1. <u>Introduction</u>

- 1.1 On 14/02/2019, an application for the grant of a Premises Licence under s17 of the Licensing Act 2003 was made in respect of Q Plus Tropical Taste Restaurant, 1038 Ashton New Road, Manchester, M11 4PE in the Clayton and Openshaw ward of Manchester. A location map and photograph of the premises is attached at **Appendix 1** (NB: premises previously traded as Palms Restaurant and Bar).
- 1.2 A 28-day public consultation exercise was undertaken in accordance with Licensing Act 2003 regulations; requiring the application to be advertised by the displaying of a blue notice at or on the premises, a notice published in a newspaper or similar circulating in the local area, and details of the application published on the Council's website.
- 1.3 Representations may be made for or against an application during the consultation period. To be 'relevant' and, therefore, able to be taken into account in determining the application, they must be about the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives. Where representations are made by persons who are not a responsible authority, they must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 1.4 Relevant representations have been received in respect of this application and so it must be determined by a Licensing Hearing Panel in accordance with the Council's Constitution.

2. The Application

- 2.1 A copy of the application is attached at **Appendix 2.**
- 2.2 The applicant is Mr Nimba Francois Edi.
- 2.3 The description of the premises by the applicant is:
- 2.3.1 'The Q Plus Tropical Taste Restaurant (QPTTR) with its internal space average of 50 square metre wide is situated on No.1038 Ashton New Road, replacing the former Palms Restaurant, recently closed. The premises is situated 150 yards from the local shopping centre Aldi, Iceland and the Spar convenience shop (on) Ashton New Road.'
- 2.4 The proposed designated premises supervisor is Mr Nimba Francois Edi.

2.5 The licensable activities applied for:

Provision of regulated entertainment (recorded music): Sun to Thu 10.00am to 10.30pm Fri to Sat 10.00am to 00.30am

Provision of late night refreshment: Fri to Sat 2300 to 00.30am

The supply of alcohol for consumption both on and off the premises:

Sun to Thu 10.00am to 10.30pm Fri to Sat 10.00am to 00.30am

Opening hours: Sun to Thu 9.00am to 11.00pm Fri to Sat 9.00am to 1.00am

- 2.5.1 In accordance with the Live Music Act 2012 and Deregulation Act 2015, performances of Live Music and Recorded Music between the hours of 0800 and 2300 hours have been deregulated and so should not be regarded as licensable activities for the purposes of this application.
- 2.5.2 Any further details provided relating to any of the individual licensable activities are specified on the application form at **Appendix 2**.
- 2.6 Activities unsuitable for children
- 2.6.1 The applicant has not highlighted any adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.
- 2.7 Steps to promote the licensing objectives
- 2.7.1 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by taking the steps identified in the operating schedule.
- 2.7.2 These steps must be translated into conditions by the licensing authority to be included in any granted premises licence, unless the conditions are modified by the Panel following consideration of relevant representations. These conditions are set out in the Schedule of Conditions at **Appendix 4**.
- 2.8 Further documentation accompanying the application
- 2.8.1 The applicant has not submitted any documents in support of their application.

3. Relevant Representations

A total of 5 relevant representations were received in respect of the application (**Appendix 3**). The personal details of all members of the public have been redacted. Original copies of these representations will be available to the Panel at the hearing.

- 3.2 Summary of the representations:

Party	Grounds of representation	Recommends
Licensing and Out of Hours Compliance	Due to historical public nuisance issues attached to the premises (during the premises' previous operating period as 'Palms' restaurant under a different Premises Licence Holder) LOOH Compliance are not satisfied that the applicant has displayed sufficient understanding of his responsibilities in regard to adhering to and upholding The Four Licensing Objectives (with particular reference to the prevention of public nuisance). The applicant has stated that he intends to operate the premises in line with the previous operating schedule, this has caused certain concern for LOOH Compliance as 22 conditions were attached to the previous licence via a Licensing Subcommittee hearing. LOOH compliance are recommending that the application be granted with the addition of the 20 conditions as outlined in Annexe 3.	Grant with conditions
Residents (x4)	Collectively, the four private residents who have submitted representations against the application have expressed similar concerns relating to the potential re-occurrence of public nuisance and antisocial behaviour emanating from the premises, should the application be granted. They have based their concerns primarily as a consequence of their experiences when the premises was operating as Palms Restaurant and are collectively requesting that the application for a new premises licence is not granted. 3.3 Any conditions proposed by objectors are set out in the Schedule of Conditions at **Appendix 4**.

