1. **Introduction**

- 1.1 On 11/01/2019, an application for the grant of a Premises Licence under s17 of the Licensing Act 2003 was made in respect of Sunshine Barber and Hairdressers, 369h Stretford Road, Manchester, M15 4AW in the Hulme ward of Manchester. A location map and photograph of the premises is attached at **Appendix 1**.
- 1.2 A 28-day public consultation exercise was undertaken in accordance with Licensing Act 2003 regulations; requiring the application to be advertised by the displaying of a blue notice at or on the premises, a notice published in a newspaper or similar circulating in the local area, and details of the application published on the Council's website.
- 1.3 Representations may be made for or against an application during the consultation period. To be 'relevant' and, therefore, able to be taken into account in determining the application, they must be about the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives. Where representations are made by persons who are not a responsible authority, they must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 1.4 Relevant representations have been received in respect of this application and so it must be determined by a Licensing Hearing Panel in accordance with the Council's Constitution.

2. **The Application**

- 2.1 A copy of the application is attached at **Appendix 2**.
- 2.2 The applicant is Leah Evans.
- 2.3 The description of the premises by the applicant is stated as a shop on the main road.
- 2.4 The proposed designated premises supervisor is Leah Evans
- 2.5 **The licensable activities applied for:**

Provision of late night refreshment:

Indoors

Mon to Sun 11pm to 1am

Non-standard Timings: Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve 11pm to 4am

The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises only:

Mon to Sun 9am to 1am

Non-standard Timings: Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve 9am to 4am

Opening hours:

Sun to Fri 9am to 2am

Saturday 9am to 3am

Non-standard Timings: Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve 9am to 6am

2.5.1 In accordance with the Live Music Act 2012 and Deregulation Act 2015, performances of Live Music and Recorded Music between the hours of 0800 and 2300 hours have been deregulated and so should not be regarded as licensable activities for the purposes of this application.

2.5.2 Any further details provided relating to any of the individual licensable activities are specified on the application form at **Appendix 2**.

2.6 Activities unsuitable for children

2.6.1 The applicant has not highlighted any adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.

2.7 Steps to promote the licensing objectives

2.7.1 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by taking the steps identified in the operating schedule.

2.7.2 These steps must be translated into conditions by the licensing authority to be included in any granted premises licence, unless the conditions are modified by the Panel following consideration of relevant representations. These conditions are set out verbatim in the Schedule of Conditions at **Appendix 4**.

2.8 Further documentation accompanying the application

2.8.1 The applicant has not submitted any additional documents in support of their application

3. Relevant Representations

3.1 A total of 3 relevant representations from the responsible authorities were received in respect of the application (**Appendix 3**).

Responsible Authorities:

- Greater Manchester Police;
- MCC Licensing and Out of Hours Compliance Team;
- MCC Trading Standards

3.2 Summary of the representations

Party	Grounds of representation	Recommends
GMP	An objection has been submitted by GMP as they state that the operating schedule which accompanies the application offers nothing in terms of enforceable conditions which show how the 4 Licensing Objectives will be upheld. Furthermore GMP have also stated that the hours applied for are excessive and will cause noise disturbances to local residents.	Refuse
Licensing and Out of Hours Compliance (LOOH)	LOOH have submitted an objection on the grounds that the premises is located near residential properties and businesses and that the granting of a licence could lead to issues of public nuisance. LOOH also have concerns regarding the premises as it is operating as a barbers. LOOH state that sharp objects and chemicals at the premises will pose a hazard.	Refuse
Trading Standards	Trading standards have objected to the application on the grounds that the application is poor and scant on detail. They state that the applicant has failed to demonstrate, in any detail, the steps they will take and procedures they will implement to ensure the premises promote the Licensing Objective the protection of children from harm Trading standards have also objected on the grounds that the premises will operate as a bar and not as a barbers shop.	Refuse

3.3 No conditions are proposed by objectors as they all request that the application is refused.

4. **Key Policies and Considerations**

4.1 **Legal Considerations**

4.1.1 Hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 operate under the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

4.2 **New Information**

4.2.1 In accordance with Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, the authority may take into account documentary or other

information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice either before the hearing or, with the consent of all parties, at the hearing.

