areas than others.
- 2.3 Although each Committee is responsible for developing and determining its own work programme for a Municipal Year, capacity has to be built into this to allow for items of business to be submitted that can not be foreseen far in advance which require Scrutiny Committees to consider in advance of any decisions being taken.
- 2.2 Whilst acknowledging that effective scrutiny does not require every area within a Committee's remit to be scrutinised in any given Municipal Year, for those Committees that have a large number of areas that it is responsible for scrutinising, this places a greater strain on their ability to ensure the Committee is fulfilling its role to the best of its abilities.

3.0 Proposals

- 3.1 It is recognised that the current demands across the committees vary and an element of alignment is necessary. Appendix 1 details the current remit of the Council's Scrutiny Committees.
- 3.2 As such it is proposed that a small number of items move committee, for example aligning all compliance in one place to enable an improved alignment of areas of responsibility. Appendix 2 details the proposed revised remit of the Council's Scrutiny Committees.
- 3.3 In addition it has also been recognised that names of committees should reflect the areas they are responsible for. Economy Scrutiny committee also covers all areas of regeneration and housing and should be reflected in its title. The Environment and Climate Change Scrutiny Committee also has responsibility for Scrutinising areas within the Council's Neighbourhood Services Directorate such as waste, recycling, parks and green spaces and as such, it is felt that this should be accurately reflected in the Committees title.

1 Introduction

- 1.1 Government regulations require the Council to appoint membership of its committees in accordance with the principles of political balance as far as reasonably practicable.
- 1.2 The composition of the Council after the election is **88 Labour**, **4 Liberal Democrat and 4 Green**
- 1.3 The Committee is asked to make recommendations to the Council about the size and the membership of committees. The Committee is asked to take into consideration, where appropriate, virus transmission safety measures arising from the COVID-19 pandemic which are likely to remain an important factor as restrictions are eased in order to work safely together.
- 1.4 The Committee is also asked to note the Terms of Reference of Scrutiny Committees (Part 3 Section E - Council's Constitution: February 2021) state a minimum of 10 members for each committee.

2 Other Committees

2.1 Some of the Council's committees are subject to specific rules about membership. These details are included below. The Committee is asked to make recommendations to Council about the membership of these committees.

Employee Appeals Committee

- 2.2 The composition of the Committee consists of the following structure:
 - The Executive Member with a relevant portfolio (i.e. Executive Member for the service in which the employee was working or the Executive Member with a portfolio relevant to the specific subject area of the appeal) or an appropriate Assistant Executive Member; and
 - Two Elected Members drawn from the Council's Executive Members or the Assistant Executive Members, or Elected Members drawn from a prescribed 'pool' of 15 members.
- 2.3 The Constitutional and Nomination Committee is asked to confirm this composition and agree the Elected Members in the prescribed pool.

Health and Wellbeing Board

- 2.4 The membership of the Health and Wellbeing Board comprises of Elected Members as well as NHS and council officers. The membership was established at the meeting of Council on 27 March 2013 and subsequent amendments have been agreed through the Constitutional and Nomination Committee.

- 2.0 Greater Manchester Combined Authority (GMCA) and Association of Greater Manchester Authorities (AGMA) nominations
- 2.1 The Council may, if it wishes, make nomination to a number of GMCA and AGMA positions (as detailed in the table appended to the report), however the final decisions on these appointments rest with the GMCA and AGMA Executive Boards at their Annual Meeting due to take place on 26 May 2023
- 2.2 In this instance, any nomination(s) submitted by the Council may not necessarily be appointed.

- 2.3 Each Local Authority district is asked to make 6 nominations. 4 of these nominations should be from the ruling group (2 members and 2 substitutes) and 1 member and 1 substitute from the opposition group(s), except where there is a hung council or no opposition group.
- 2.4 The GMCA will make a selection of 20 members and 20 substitutes at its meeting on 26 May, determined by the political balance across all of Greater Manchester, and the members selected will be notified accordingly.