4. Key Policies and Considerations

4.1 Legal Considerations

4.1.1 Hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 operate under the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

4.2 **New Information**

4.2.1 In accordance with Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings)
Regulations 2005, the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations

or notice either before the hearing or, with the consent of all parties, at the hearing.

4.3 **Hearsay Evidence**

4.3.1 The Panel may accept hearsay evidence and it will be a matter for the Panel to attach what weight to it that they consider appropriate. Hearsay evidence is evidence of something that a witness neither saw nor heard, but has heard or read about.

4.4 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003

- 4.4.1 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 is provided for all parties involved in licensing. It is a key medium for promoting best practice, ensuring consistent application of licensing powers across England and Wales and for promoting fairness, equal treatment and proportionality.
- 4.4.2 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. The Guidance is therefore binding on all licensing authorities to that extent. However, the Guidance cannot anticipate every possible scenario or set of circumstances that may arise and, as long as licensing authorities have properly understood this Guidance, they may depart from it if they have good reason to do so and can provide full reasons.
- 4.4.3 Departure from the Guidance could give rise to an appeal or judicial review, and the reasons given will then be a key consideration for the courts when considering the lawfulness and merits of any decision taken.

4.5 Manchester Statement of Licensing Policy

- 4.5.1 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' its statement of licensing policy.
- 4.5.2 The Licensing Policy sets out the vision the licensing authority has for the regulation of licensed premises throughout Manchester and outlines the standards expected in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives in the city. The Panel may depart from the policies should it consider doing so would benefit the promotion of the licensing objectives. Reasons are to be given for any such departure from the Policy.
- 4.5.3 Section 4 of the Policy (Operation of the Policy) sets out how the Licensing Policy is intended to be used in practice for licence applications and licensed premises.
- 4.5.4 Relevant to this application and the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following sections of the Policy:

The policy also sets out particular measures it expects operators to pay special attention to in order to ensure their operation will not add to the problems within this area. Operators are not required to do so, but where the authority's discretion is engaged, any applications that fail to address all appropriate measures may be refused or have conditions applied to comply with the policy measures.

Ancoats and New Islington

The effect of the special policy is that the Council will generally only permit licensable activities for premises in the Ancoats and New Islington Regeneration Framework area until the terminal hours set out below whenever it receives relevant representation, unless an applicant can demonstrate there are exceptional circumstance to justify a departure from the policy in the individual circumstances:

11pm (Sunday to Thursday)

12am midnight (Friday, Saturday)

The special policy applies to on and off sales of alcohol. Where alcohol is sold for consumption on the premises, our policy will be to generally provide 30 minutes 'drinking up' time between the terminal hour for the sale of alcohol and the closing time of the premises.

Section 6: What we aim to encourage

This section identifies certain types of venues and initiatives the licensing authority aims to encourage in order to promote an inclusive evening and night-time economy not simply focused on the consumption of alcohol. We aim to encourage:

- Premises that will extend the diversity of entertainment and attract a wider range of participants
- Live music, especially original material, which will provide a range of live performances and styles of music, provided that such entertainment does not undermine the licensing objectives
- National cultural institutions, global sports events and cultural festivals

- Non-drink-led premises, including restaurants, cafes, theatres and cinemas
- Communication and integration with local residents and businesses through licensees consulting with those in the local area prior to an application
- Participation in Pubwatches, off licence forums and other crimereduction partnerships
- Engagement with the NITENET radio scheme and DISC secure information sharing platform by city centre venues through the Cityco Manchester Business Crime Reduction Partnership
- Designing out crime in the layout of the premises

Section 7: Local factors

This section sets out key issues that applicants are expected to take into account relevant to the individual characteristics of the premises when preparing their operating schedule and address any local factors relevant to their premises.

