1. <u>Introduction</u>

- On 21/01/2019, an application for the grant of a Premises Licence under s17 of the Licensing Act 2003 was made in respect of Brazilian Waxing Company, 3-5 Oxford Road, Manchester, M1 6EY in the Deansgate ward of Manchester. A location map and photograph of the premises is attached at **Appendix 1**.
- 1.2 A 28-day public consultation exercise was undertaken in accordance with Licensing Act 2003 regulations; requiring the application to be advertised by the displaying of a blue notice at or on the premises, a notice published in a newspaper or similar circulating in the local area, and details of the application published on the Council's website.
- 1.3 Representations may be made for or against an application during the consultation period. To be 'relevant' and, therefore, able to be taken into account in determining the application, they must be about the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives. Where representations are made by persons who are not a responsible authority, they must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 1.4 Relevant representations have been received in respect of this application and so it must be determined by a Licensing Hearing Panel in accordance with the Council's Constitution.

2. The Application

- 2.1 A copy of the application is attached at **Appendix 2.**
- 2.2 The applicant is Mr Mussab Rana.
- 2.3 The description of the premises by the applicant is bar at the front with seating for up to 30 people, rear of the building is used as a waxing and laser hair removal salon the licence will be for the whole of the premises.
- 2.4 The proposed designated premises supervisor is Mr Mussab Rana

2.5 The licensable activities applied for:

Provision of regulated entertainment (films, live music, recorded music, performances of dance):

Fri to Sat 10pm to 3am

Provision of late night refreshment: Fri to Sat 11pm to 3am

Non standard timing for late night refreshment: From 11pm on New Year's Eve to 5am New Year's Day

The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises only: Sun to Thurs 10am to 10pm, Fri to Sat 10am to 3am

Opening hours:

Sun to Thurs 10am to 10pm, Fri to Sat 10am to 3am

Non standard timings for each of the above: From the start time on New Year's Eve to the terminal hour for New Year's Day.

- 2.5.1 In accordance with the Live Music Act 2012 and Deregulation Act 2015, performances of Live Music and Recorded Music between the hours of 0800 and 2300 hours have been deregulated and so should not be regarded as licensable activities for the purposes of this application.
- 2.5.2 Any further details provided relating to any of the individual licensable activities are specified on the application form at **Appendix 2**.
- 2.6 Activities unsuitable for children
- 2.6.1 The applicant has not highlighted any adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.
- 2.7 Steps to promote the licensing objectives
- 2.7.1 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by taking the steps identified in the operating schedule.
- 2.7.2 These steps must be translated into conditions by the licensing authority to be included in any granted premises licence, unless the conditions are modified by the Panel following consideration of relevant representations. These conditions are set out in the Schedule of Conditions at **Appendix 4**.
- 2.8 Further documentation accompanying the application
- 2.8.1 The applicant has submitted the following documents in support of their application, which are included with the application form at **Appendix 2**:
 - Smoking Policy
 - Dispersal Policy

3. Relevant Representations

A total of 2 relevant representations were received in respect of the application (**Appendix 3**). The personal details of all members of the public have been redacted. Original copies of these representations will be available to the Panel at the hearing.

3.2 Summary of the representations:

Party	Grounds of representation	Recommends
GMP	Based around public nuisance, GMP believe the hours applied for are excessive given the location of the premises below residential dwellings and what is being proposed in this application is clearly a huge departure from its current operating model, which is a waxing company.	Refuse
Licensing and Out of Hours Compliance	Based around public nuisance, LOOH have concerns of how they intend to prevent noise breakout to ensure this licensing objective is upheld. They also believe that the application for licensable activities to take place until 3am is not in keeping with current hours and nature of the business.	Refuse

3.3 Any conditions proposed by objectors are set out in the Schedule of Conditions at **Appendix 4**.

4. Key Policies and Considerations

4.1 Legal Considerations

4.1.1 Hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 operate under the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

4.2 **New Information**

4.2.1 In accordance with Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings)
Regulations 2005, the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice either before the hearing or, with the consent of all parties, at the hearing.

4.3 **Hearsay Evidence**

4.3.1 The Panel may accept hearsay evidence and it will be a matter for the Panel to attach what weight to it that they consider appropriate. Hearsay evidence is evidence of something that a witness neither saw nor heard, but has heard or read about.