4.3 Hearsay Evidence

- 4.3.1 The Panel may accept hearsay evidence and it will be a matter for the Panel to attach what weight to it that they consider appropriate. Hearsay evidence is evidence of something that a witness neither saw nor heard, but has heard or read about.

4.4 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003

- 4.4.1 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 is provided for all parties involved in licensing. It is a key medium for promoting best practice, ensuring consistent application of licensing powers across England and Wales and for promoting fairness, equal treatment and proportionality.
- 4.4.2 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. The Guidance is therefore binding on all licensing authorities to that extent. However, the Guidance cannot anticipate every possible scenario or set of circumstances that may arise and, as long as licensing authorities have properly understood this Guidance, they may depart from it if they have good reason to do so and can provide full reasons.
- 4.4.3 Departure from the Guidance could give rise to an appeal or judicial review, and the reasons given will then be a key consideration for the courts when considering the lawfulness and merits of any decision taken.

4.5 Manchester Statement of Licensing Policy

- 4.5.1 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' its statement of licensing policy.
- 4.5.2 The Licensing Policy sets out the vision the licensing authority has for the regulation of licensed premises throughout Manchester and outlines the standards expected in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives in the city. The Panel may depart from the policies should it consider doing so would benefit the promotion of the licensing objectives. Reasons are to be given for any such departure from the Policy.
- 4.5.3 Section 4 of the Policy (Operation of the Policy) sets out how the Licensing Policy is intended to be used in practice for licence applications and licensed premises.
- 4.5.4 Relevant to this application and the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following sections of the Policy.

Section 6: What we aim to encourage

This section identifies certain types of venues and initiatives the licensing authority aims to encourage in order to promote an inclusive evening and night-time economy not simply focused on the consumption of alcohol. We aim to encourage:

- Premises that will extend the diversity of entertainment and attract a wider range of participants
- Live music, especially original material, which will provide a range of live performances and styles of music, provided that such entertainment does not undermine the licensing objectives
- National cultural institutions, global sports events and cultural festivals
- Non-drink-led premises, including restaurants, cafes, theatres and cinemas
- Communication and integration with local residents and businesses through licensees consulting with those in the local area prior to an application
- Participation in Pubwatches, off licence forums and other crime-reduction partnerships
- Engagement with the NITENET radio scheme and DISC secure information sharing platform by city centre venues through the Cityco Manchester Business Crime Reduction Partnership
- Designing out crime in the layout of the premises

Section 7: Local factors

This section sets out key issues that applicants are expected to take into account relevant to the individual characteristics of the premises when preparing their operating schedule and address any local factors relevant to their premises.

Having regard to the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following Factors:

- Identified risk factors specific to the licensed premises
- Proximity of takeaways and licences to nightlife entertainment areas
- The proximity of the premises to local residents and other local businesses, particularly in relation to the potential for nuisance
- Proximity to sensitive uses

Section 8: Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives

This section identifies the standards that the licensing authority expects of licensed premises in Manchester. It is recognised that not all standards will be appropriate to apply in every situation to every premises, and applicants are not obliged to include all standards in their operating schedule. The degree to which standards would be appropriate is expected to be proportionate to the risk posed against the promotion of the licensing objectives having regard to the individual circumstances of the premises. The standards are not exhaustive and the licensing authority will have regard to any relevant issues raised in any representation that may fall outside them.

- MS1 Implement effective security measures at the premises
- MS2 Effective general management of the premises
- MS3 Responsible promotion and sale of alcohol
- MS4 Prevent the use of illegal drugs, new psychoactive substances (NPS) and the spiking of drinks at the premises
- MS5 Prevent on-street consumption of alcohol
- MS6 Provide a Duty of Care for intoxicated or vulnerable customers and medical emergencies
- MS7 Maintain a safe capacity
- MS8 Prevent noise nuisance from the premises
- MS9 Effectively manage exterior spaces (e.g. beer gardens, smoking areas, table and chair areas on the highway)
- MS10 Operate effective cleansing arrangements, including ensuring the premises and surrounding area are kept clean and free of litter, and adequate arrangements for the secure and responsible storage of refuse
- MS11 Ensure the wellbeing of children on the premises
- MS12 Prevent underage sales of alcohol, including proxy sales