- Having regard to the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following Factors:
- Identified risk factors specific to the licensed premises
- Evidence of pre-existing problems in the area
- Proximity of takeaways and licences to nightlife entertainment areas
- Consistency with relevant Council strategies
- The proximity of the premises to local residents and other local businesses, particularly in relation to the potential for nuisance
- Proximity to sensitive uses
- The availability of transport to and from the premises
- Ability to clean and maintain the street scene
- Premises in proximity to the airport

Section 8: Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives

This section identifies the standards that the licensing authority expects of licensed premises in Manchester. It is recognised that not all standards will be appropriate to apply in every situation to every premises, and applicants are not obliged to include all standards in their operating schedule. The degree to which standards would be appropriate is expected to be proportionate to the

risk posed against the promotion of the licensing objectives having regard to the individual circumstances of the premises. The standards are not exhaustive and the licensing authority will have regard to any relevant issues raised in any representation that may fall outside them.

MS1 Implement effective security measures at the premises MS2 Effective general management of the premises MS3 Responsible promotion and sale of alcohol MS4 Prevent the use of illegal drugs, new psychoactive substances (NPS) and the spiking of drinks at the premises MS5 Prevent on-street consumption of alcohol MS6 Provide a Duty of Care for intoxicated or vulnerable customers and medical emergencies MS7 Maintain a safe capacity MS8 Prevent noise nuisance from the premises MS9 Effectively manage exterior spaces (e.g. beer gardens, smoking areas, table and chair areas on the highway) MS10 Operate effective cleansing arrangements, including ensuring the premises and surrounding area are kept clean and free of litter, and adequate arrangements for the secure and responsible storage of refuse MS11 Ensure the wellbeing of children on the premises MS12 Prevent underage sales of alcohol, including proxy sales

Section 9: Alcohol delivery services

This section sets out specific provisions for alcohol delivery services to be considered in conjunction with relevant standards from Section 8 of the Policy

Section 10: Adult entertainment (including striptease, nudity and other entertainment of a sexual nature)

This section sets out specific considerations in respect of applications to provide adult entertainment, including entertainment of a sexual nature e.g. nudity, striptease and lap dancing.

Section 11: The use of tables and chairs on the public highway

This section provides that the operation of any areas on the public highway licensed for tables and chairs should be considered with regard to all relevant Standards set out in Section 8 of the Policy.


Section 12: Premises Licences for large-scale public events

This section sets out particular expectations regarding large scale public events, given the specific associated risks.

5. Conclusion

- 5.1 A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act ("licensing functions") with a view to promoting the licensing objectives:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - the protection of children from harm.
- 5.2 In considering the matter, the Panel should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representations made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be. In reaching the decision, regard must also be had to relevant provisions of the national guidance and the Council's licensing policy statement.
- 5.3 Having regard to the representations, the Panel must take such of the steps set out below that it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - a) To grant the licence subject to:
 - i. the conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, which the Panel may modify to such extent as they consider appropriate, and
 - ii. any mandatory conditions that must be included in the licence;
 - b) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - c) To refuse to specify the person proposed in the application as the designated premises supervisor;
 - d) To reject the application.
- 5.4 The conditions consistent with the operating schedule may be modified to alter or omit any of them or to add any new condition, including restricting the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.

- 5.5 All licensing determinations should be considered on the individual merits of the application.
- 5.6 The Panel's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 5.7 It is important that a licensing authority should give comprehensive reasons for its decisions in anticipation of any appeals. Failure to give adequate reasons could itself give rise to grounds for an appeal.
- 5.8 The Panel is asked to determine the application.

Section M of the application allows the applicant to describe the steps in which they will promote the licensing objectives, the applicant does not show that they have a full understanding of the 4 licensing objectives as they seem to have put a lot of duplicated information in all sub sections which relates to CCTV, Door supervision, and alcohol sales and does not take into account anything relating to prevention of public nuisance in the form of noise break out from music or from customers inside, congregating outside, any dispersal policy or policy relating to outside area in the late hours applied for.