4.4 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003

4.4.1 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 is provided for all parties involved in licensing. It is a key medium for promoting best practice,

- ensuring consistent application of licensing powers across England and Wales and for promoting fairness, equal treatment and proportionality.
- 4.4.2 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. The Guidance is therefore binding on all licensing authorities to that extent. However, the Guidance cannot anticipate every possible scenario or set of circumstances that may arise and, as long as licensing authorities have properly understood this Guidance, they may depart from it if they have good reason to do so and can provide full reasons.
- 4.4.3 Departure from the Guidance could give rise to an appeal or judicial review, and the reasons given will then be a key consideration for the courts when considering the lawfulness and merits of any decision taken.
- 4.5 Manchester Statement of Licensing Policy
- 4.5.1 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' its statement of licensing policy.
- 4.5.2 The Licensing Policy sets out the vision the licensing authority has for the regulation of licensed premises throughout Manchester and outlines the standards expected in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives in the city. The Panel may depart from the policies should it consider doing so would benefit the promotion of the licensing objectives. Reasons are to be given for any such departure from the Policy.
- 4.5.3 Section 4 of the Policy (Operation of the Policy) sets out how the Licensing Policy is intended to be used in practice for licence applications and licensed premises.
- 4.5.4 Relevant to this application and the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following sections of the Policy:

Section 6: What we aim to encourage

This section identifies certain types of venues and initiatives the licensing authority aims to encourage in order to promote an inclusive evening and night-time economy not simply focused on the consumption of alcohol. We aim to encourage:

- Premises that will extend the diversity of entertainment and attract a wider range of participants
- Live music, especially original material, which will provide a range of live performances and styles of music, provided that such entertainment does not undermine the licensing objectives
- National cultural institutions, global sports events and cultural festivals
- Non-drink-led premises, including restaurants, cafes, theatres and cinemas

- Communication and integration with local residents and businesses through licensees consulting with those in the local area prior to an application
- Participation in Pubwatches, off licence forums and other crimereduction partnerships
- Engagement with the NITENET radio scheme and DISC secure information sharing platform by city centre venues through the Cityco Manchester Business Crime Reduction Partnership
- Designing out crime in the layout of the premises

Section 7: Local factors

This section sets out key issues that applicants are expected to take into account relevant to the individual characteristics of the premises when preparing their operating schedule and address any local factors relevant to their premises.

Having regard to the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following Factors:

- The proximity of the premises to local residents and other local businesses, particularly in relation to the potential for nuisance
- Ability to clean and maintain the street scene

Section 8: Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives

This section identifies the standards that the licensing authority expects of licensed premises in Manchester. It is recognised that not all standards will be appropriate to apply in every situation to every premises, and applicants are not obliged to include all standards in their operating schedule. The degree to which standards would be appropriate is expected to be proportionate to the risk posed against the promotion of the licensing objectives having regard to the individual circumstances of the premises. The standards are not exhaustive and the licensing authority will have regard to any relevant issues raised in any representation that may fall outside them.

- MS1 Implement effective security measures at the premises
- MS2 Effective general management of the premises
- MS3 Responsible promotion and sale of alcohol
- MS6 Provide a Duty of Care for intoxicated or vulnerable customers and medical emergencies
- MS7 Maintain a safe capacity

- MS8 Prevent noise nuisance from the premises
- MS12 Prevent underage sales of alcohol, including proxy sales

Conclusion

- 4.6 A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act ("licensing functions") with a view to promoting the licensing objectives:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - the protection of children from harm.
- 4.7 In considering the matter, the Panel should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representations made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be. In reaching the decision, regard must also be had to relevant provisions of the national guidance and the Council's licensing policy statement.
 - 4.8 Having regard to the representations, the Panel must take such of the steps set out below that it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - a) To grant the licence subject to:
 - the conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, which the Panel may modify to such extent as they consider appropriate, and
 - ii. any mandatory conditions that must be included in the licence:
 - b) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - c) To refuse to specify the person proposed in the application as the designated premises supervisor;
 - d) To reject the application.
 - 4.9 The conditions consistent with the operating schedule may be modified to alter or omit any of them or to add any new condition, including restricting the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.
 - 4.10 All licensing determinations should be considered on the individual merits of the application.
 - 4.11 The Panel's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.

- 4.12 It is important that a licensing authority should give comprehensive reasons for its decisions in anticipation of any appeals. Failure to give adequate reasons could itself give rise to grounds for an appeal.
- 4.13 The Panel is asked to determine the application.

Licensing out of hours team have assessed the likely impact of granting the new late licence to the beauty salon, Brazilian Waxing Company taking into account a number of factors, including, the nature of the area in which the premises is located, the hours applied for and any potential risks that the granting application could undermine the licensing objective, prevention of public nuisance.

The premises is located at 3-5 Oxford Road which is a mixed use building, containing residential accommodation directly above and adjacent to along Charles Street. There are also 4 residential apartment blocks under construction at junction of Charles Street and Oxford Road.