Section 9: Alcohol delivery services

This section sets out specific provisions for alcohol delivery services to be considered in conjunction with relevant standards from Section 8 of the Policy

Section 10: Adult entertainment (including striptease, nudity and other entertainment of a sexual nature)

This section sets out specific considerations in respect of applications to provide adult entertainment, including entertainment of a sexual nature e.g. nudity, striptease and lap dancing.

Section 11: The use of tables and chairs on the public highway

This section provides that the operation of any areas on the public highway licensed for tables and chairs should be considered with regard to all relevant Standards set out in Section 8 of the Policy.

Section 12: Premises Licences for large-scale public events

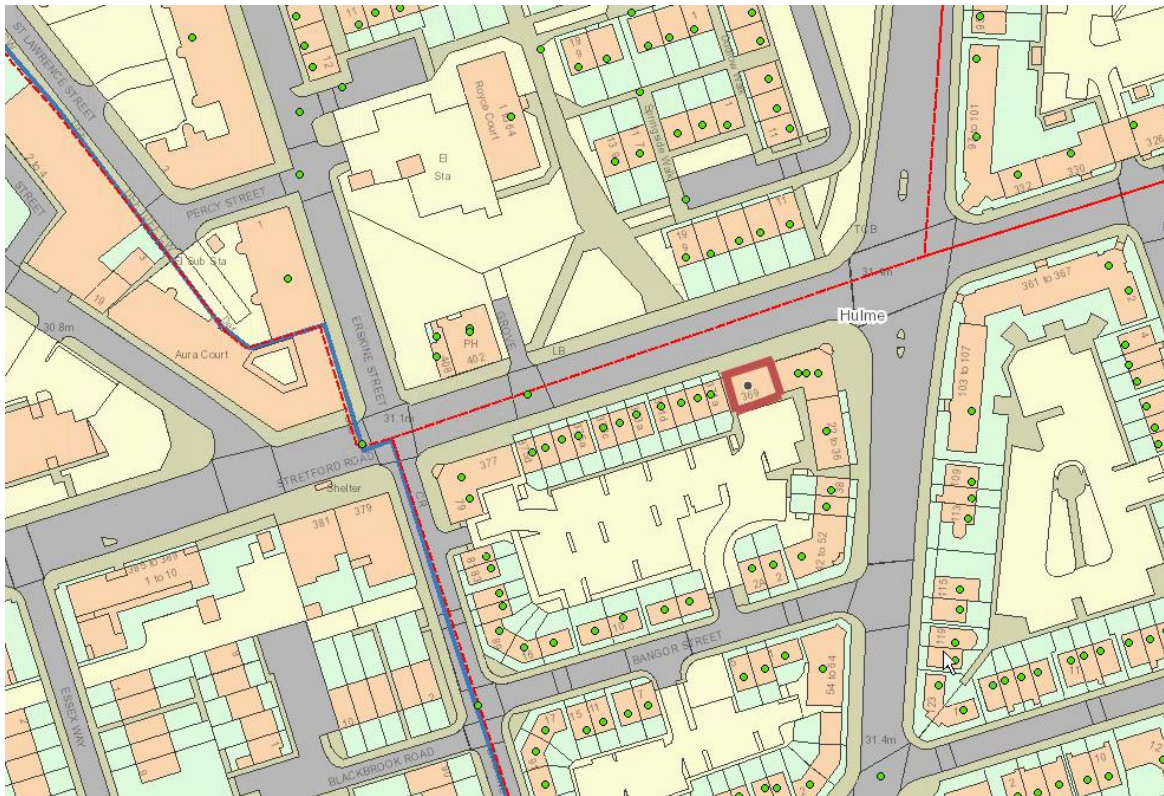
This section sets out particular expectations regarding large scale public events, given the specific associated risks.