According to the records held by the premise licensing team the property previously had a premise licence until 06/11/2018 in the name of Palms, the previous licence laspsed due to the licence holding company being dissolved and although there is no links between the old owner and the new applicant, the new applicant makes reference in the application in part 3 of the operating schedule that they want to operate the premise in line with the previous premise known as Palms. The previous premises licence had 26 conditions attached to it, 22 conditions were added to the licence after an hearing by the licensing authority.

So based on the above information I would recommended the application being approved with slight amendment to the operating schedule to allow them to:

Open to the public

Sun –Thurs 1100 to 2300 Fri - Sat 1100 to 0100

To supply alcohol





According to the records held by the premise licensing team the property previously had a premise licence until 06/11/2018 in the name of Palms, the previous licence laspsed due to the licence holding company being dissolved and although there is no links between the old owner and the new applicant, the new applicant makes reference in the application in part 3 of the operating schedule that they want to operate the premise in line with the previous premise known as Palms. The previous premises licence had 26 conditions attached to it, 22 conditions were added to the licence after an hearing by the licensing authority.

- 5.4.3 Departure from the Guidance could give rise to an appeal or judicial review, and the reasons given will then be a key consideration for the courts when considering the lawfulness and merits of any decision taken.

5.5 Manchester Statement of Licensing Policy

- 5.5.1 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' its statement of licensing policy.
- 5.5.2 The Licensing Policy sets out the vision the licensing authority has for the regulation of licensed premises throughout Manchester and outlines the standards expected in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives in the city. The Panel may depart from the policies should it consider doing so would benefit the promotion of the licensing objectives. Reasons are to be given for any such departure from the Policy.
- 5.5.3 Section 4 of the Policy (Operation of the Policy) sets out how the Licensing Policy is intended to be used in practice for licence applications and licensed premises.
- 5.5.4 Relevant to this application and the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following sections of the Policy:

Section 6: What we aim to encourage

This section identifies certain types of venues and initiatives the licensing authority aims to encourage in order to promote an inclusive evening and night-time economy not simply focused on the consumption of alcohol. We aim to encourage:

- Premises that will extend the diversity of entertainment and attract a wider range of participants
- Live music, especially original material, which will provide a range of live performances and styles of music, provided that such entertainment does not undermine the licensing objectives

- National cultural institutions, global sports events and cultural festivals
- Non-drink-led premises, including restaurants, cafes, theatres and cinemas
- Communication and integration with local residents and businesses through licensees consulting with those in the local area prior to an application
- Participation in Pubwatches, off licence forums and other crime-reduction partnerships
- Engagement with the NITENET radio scheme and DISC secure information sharing platform by city centre venues through the Cityco Manchester Business Crime Reduction Partnership
- Designing out crime in the layout of the premises

Section 7: Local factors

This section sets out key issues that applicants are expected to take into account relevant to the individual characteristics of the premises when preparing their operating schedule and address any local factors relevant to their premises.

Having regard to the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following Factors:

- Identified risk factors specific to the licensed premises
- Evidence of pre-existing problems in the area
- Proximity of takeaways and licences to nightlife entertainment areas
- Consistency with relevant Council strategies
- The proximity of the premises to local residents and other local businesses, particularly in relation to the potential for nuisance
- Proximity to sensitive uses
- The availability of transport to and from the premises
- Ability to clean and maintain the street scene
- Premises in proximity to the airport

Section 8: Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives

This section identifies the standards that the licensing authority expects of licensed premises in Manchester. It is recognised that not all standards will be appropriate to apply in every situation to every premises, and applicants are not

obliged to include all standards in their operating schedule. The degree to which standards would be appropriate is expected to be proportionate to the risk posed against the promotion of the licensing objectives having regard to the individual circumstances of the premises. The standards are not exhaustive and the licensing authority will have regard to any relevant issues raised in any representation that may fall outside them.