Operating Schedule

The applicant states in Part 3, M (d) of the operating schedule no music shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance at the nearest noise sensitive premises. However the applicant has not stated in the application how they intend to prevent noise breakout to ensure the public nuisance objective is upheld.

Current Hours

Current trading hours that the premises opens are Monday to Sunday 10am to 22:00

The applicant has requested for licensable activities to take place beyond these hours on Friday and Saturday nights into the early hours of 3:00hours the following morning, for which tickets will be sold and door security employed, which is not in keeping with the current hours and nature of business. 7.29 of Manchester's Statement of licensing policy, states, the authority consider that later hours will typically be more sensitive and higher

risk in causing problems.

Conclusion

The potential impact on the local residents has been considered, the applicant has not fully demonstrated how he will uphold the licensing objectives in relation to the prevention of public nuisance, in preventing **Noise** disturbance from people outside the premises, when smoking, queuing or entering and leaving throughout the night, and music being played till 3am in the morning. Without considerations LOOHT feel that this would undermine the licensing objective and give rise to public nuisance.

We therefore we ask that the application is refused.

1. <u>Introduction</u>

- 1.1 On 23/01/2019, an application for the variation of an existing Premises Licence under s34 of the Licensing Act 2003 was made in respect of Peri Peri Chicken Shaq, 261 Oldham Road, Manchester, M40 7PS in the Miles Platting and Newton Heath ward of Manchester. A location map of the premises is attached at **Appendix 1**.
- 1.2 A 28-day public consultation exercise was undertaken in accordance with Licensing Act 2003 regulations; requiring the application to be advertised by the displaying of a blue notice at or on the premises, a notice published in a newspaper or similar circulating in the local area, and details of the application published on the Council's website.
- 1.3 Representations may be made for or against an application during the consultation period. To be 'relevant' and, therefore, able to be taken into account in determining the application, they must be about the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives. Where representations are made by persons who are not a responsible authority, they must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 1.4 Relevant representations have been received in respect of this application and so it must be determined by a Licensing Hearing Panel in accordance with the Council's Constitution.

2. <u>Current Licence</u>

2.1 The premises licence holder is Mr Syed Zia UI Hassan and a copy of the current licence is attached at **Appendix 2.**

3. The Application

- 3.2.1 In accordance with the Live Music Act 2012 and Deregulation Act 2015, performances of Live Music and Recorded Music between the hours of 0800 and 2300 hours have been deregulated and so should not be regarded as licensable activities for the purposes of this application.
- 3.2.2 Any further details provided relating to any of the individual licensable activities are specified on the application form at **Appendix 3**.
- 3.3 Activities unsuitable for children
- 3.3.1 The applicant has not highlighted any adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.
- 3.4 Steps to promote the licensing objectives
- 3.4.1 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by taking the steps identified in the operating schedule.
- 3.4.2 These steps must be translated into conditions by the licensing authority to be included in any granted premises licence, unless the conditions are modified by the Panel following consideration of relevant representations. 5. Key Policies and Considerations

5.1 **Legal Considerations**

5.1.1 Hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 operate under the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

5.2 **New Information**

5.2.1 In accordance with Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings)
Regulations 2005, the authority may take into account documentary or other
information produced by a party in support of their application, representations
or notice either before the hearing or, with the consent of all parties, at the
hearing.

5.3 **Hearsay Evidence**

5.3.1 The Panel may accept hearsay evidence and it will be a matter for the Panel to attach what weight to it that they consider appropriate. Hearsay evidence is evidence of something that a witness neither saw nor heard, but has heard or read about.

5.4 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003

- 5.4.1 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 is provided for all parties involved in licensing. It is a key medium for promoting best practice, ensuring consistent application of licensing powers across England and Wales and for promoting fairness, equal treatment and proportionality.
- 5.4.2 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. The Guidance is therefore binding on all licensing authorities to that extent. However, the Guidance cannot anticipate every possible scenario or set of circumstances that may arise and, as long as licensing authorities have properly understood this Guidance, they may depart from it if they have good reason to do so and can provide full reasons.
- 5.4.3 Departure from the Guidance could give rise to an appeal or judicial review, and the reasons given will then be a key consideration for the courts when considering the lawfulness and merits of any decision taken.