5. Conclusion

- 5.1 A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act (“licensing functions”) with a view to promoting the licensing objectives:
- the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - the protection of children from harm.
- 5.2 In considering the matter, the Panel should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representations made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be. In reaching the decision, regard must also be had to relevant provisions of the national guidance and the Council’s licensing policy statement.
- 5.3 Having regard to the representations, the Panel must take such of the steps set out below that it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
- a) To grant the licence subject to:
 - i. the conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, which the Panel may modify to such extent as they consider appropriate, and
 - ii. any mandatory conditions that must be included in the licence;

- b) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
- c) To refuse to specify the person proposed in the application as the designated premises supervisor;
- d) To reject the application.

- 5.4 The conditions consistent with the operating schedule may be modified to alter or omit any of them or to add any new condition, including restricting the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.
- 5.5 All licensing determinations should be considered on the individual merits of the application.
- 5.6 The Panel's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 5.7 It is important that a licensing authority should give comprehensive reasons for its decisions in anticipation of any appeals. Failure to give adequate reasons could itself give rise to grounds for an appeal.
- 5.8 The Panel is asked to determine the application.

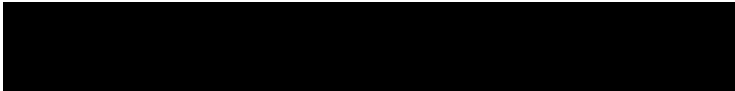



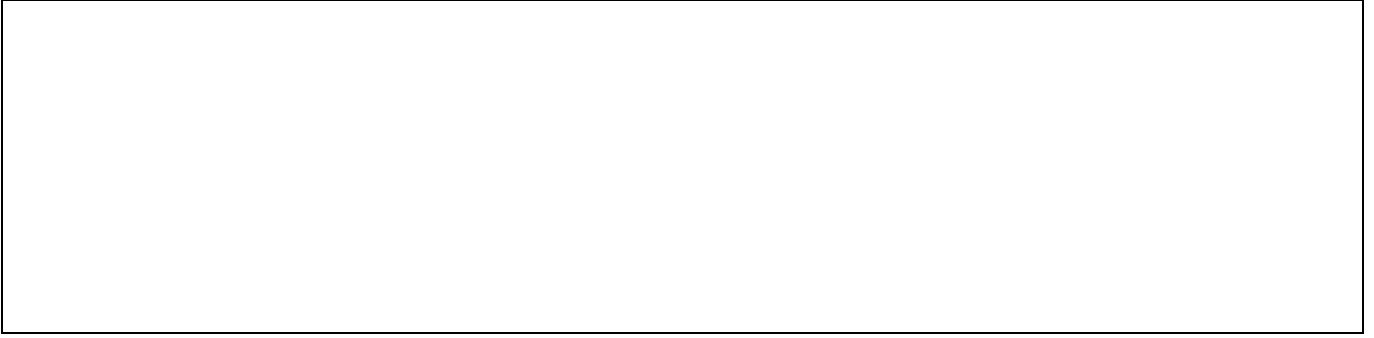
Please accept this as formal notification of the Greater Manchester Police objection to the premises licence in relation to the above premises on the grounds of Prevention of Crime and Disorder and the Prevention of Public Nuisance, Public Safety and the Protection of Children from Harm.

The operating schedule which accompanies the application offers nothing in terms of enforceable conditions which show how the 4 Licensing Objectives will be upheld.

It gives the impression that the applicant has a limited understanding of the Licensing Objectives, which raises concerns about how the premises will be operated.

Furthermore the hours applied for are excessive for premises which are next to, opposite and underneath residential dwellings and are more in keeping with a city centre premises. If this application was granted there would almost certainly be a noise disturbance to the local residents from customers leaving the premises and smoking outside.