MS1	Implement effective security measures at the premises
MS2	Effective general management of the premises
MS3	Responsible promotion and sale of alcohol
MS4	Prevent the use of illegal drugs, new psychoactive substances (NPS) and the spiking of drinks at the premises
MS5	Prevent on-street consumption of alcohol
MS6	Provide a Duty of Care for intoxicated or vulnerable customers and medical emergencies
MS7	Maintain a safe capacity
MS8	Prevent noise nuisance from the premises
MS9	Effectively manage exterior spaces (e.g. beer gardens, smoking areas, table and chair areas on the highway)
MS10	Operate effective cleansing arrangements, including ensuring the premises and surrounding area are kept clean and free of litter, and adequate arrangements for the secure and responsible storage of refuse
MS11	Ensure the wellbeing of children on the premises
MS12	Prevent underage sales of alcohol, including proxy sales

Section 9: Alcohol delivery services

This section sets out specific provisions for alcohol delivery services to be considered in conjunction with relevant standards from Section 8 of the Policy

Section 10: Adult entertainment (including striptease, nudity and other entertainment of a sexual nature)

This section sets out specific considerations in respect of applications to provide adult entertainment, including entertainment of a sexual nature e.g. nudity, striptease and lap dancing.

Section 11: The use of tables and chairs on the public highway

This section provides that the operation of any areas on the public highway licensed for tables and chairs should be considered with regard to all relevant Standards set out in Section 8 of the Policy.

Section 12: Premises Licences for large-scale public events

This section sets out particular expectations regarding large scale public events, given the specific associated risks.

6. Conclusion


- A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act ("licensing functions") with a view to promoting the licensing objectives:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - the protection of children from harm.
- In considering the matter, the Panel should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representations made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be. In reaching the decision, regard must also be had to relevant provisions of the national guidance and the Council's licensing policy statement.
- 6.3 The Panel must take such of the steps set out below that it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - To grant the licence subject to the conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, which the Panel may modify to such extent as they consider appropriate;
 - b) To reject the whole or part of the application
- 6.4 The conditions consistent with the operating schedule may be modified to alter or omit any of them or to add any new condition, including restricting the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.
- 6.5 However, conditions should not be imposed on a licence which are unrelated to the variation sought.
- 6.6 All licensing determinations should be considered on the individual merits of the application.
- 6.7 The Panel's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.

- 6.8 It is important that a licensing authority should give comprehensive reasons for its decisions in anticipation of any appeals. Failure to give adequate reasons could itself give rise to grounds for an appeal.
- 6.9 The Panel is asked to determine the application.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Door Supervisors

- 1. Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority shall be used at the premises to undertake security activities, which include guarding against: -
 - (a) Unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision),
 - (b) Outbreaks of disorder, or
 - (c) Damage,

unless otherwise entitled by virtue of section 4 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001 to carry out such activities.

Supply of alcohol

- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence or,
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 5. (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the

premises for a price, which is less than the permitted price.

- (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in (1) above—
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (3) Where the permitted price given by paragraph (2)(b) would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (4) Sub-paragraph (4)(b) applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (2)(b) on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (b) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- 6. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the

- vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner:
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 8. The responsible person must ensure that
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

For the purposes of conditions 6, 7 and 8 above, a responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. Fire-fighting equipment shall be installed and maintained at the premises.
- 2. The premises licence holder shall ensure the area outside the premise is kept clean and free from litter, whilst the premises is open.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after hearing by the licensing authority

- 1. A digital hard drive CCTV system to be in operation to cover internal and external areas of the premises, any area where customers have legitimate access must be sufficiently illuminated for the purposes of CCTV. All CCTV recorded images will have sufficient clarity / quality / definition to enable facial recognition. CCTV will be kept in an unedited format for a period of 28 days, any DVD's subsequently produced will be in a format so it can be played back on a standard personal computer or standard DVD player. Any person left in charge of the premises must be trained in the use of any such CCTV equipment and able to produce / download / burn CCTV images upon request by a person from a responsible authority. CCTV will be maintained on a regular basis and kept in good working order. CCTV maintenance records to be kept details of contractor used and work carried out to be recorded. Plans indicating the position of CCTV cameras to be submitted to be lodged with City Centre Safe. Where the recording is on a removable medium (i.e. videotape, compact disc, flash card etc.), a secure storage system to store those recording mediums shall be provided.
- 2. There will be employed at the premises every Friday & Saturday 1 x SIA registered door person from 2100 until 30 minutes after the premises closes .The need for extra door security will be assessed by the Licence Holder or Designated Premises Supervisor on a regular basis and door staff shall be employed when and where the risk assessment deems this appropriate. When door staff are employed at the premises they will wear Hi-Vis jackets
- 3. A written record shall be kept on the premises by the Designated Premises Supervisor of every person employed on the premises as security personnel in a register kept for that purpose. That record shall contain the following details:-