5.5 Manchester Statement of Licensing Policy

- 5.5.1 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' its statement of licensing policy.
- 5.5.2 The Licensing Policy sets out the vision the licensing authority has for the regulation of licensed premises throughout Manchester and outlines the standards expected in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives in the city. The Panel may depart from the policies should it consider doing so would benefit the promotion of the licensing objectives. Reasons are to be given for any such departure from the Policy.
- 5.5.3 Section 4 of the Policy (Operation of the Policy) sets out how the Licensing Policy is intended to be used in practice for licence applications and licensed premises.
- 5.5.4 Relevant to this application and the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following sections of the Policy:

The policy also sets out particular measures it expects operators to pay special attention to in order to ensure their operation will not add to the problems within this area. Operators are not required to do so, but where the authority's discretion is engaged, any applications that fail to address all appropriate measures may be refused or have conditions applied to comply with the policy measures.

Section 6: What we aim to encourage

This section identifies certain types of venues and initiatives the licensing authority aims to encourage in order to promote an inclusive evening and night-time economy not simply focused on the consumption of alcohol. We aim to encourage:

- Premises that will extend the diversity of entertainment and attract a wider range of participants

This section sets out key issues that applicants are expected to take into account relevant to the individual characteristics of the premises when preparing their operating schedule and address any local factors relevant to their premises.

Having regard to the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following Factors:

- Identified risk factors specific to the licensed premises
- Evidence of pre-existing problems in the area
- Proximity of takeaways and licences to nightlife entertainment areas
- Consistency with relevant Council strategies
- The proximity of the premises to local residents and other local businesses, particularly in relation to the potential for nuisance
- Proximity to sensitive uses
- The availability of transport to and from the premises
- Ability to clean and maintain the street scene
- Premises in proximity to the airport

Section 8: Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives

This section identifies the standards that the licensing authority expects of licensed premises in Manchester. It is recognised that not all standards will be appropriate to apply in every situation to every premises, and applicants are not obliged to include all standards in their operating schedule. The degree to which standards would be appropriate is expected to be proportionate to the risk posed against the promotion of the licensing objectives having regard to the individual circumstances of the premises. The standards are not exhaustive and

the licensing authority will have regard to any relevant issues raised in any representation that may fall outside them.

Section 9: Alcohol delivery services

This section sets out specific provisions for alcohol delivery services to be considered in conjunction with relevant standards from Section 8 of the Policy

Section 10: Adult entertainment (including striptease, nudity and other entertainment of a sexual nature)

This section sets out specific considerations in respect of applications to provide adult entertainment, including entertainment of a sexual nature e.g. nudity, striptease and lap dancing.

Section 11: The use of tables and chairs on the public highway

This section provides that the operation of any areas on the public highway licensed for tables and chairs should be considered with regard to all relevant Standards set out in Section 8 of the Policy.

Section 12: Premises Licences for large-scale public events

This section sets out particular expectations regarding large scale public events, given the specific associated risks.

6. Conclusion

- A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act ("licensing functions") with a view to promoting the licensing objectives:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and

- the protection of children from harm.
- In considering the matter, the Panel should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representations made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be. In reaching the decision, regard must also be had to relevant provisions of the national guidance and the Council's licensing policy statement.
- 6.3 The Panel must take such of the steps set out below that it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - To grant the licence subject to the conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, which the Panel may modify to such extent as they consider appropriate;
 - b) To reject the whole or part of the application
- 6.4 The conditions consistent with the operating schedule may be modified to alter or omit any of them or to add any new condition, including restricting the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.
- 6.5 However, conditions should not be imposed on a licence which are unrelated to the variation sought.
- 6.6 All licensing determinations should be considered on the individual merits of the application.
- 6.7 The Panel's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 6.8 It is important that a licensing authority should give comprehensive reasons for its decisions in anticipation of any appeals. Failure to give adequate reasons could itself give rise to grounds for an appeal.
- 6.9 The Panel is asked to determine the application.

Licensing and Out of Hours Compliance Team have assessed the likely impact of the granting of this applications taking into account a number of factors, including the nature of the area in which the premises is located and the proximity to the residential accommodation, the hours applied for, and any potential risk that the granting of this application could lead to issues of public nuisance.

The premises is positioned on the ground floor, midway along a short run of mixed use commercial units on Oldham Road.

Section M of the licence application requires the applicant to describe any further steps they will take in order to promote the 4 licensing objectives. With regards to the proposed application, the applicant has failed to provide any information with specific reference to the prevention of public nuisance for the later proposed terminal hours.

Section 7.1 of Manchester's Statement of Licensing Policy states "Licensed premises are expected to be an asset to their local area through promotion of the licensing objectives."

The applicant has not offered any further information other than their existing licence conditions that can be measured to ensure that the licensing objectives are upheld, with particular reference to the later terminal hours applied for.