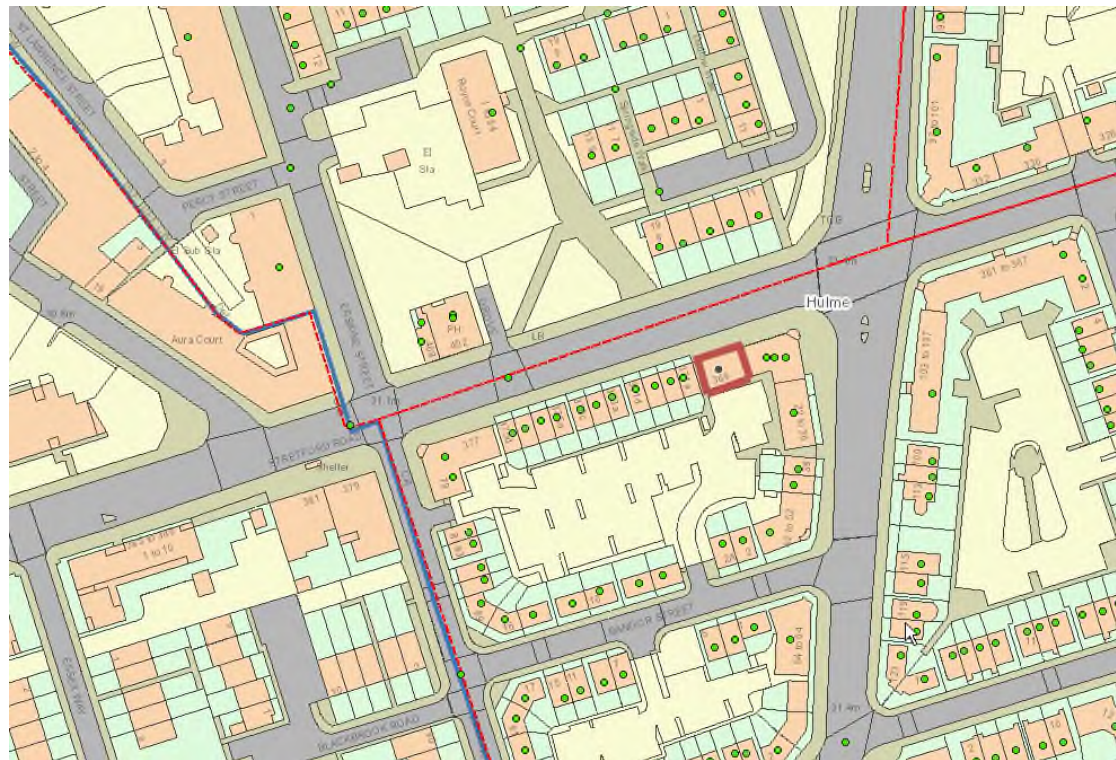

<p>The Licensing and Out of Hours team have assessed the likely impact of the late night premises opening of Sunshine Barbers & Hairdressers, 369h Stretford Road, Manchester, M60 2LA taking into account a number of factors. These include the location of nearby residential properties, the proximity to similar businesses, the hours applied for and any potential risk that the granting of this licence, could lead to issues that could rise to Public Nuisance.</p> <p>The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises only: Mon to Sun 9am to 1am Non-standard Timings: Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve 9am to 4am. Provision of late night refreshment Indoors Only: Mon to Sun 11pm to 1am Non-standard Timings: Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve 11pm to 4am Opening hours: Sun to Fri 9am to 2am Saturday 9am to 3am Non-standard Timings: Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve 9am to 6am</p> <p>The premises is on Stretford Road and is part of a residential area within the Hulme ward, it is also on a main road linking The borough of Trafford to Manchester City Centre. The road is a busy road especially with Manchester United Football Club on route from the city centre. Close by to the premises are residential buildings, situated directly above are flats, also in the area are student accommodation and social housing, with further houses facing the premises. The Licensing and Out of Hours team have concerns that the premises could cause a noise problem for the nearby residents due to noise generated by music and other entertainment inside the premises, staff using commercial bins when clearing up, noise generated from patrons within the property itself and upon leaving the premises at night. Although regulated entertainment has not been applied for, the premises wishes to stay open till 02:00 Monday to Sunday and till 06:00 for non-standard timing. Giving further concerns that the applicant will be using regulated entertainment without authority post 23:00. This also gives further concerns of noise emanating from the premises, giving rise to a nuisance at the nearest residential property.</p>



Section 7.1 of the Manchester City Council Licensing Policy 2016 states that Licensed Premises are expected to be an asset to their local area through the promotion of the licensing objectives.