- i. the door supervisor's name, date of birth and home address;
- i. his/her Security Industry Authority licence number;
- ii. the time and date he/she starts and finishes duty:
- iii. the time of any breaks taken whilst on duty;
- iv. each entry shall be signed by the door supervisor.

That register shall be available for inspection on demand by an Authorised Officer of the Council, the Security Industry Authority or a Police Constable.

- 4. When the premises are being used for any externally promoted events then City Safe at Bootle Street Police Station must be notified at least 28 days prior to the event taking place in order that a risk assessment be carried out in relation to any such event.
- 5. The Challenge 25 policy will be implemented in full and appropriate identification will be sought from any person who appears under the age of 25. The only acceptable forms of identification will be passport, photo driving licence and those carrying the PASS logo.
- 6. Any person who tries to gain entry to the premises who is involved in disorderly conduct or antisocial behaviour outside the premises will not be permitted entry to the premises. The premises licence holder or Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that any person within the premises who is involved in disorderly conduct or antisocial behaviour inside the premises will be removed from the premises.
 - Not to allow to enter or to allow to remain in the premises any person who is notified to the Designated Premises Supervisor by Greater Manchester Police as being a person of bad character by way of association to other persons or by convictions at court.
- 7. Upon reasonable notice given by the City Safe Licensing Unit of Greater Manchester Police based at Bootle Street Police Station the premises will agree not to sell alcohol when high profile events are being held within the North Manchester Division of Greater Manchester Police (e.g. Manchester Derby)
- 8. Notices will be displayed indicating that the Challenge 25 policy is in force.
- 9. Local taxi numbers shall be available for customers to assist in ordering a taxi.
- 10. Staff training will include the Challenge / Think 25 policy and its operation. In particular staff will be trained to take such action as is necessary to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons over the age of 18 where those customers are engaged in the distribution of alcohol to persons under the age of 18. The training will be given to a new member of staff before they commence paid employment and all staff will be retrained twice yearly. Training to also included underage sales, drunkenness and drugs.
- 11. All training will be documented
- 12. A smoking policy to be drawn up by the Premises Licence Holder or Designated Premises Supervisor to include a clearly defined area and management of persons smoking and lodged with City Safe within 14 days of a premises licence being granted
- 13. A dispersal policy to be drawn up by the Premises Licence Holder or Designated Premises Supervisor to include roles of staff and door staff and lodged with City Safe within 14 days of a premises licence being granted.
- 14. Management and staff shall ensure that persons leaving the licensed premises conduct themselves in an orderly manner and do not in any way cause annoyance to residents and/or persons passing by.
- 15. Signs shall be displayed at the exits from the premises requesting that customers respect local residents and leave the premises in a quiet manner.
- 16. Music shall not be played from the speakers located at the front entrance of the premises after 2100.
- 17. Litter (including cigarette ends) shall be cleared from the front of the premises on a regular basis and at the close of business.

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DISPERSAL POLICY

The purpose of this Dispersal Policy is to ensure, so far as it is possible, that minimum disturbance or nuisance is caused to our neighbours and to ensure that the operation of the premises makes the minimum impact upon the neighbourhood in relation to potential nuisance and anti-social behaviour. This will be achieved by exercising pro-active measures towards and at the end of the evening.

By ensuring that this Dispersal Policy document is brought to the attention of Management and Staff we will seek to encourage the efficient, controlled and safe dispersal of our patrons during our closing period.