If the current application is granted, Licensing and out of hours are of the opinion that the increased traffic to and from the premises either by car, taxi or on foot would generate noise nuisance not normally experienced by nearby local residents and in particular the later week nights and Sunday night times applied for.

Manchester's Statement of Licensing Policy states in section 7.5 that "applicants are expected to address any local factors relevant to their premises." This has not been satisfied in the application and gives rise to concerns over the applicant's ability to effectively manage the premises fully at the later terminal hours applied for.

The Licensing and Out of Hours Team in our capacity as the Environmental Health Responsible Authority feel the grant of a licence based on the application submitted would undermine the licensing objectives and request it to be refused.

1. <u>Introduction</u>

- On 24/01/2019, an application for the grant of a Premises Licence under s17 of the Licensing Act 2003 was made in respect of PremiAir VIP Terminal, Aviation Viewing Park, Wilmslow Old Road, Manchester, WA15 8XQ in the Woodhouse Park ward of Manchester. A location map and photograph of the premises is attached at **Appendix 1**.
- 1.2 A 28-day public consultation exercise was undertaken in accordance with Licensing Act 2003 regulations; requiring the application to be advertised by the displaying of a blue notice at or on the premises, a notice published in a newspaper or similar circulating in the local area, and details of the application published on the Council's website.
- 1.3 Representations may be made for or against an application during the consultation period. To be 'relevant' and, therefore, able to be taken into account in determining the application, they must be about the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives. Where representations are made by persons who are not a responsible authority, they must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 1.4 Relevant representations have been received in respect of this application and so it must be determined by a Licensing Hearing Panel in accordance with the Council's Constitution.

2. The Application

- 2.1 A copy of the application is attached at **Appendix 2.**
- 2.2 The applicant is Manchester Airport Plc.
- 2.3 The description of the premises as given by the applicant is:

New Terminal at Manchester Airport located adjacent to the Runway Visitor Park.

- 2.4 The proposed designated premises supervisor is Robert Anthony Pattison
- 2.5 The licensable activities applied for are as follows:

Provision of late night refreshment: Indoors only

Mon to Sun 11pm to 5am

The supply of alcohol for consumption both on and off the premises:

Mon to Sun 24 Hours a day

Opening hours

Mon to Sun 24 Hours a day

- 2.5.1 In accordance with the Live Music Act 2012 and Deregulation Act 2015, performances of Live Music and Recorded Music between the hours of 0800 and 2300 hours have been deregulated and so should not be regarded as licensable activities for the purposes of this application.
- 2.5.2 Any further details provided relating to any of the individual licensable activities are specified on the application form at **Appendix 2**.

2.6 Activities unsuitable for children

2.6.1 The applicant has not highlighted any adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.

2.7 Steps to promote the licensing objectives

- 2.7.1 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by taking the steps identified in the operating schedule as stated in **Appendix 2**
- 2.7.2 These steps must be translated into conditions by the licensing authority to be included in any granted premises licence, unless the conditions are modified by the Panel following consideration of relevant representations. These conditions are set out in the Schedule of Conditions at **Appendix 4**.

2.8 Further documentation accompanying the application

2.8.1 The applicant has not submitted any further documents in support of their application.

4. Key Policies and Considerations

4.1 Legal Considerations

4.1.1 Hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 operate under the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

4.2 **New Information**

4.2.1 In accordance with Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings)
Regulations 2005, the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice either before the hearing or, with the consent of all parties, at the hearing.

4.3 **Hearsay Evidence**

4.3.1 The Panel may accept hearsay evidence and it will be a matter for the Panel to attach what weight to it that they consider appropriate. Hearsay evidence is evidence of something that a witness neither saw nor heard, but has heard or read about.

4.4 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003

- 4.4.1 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 is provided for all parties involved in licensing. It is a key medium for promoting best practice, ensuring consistent application of licensing powers across England and Wales and for promoting fairness, equal treatment and proportionality.
- 4.4.2 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. The Guidance is therefore binding on all licensing authorities to that extent. However, the Guidance cannot anticipate every possible scenario or set of circumstances that may arise and, as long as licensing authorities have properly understood this Guidance, they may depart from it if they have good reason to do so and can provide full reasons.
- 4.4.3 Departure from the Guidance could give rise to an appeal or judicial review, and the reasons given will then be a key consideration for the courts when considering the lawfulness and merits of any decision taken.