Section 7.8 lists relevant factors for Identifying risk factors to the licensed premises, including style of operation, particularly related to the likelihood of alcohol consumption and physical design of the premises. The style of operation is a Barbers shop, it is a place of grooming and as such hazards in the premises include sharp objects and chemicals. The applicant has stated in Section M(c) 'we will put in provisions to ensure our customers are safe'. The condition offered and it being the only condition for public safety, does not give confidence that the condition is enforceable and that the applicant has given thorough thought into what public safety as a licensing condition actually entails. We do however believe, it is inevitable that sharp objects will be present and attainable by customers in the premises. In section d under public nuisance, the applicant refers to selling alcohol responsibly and challenge those too intoxicated. This condition again suggests people will be on the premises intoxicated but also raises concerns people will be intoxicated late at night in what is meant to be a barbers shop and hairdressers. The applicant has not given any conditions nor information regarding glass being used on the premises, further concerns are raised as to how this will be managed safely and disposed of.

Section 7.29 states that the authority considers that later hours will typically be more sensitive and a higher risk in causing problems. The hours applied for by the applicant, in our opinion, are later hours than for the type of business the applicant has proposed. In the vicinity an off-licence which sells alcohol till 23:00 hours Monday to Friday. However, it is worth noting that the off-licence sales are for consumption off the premises rather than on, and they have conditions that are enforceable and suitable to the premises operation and risks. The applicant has applied for the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises which may allow for patrons to leave the premises intoxicated

and cause further issues in the community, heightening the risk to the local area.

Section 7.36 States that premises applying for early morning day time hours to sell alcohol will be given particular consideration into their proximity to schools, play areas, nurseries, children's centres and other youth amenities, as well as groups, such as persons who are alcohol-dependant. In this case the premises is located in a family residential area with schools and nurseries located within a 1.5 mile radius. The schools include both primary and secondary so a large range of ages will be in close proximity to the premises during the day, potentially exposing themselves to alcohol and/or others who are intoxicated from the on sale of alcohol.

On 24th December 2019, the Licensing and Out of Hours Team received a complaint from a local resident to the premises. The complaint received was describing people shouting, singing and arguing. With a further description that the premises opens at 11am and from 7pm daily till the early hours transforms into a party place. It is worth noting that the complaint is still open and we are in the process of investigating the complaint. We have not witnessed the noise at this moment in time. However with the complaint coming in prior to the application we have concerns this premises is being used for a social venue such as a bar rather than a barbers/hairdressers.

Section M of the application requires the applicant to describe any additional steps in order to promote the licensing objectives as a result of the proposed application, the applicant has included poor and unenforceable information to support the any of the licensing objectives.

On the balance of probabilities the Licensing and Out of Hours team believe this premises will be used as a social venue for drinking, and will lose its primary focus of being a barber/hairdressing shop. This gives rise to concern that the consumption of alcohol will increase to a level that would not be considered appropriate for this type of establishment, and will not just be ancillary to a haircut.

Taking all of the above into consideration the Licensing and Out of Hours Team have serious concerns that the premises will be able to run successfully as a barber shop as its main business, and will instead become a meeting place for the consumption of alcohol. The Licensing and Out of Hours team therefore ask for the application to be refused.

Recommendation: Refuse Application

The applicant has failed to demonstrate in any detail the steps they will take and procedures they will implement to ensure the premises promote the Licensing Objective The protection of children from harm.</p> <p>It is a mandatory licensing condition for all licensed premises to have an age verification policy in place. The applicant has failed to tell us what this is, e.g. Challenge 21. The application also fails to mention other robust procedures which are accepted as good practice such as staff training and the keeping of documented records.</p> <p>It is also noted that the applicant has requested that the premises serve late night refreshment until 01:00am and alcohol from 09:00am with a terminal hour of 02:00. It is our opinion that the premises will to all intents and purposes operate as a bar with a barber's chair just in case a customer wants a haircut. We would</p>