- 1. At the end of the evening management and staff will assist with the orderly and gradual dispersal of patrons.
- 2. Staff Members (including door personnel when employed) will advise patrons to leave the premises quickly and quietly out of respect for our neighbours.
- 3. Notices will be displayed requesting our customers to leave quietly and in an orderly manner out of consideration to neighbours and their attention will be drawn to these notices by members of staff.
- 4. We will ensure the removal of all bottles and drinking receptacles from any patron before exiting the premises (this will not apply in the case of alcohol sold for consumption in any delineated external area or in the case of alcohol sold for the purpose of consumption off the premises).
- 5. We will actively discourage our customers from assembling outside the premises at the end of the evening.

SMOKING & AL FRESCO DINING POLICY

- 1. Any outside area used by customers wishing to dine, drink or smoke shall be clearly delineated and covered by the CCTV system which will be installed at the premises.
- 2. The outside area shall be monitored by staff or door staff regularly at all times it is in use.
- 3. The area will be cleaned regularly.
- 4. Suitable receptacles shall be provided for smokers to dispose of cigarette butts.
- 5. Signs will be displayed in the area requesting customers keep noise to a minimum.
- 6. Patrons who disregard signage and verbal instructions regarding noise will be asked to move inside and/or leave the premises.
- 7. Open containers of alcohol shall not be permitted to be taken beyond the boundary of the outside area.

Please accept this as formal notification of the Greater Manchester Police objection to the premises licence variation in relation to the above premises on the grounds of Prevention of Crime and Disorder, the Prevention of Public Nuisance and Public Safety.

The premises are situated a very short distance from Piccadilly Gardens which is the number 1 problem area for incidents within the City Centre.

It is of concern to GMP that the premises are seeking to extend their hours so late within this area and we believe that there is a strong likelihood that persons leaving the premises at this time will prolong the issues that the Gardens are suffering from.

Other than offering to use a sound limiter and stating that under 18s will only be allowed in the premises until 8pm under adult supervision, the applicant has offered nothing that isn't already part of their licence conditions to show how by operating and selling alcohol to 5am, they will not add to the issues in this area.

Between 1st Feb 2018 and 1st Feb 2019 there were 6010 incidents recorded in the Piccadilly Gardens locality, 556 of which were for violence and 550 for Anti- Social behaviour.

This shows just how problematic the area is and GMP really do not want another premises at this location selling alcohol until 5am.


In Manchester City Council's own Licensing Policy it states in part;

7.12 Where its discretion is engaged, the authority will give particular consideration to the general character of the surrounding area, including crime and antisocial behaviour (ASB) levels, litter problems, issues regarding underage or proxy sales, and noise complaints.

It further states that:

7.28 Where its discretion is engaged, the licensing authority will give consideration to the appropriateness of hours applied for, having regard to the location of premises and their likely effect on the promotion of the four licensing objectives. While it is recognised that in some circumstances flexible licensing hours for the sale of alcohol can help to ensure that concentrations of customers leaving premises simultaneously are avoided, the licensing authority will consider restricting hours to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives, subject to relevant representations being made in relation to the hours applied for, should the licensing authority deem this appropriate and proportionate following a hearing.

7.29 The authority considers that later hours will typically be more sensitive and higher risk in causing problems.
7.31 It is recognised that in spite of the quality of the operation of the business, where patrons are out of the control of the licensee, the lateness of the terminal hour for the premises will often be a contributory factor in the potential for disturbance.
7.35 Where its discretion is engaged, the licensing authority will not consider the fact that other premises in the vicinity already have similar hours as a justification for granting similar or extended hours, and each application will be considered on its individual merits.
We therefore ask that this application is refused.

Licensing and Out of Hours have assessed the likely impact of the grant of this variation application taking into account a number of factors, including the activities and extensions being applied for, the nature of the area in which the premises is located and any potential risk that granting the variation could have on any of the four licensing objectives.

As a result of this assessment the Licensing and Out of Hours Team have concerns that the grant of the application, in its current form, is likely to lead to

the Prevention of Crime and Disorder, the Prevention of Public Nuisance and Public Safety objectives being undermined.