4.5 Manchester Statement of Licensing Policy

- 4.5.1 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' its statement of licensing policy.
- 4.5.2 The Licensing Policy sets out the vision the licensing authority has for the regulation of licensed premises throughout Manchester and outlines the standards expected in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing

- objectives in the city. The Panel may depart from the policies should it consider doing so would benefit the promotion of the licensing objectives. Reasons are to be given for any such departure from the Policy.
- 4.5.3 Section 4 of the Policy (Operation of the Policy) sets out how the Licensing Policy is intended to be used in practice for licence applications and licensed premises.
- 4.5.4 Relevant to this application and the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following sections of the Policy:

Section 6: What we aim to encourage

This section identifies certain types of venues and initiatives the licensing authority aims to encourage in order to promote an inclusive evening and night-time economy not simply focused on the consumption of alcohol. We aim to encourage:

- Premises that will extend the diversity of entertainment and attract a wider range of participants
- Live music, especially original material, which will provide a range of live performances and styles of music, provided that such entertainment does not undermine the licensing objectives
- National cultural institutions, global sports events and cultural festivals
- Non-drink-led premises, including restaurants, cafes, theatres and cinemas
- Communication and integration with local residents and businesses through licensees consulting with those in the local area prior to an application
- Participation in Pubwatches, off licence forums and other crimereduction partnerships
- Engagement with the NITENET radio scheme and DISC secure information sharing platform by city centre venues through the Cityco Manchester Business Crime Reduction Partnership
- Designing out crime in the layout of the premises

Section 7: Local factors

This section sets out key issues that applicants are expected to take into account relevant to the individual characteristics of the premises when preparing their operating schedule and address any local factors relevant to their premises.

 Having regard to the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following Factors:

- Consistency with relevant Council strategies
- The proximity of the premises to local residents and other local businesses, particularly in relation to the potential for nuisance
- Ability to clean and maintain the street scene
- Premises in proximity to the airport

Section 8: Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives

This section identifies the standards that the licensing authority expects of licensed premises in Manchester. It is recognised that not all standards will be appropriate to apply in every situation to every premises, and applicants are not obliged to include all standards in their operating schedule. The degree to which standards would be appropriate is expected to be proportionate to the risk posed against the promotion of the licensing objectives having regard to the individual circumstances of the premises. Section 9: Alcohol delivery services

This section sets out specific provisions for alcohol delivery services to be considered in conjunction with relevant standards from Section 8 of the Policy

Section 10: Adult entertainment (including striptease, nudity and other entertainment of a sexual nature)

This section sets out specific considerations in respect of applications to provide adult entertainment, including entertainment of a sexual nature e.g. nudity, striptease and lap dancing.

Section 11: The use of tables and chairs on the public highway

This section provides that the operation of any areas on the public highway licensed for tables and chairs should be considered with regard to all relevant Standards set out in Section 8 of the Policy.

Section 12: Premises Licences for large-scale public events

This section sets out particular expectations regarding large scale public events, given the specific associated risks.


5. Conclusion

- 5.1 A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act ("licensing functions") with a view to promoting the licensing objectives:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - the protection of children from harm.
- 5.2 In considering the matter, the Panel should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representations made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be. In reaching the decision, regard must also be had to relevant provisions of the national guidance and the Council's licensing policy statement.
- 5.3 Having regard to the representations, the Panel must take such of the steps set out below that it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - a) To grant the licence subject to:
 - i. the conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, which the Panel may modify to such extent as they consider appropriate, and

- ii. any mandatory conditions that must be included in the licence;
- b) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
- c) To refuse to specify the person proposed in the application as the designated premises supervisor;
- d) To reject the application.
- 5.4 The conditions consistent with the operating schedule may be modified to alter or omit any of them or to add any new condition, including restricting the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.
- 5.5 All licensing determinations should be considered on the individual merits of the application.
- 5.6 The Panel's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 5.7 It is important that a licensing authority should give comprehensive reasons for its decisions in anticipation of any appeals. Failure to give adequate reasons could itself give rise to grounds for an appeal.
- 5.8 The Panel is asked to determine the application.

The training must be given to a new member of staff before they commence employment and all staff must receive refresher training every 6 months.
- Notices advising what forms of ID are acceptable must be displayed.
- Notices must be displayed in prominent positions indicating that the Challenge 21 policy is in force.
- A refusals book will be maintained at the premises, and made available to an officer of a responsible authority upon request.

LOOH believe these conditions are proportionate and appropriate to uphold the four licensing objectives.