In reaching this decision we have given particular consideration to Manchester City Councils Statement of Licensing Policy specifically:

- 7.12 The authority will give particular consideration to the general character of the surrounding area, including crime and antisocial behaviour (ASB) levels, litter problems, issues regarding underage or proxy sales, and noise complaints.
- 7.25 The licensing authority will ensure that due consideration is given to the proximity of licensed premises not only to local residents and businesses, but also in relation to other licensed premises as well.
- 7.26 The authority will give particular consideration to measures proposed in the application in relation to prevent nuisance.
- 7.28 The licensing authority will give consideration to the appropriateness of hours applied for, having regard to the location of premises and their likely effect on the promotion of the four licensing objectives.
- 7.29 The authority considers that later hours will typically be more sensitive and higher risk in causing problems.
- 7.31 It is recognised that in spite of the quality of the operation of the business, where patrons are out of the control of the licensee, the lateness of the terminal hour for the premises will often be a contributory factor in the potential for disturbance.

The premises is not currently in operation and is located on Newton Street, within The Northern Quarter district of the city. It is situated between two licensed premises Jimmy's, 12 Newton Street and Cottonopolis Food & Liquor, 16 Newton Street. Both of which are open to the public until 0230 on a Friday and Saturday and close earlier Sunday to Thursday.

The existing premises licence indicates that the premises can open to public on Thursday to Saturday until 0300, closing earlier Sunday to Wednesday. The variation application proposes that the premises will remain open until 0500 Monday to Sunday. This is a significant increase in operational hours and to the hours that the neighbouring premises are permitted to carry out licensed activities until.

There are a number of residential properties on Newton Street adjacent to the premises and nearby on Dale Street. Manchester City Council records show that noise complaints have been received from residents on both streets pertaining to licensed premises near Sugar Rays, the most recent being March 2018.

Furthermore Piccadilly Gardens is in close proximity to the premises and is a hotspot for crime and anti- social behaviour within the city centre. GMP have documented that between 1st February 2018 and 1st February 2019 there were 6010 incidents recorded in the Piccadilly Gardens locality, 556 of which

were for violence and 550 for Anti- Social behaviour.

Licensing and Out of Hours have concerns that the sale of alcohol, particularly the sale of alcohol for consumption off premises, in this location until 0500 could potentially add to the pre-existing issues in Piccadilly Gardens locality due to the already problematic nature of the area.

Moreover the city centre of Manchester is covered by a Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) which relates to people drinking alcohol or having open containers of alcohol in the streets. There is a heightened possibility that patrons from this premises who purchase alcohol for consumption off the premises will consume this on the street breaching the PSPO, and lead to instances of disorder and public nuisance.

With consideration to the close proximity of residential properties to the premises and the potential impact in terms of public nuisance, Licensing and Out of Hours team are concerned that given the lateness of the proposed hours the venue would become a "go to" premises for late night revellers. Attracting intoxicated people to the area from nearby late night licensed premises, and would not encourage customers to vacate the area. As a consequence increasing the potential risk for public nuisance and alcohol related anti-social behaviour.

Additionally there is a likely risk of public nuisance arising from noise from music breakout from inside the venue, from customers gathering outside (e.g. smoking) and from customers leaving the premises and dispersing past residential properties.

The applicant has proposed that smoking and dispersal policies currently in place on the existing premises licence shall continue to be adhered to, however on inspection of these the detail in them, particularly the smoking policy, is not sufficient. We would expect a premises proposing to open until 0500 to have more robust policies and conditions in place which should demonstrate how they intend to control entry into the premises, capacity and how they will manage exterior areas effectively.

The applicant has proposed that a sound limiter will be operated at the premises in order to prevent the breakout of music, however insufficient detail has been provided to ensure the necessary control required.

Licensing and Out of Hours also have concerns regarding the emptying of waste into receptacles and the collection of refuse during late hours. This could potentially cause disturbance to nearby residents. The applicant has offered no additional conditions in respect of ensuring that there is adequate arrangements for the storage of refuse or appropriate arrangements for deliveries and collections.

Taking the above into consideration Licensing and Out of Hours recommend that the variation application is refused in its current form.