1. <u>Introduction</u>

- 1.1 On 21/01/2019, an application for the grant of a Premises Licence under s17 of the Licensing Act 2003 was made in respect of Santaboat, 818a Stockport Road, Manchester, M19 3AW in the Longsight ward of Manchester. A location map and photograph of the premises is attached at Appendix 1.
- 1.2 A 28-day public consultation exercise was undertaken in accordance with Licensing Act 2003 regulations; requiring the application to be advertised by the displaying of a blue notice at or on the premises, a notice published in a newspaper or similar circulating in the local area, and details of the application published on the Council's website.
- 1.3 Representations may be made for or against an application during the consultation period. To be 'relevant' and, therefore, able to be taken into account in determining the application, they must be about the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives. Where representations are made by persons who are not a responsible authority, they must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 1.4 Relevant representations have been received in respect of this application and so it must be determined by a Licensing Hearing Panel in accordance with the Council's Constitution.
- 2. The Application
- 2.1 A copy of the application is attached at Appendix 2.
- 2.2 The applicant is Santaboat Ltd.
- 2.3 The description of the premises by the applicant is a restaurant on the ground floor with an ancillary bar, providing authentic African cuisine with a European twist. The premises will also provide a takeaway option
- 2.4 The proposed designated premises supervisor is Agyenim Boateng
- 2.5 The licensable activities applied for:

Provision of regulated entertainment - recorded music, Mon to Thurs - noon to 11pm Fri to Sun - noon to 3am For the Thursday prior to Good Friday, Boxing Day, Year's Eve until 3am the following

Provision of late night refreshment: Both on and off the premises Fri to Sun - 11pm to 3am For the Thursday prior to Good Friday, Boxing Day, Year's Eve until 3am the following morning

The supply of alcohol for consumption both on and off the premises: Mon to Thurs - noon to 11pm Fri to Sun noon to 3am For the Thursday prior to Good Friday, Boxing Day, Year's Eve until 3am the following morning

Opening hours:

Mon to Thurs - noon to 11.30pm

Fri to Sun - noon to 3.30am

For the Thursday prior to Good Friday,

- 2.5.1 In accordance with the Live Music Act 2012 and Deregulation Act 2015, performances of Live Music and Recorded Music between the hours of 0800 and 2300 hours have been deregulated and so should not be regarded as licensable activities for the purposes of this application.
- 2.5.2 Any further details provided relating to any of the individual licensable activities are specified on the application form at Appendix 2.

2.6 Activities unsuitable for children

2.6.1 The applicant has not highlighted any adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.

2.7 Steps to promote the licensing objectives

- 2.8 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by taking the steps identified in the operating schedule.
- 2.9 These steps must be translated into conditions by the licensing authority to be included in any granted premises licence, unless the conditions are modified by the Panel following consideration of relevant representations. These conditions are set out in the Schedule of Conditions at **Appendix 4**.

3. Relevant Representations

4. Key Policies and Considerations

- 4.1 Legal Considerations
- 4.2 Hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 operate under the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.
- 4.3 New Information
- 4.4 In accordance with Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings)
 Regulations 2005, the authority may take into account documentary or other
 information produced by a party in support of their application, representations
 or notice either before the hearing or, with the consent of all parties, at the
 hearing.
- 4.5 Hearsay Evidence
- 4.6 The Panel may accept hearsay evidence and it will be a matter for the Panel to attach what weight to it that they consider appropriate. Hearsay evidence is evidence of something that a witness neither saw nor heard, but has heard or read about.
- 4.7 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003
- 4.8 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 is provided for all parties involved in licensing. It is a key medium for promoting best practice, ensuring consistent application of licensing powers across England and Wales and for promoting fairness, equal treatment and proportionality.
- 4.9 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. The Guidance is therefore binding on all licensing authorities to that extent. However, the Guidance cannot anticipate every possible scenario or set of circumstances that may arise and, as long as licensing authorities have properly understood this Guidance, they may depart from it if they have good reason to do so and can provide full reasons.
- 4.10 Departure from the Guidance could give rise to an appeal or judicial review, and the reasons given will then be a key consideration for the courts when considering the lawfulness and merits of any decision taken.
- 4.11 Manchester Statement of Licensing Policy
- 4.12 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' its statement of licensing policy.
- 4.13 The Licensing Policy sets out the vision the licensing authority has for the regulation of licensed premises throughout Manchester and outlines the standards expected in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives in the city. The Panel may depart from the policies should it consider doing so would benefit the promotion of the licensing objectives. Reasons are to be given for any such departure from the Policy.

- 4.14 Section 4 of the Policy (Operation of the Policy) sets out how the Licensing Policy is intended to be used in practice for licence applications and licensed premises.
- 4.15 Relevant to this application and the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following sections of the Policy:

Section 6: What we aim to encourage

This section identifies certain types of venues and initiatives the licensing authority aims to encourage in order to promote an inclusive evening and night-time economy not simply focused on the consumption of alcohol. We aim to encourage:

- Premises that will extend the diversity of entertainment and attract a wider range of participants
- Live music, especially original material, which will provide a range of live performances and styles of music, provided that such entertainment does not undermine the licensing objectives
- National cultural institutions, global sports events and cultural festivals
- Non-drink-led premises, including restaurants, cafes, theatres and cinemas
- Communication and integration with local residents and businesses through licensees consulting with those in the local area prior to an application
- Participation in Pubwatches, off licence forums and other crimereduction partnerships
- Engagement with the NITENET radio scheme and DISC secure information sharing platform by city centre venues through the Cityco Manchester Business Crime Reduction Partnership
- Designing out crime in the layout of the premises

Section 7: Local factors

This section sets out key issues that applicants are expected to take into account relevant to the individual characteristics of the premises when preparing their operating schedule and address any local factors relevant to their premises.

- Having regard to the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following Factors:
- Identified risk factors specific to the licensed premises
- Consistency with relevant Council strategies

- The proximity of the premises to local residents and other local businesses, particularly in relation to the potential for nuisance
- The availability of transport to and from the premises
- Ability to clean and maintain the street scene

Section 8: Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives

This section identifies the standards that the licensing authority expects of licensed premises in Manchester. It is recognised that not all standards will be appropriate to apply in every situation to every premises, and applicants are not obliged to include all standards in their operating schedule. The degree to which standards would be appropriate is expected to be proportionate to the risk posed against the promotion of the licensing objectives having regard to the individual circumstances of the premises. The standards are not exhaustive and the licensing authority will have regard to any relevant issues raised in any representation that may fall outside them.

- MS1 Effective general management of the premises
- MS3 Responsible promotion and sale of alcohol
- MS4 Prevent on-street consumption of alcohol
- MS6 Provide a Duty of Care for intoxicated or vulnerable customers and medical emergencies
- MS7 Maintain a safe capacity
- MS8 Prevent noise nuisance from the premises
- MS9 Effectively manage exterior spaces (e.g. beer gardens, smoking areas, table and chair areas on the highway)
- MS10 Operate effective cleansing arrangements, including ensuring the premises and surrounding area are kept clean and free of litter, and adequate arrangements for the secure and responsible storage of refuse
- MS11 Ensure the wellbeing of children on the premises
- MS12 Prevent underage sales of alcohol, including proxy sales

Section 9: Alcohol delivery services

This section sets out specific provisions for alcohol delivery services to be considered in conjunction with relevant standards from Section 8 of the Policy

Section 10: Adult entertainment (including striptease, nudity and other entertainment of a sexual nature)

This section sets out specific considerations in respect of applications to provide adult entertainment, including entertainment of a sexual nature e.g. nudity, striptease and lap dancing.

Section 11: The use of tables and chairs on the public highway

This section provides that the operation of any areas on the public highway licensed for tables and chairs should be considered with regard to all relevant Standards set out in Section 8 of the Policy.

Section 12: Premises Licences for large-scale public events

This section sets out particular expectations regarding large scale public events, given the specific associated risks.

5. Conclusion

- 5.1 A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act ("licensing functions") with a view to promoting the licensing objectives:
- the prevention of crime and disorder
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance; and
- the protection of children from harm.
- 5.2 In considering the matter, the Panel should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representations made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be. In reaching the decision, regard must also be had to relevant provisions of the national guidance and the Council's licensing policy statement.
- 5.3 Having regard to the representations, the Panel must take such of the steps set out below that it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - a) To grant the licence subject to:
 - the conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, which the Panel may modify to such extent as they consider appropriate, and
 - ii. any mandatory conditions that must be included in the licence;
 - b) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - To refuse to specify the person proposed in the application as the designated premises supervisor;

- d) To reject the application.
- 5.4 The conditions consistent with the operating schedule may be modified to alter or omit any of them or to add any new condition, including restricting the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.
- 5.5 All licensing determinations should be considered on the individual merits of the application.
- 5.6 The Panel's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 5.7 It is important that a licensing authority should give comprehensive reasons for its decisions in anticipation of any appeals. Failure to give adequate reasons could itself give rise to grounds for an appeal.
- 5.8 The Panel is asked to determine the application.





General – all four licensing objectives

Locations of fire safety and other safety equipment subject to change in accordance with the requirements of the responsible authorities or following a risk assessment.

Any detail shown on the plan that is not required by the licensing plans regulations is indicative only and subject to change at any time.

The premises will operate predominantly as a restaurant set out to tables and chairs with food available throughout the trading day, subject to a permitted wind-down period before the terminal hour of service.

Waiter/waitress service shall always be available.

Alcohol shall only be sold to customers seated and partaking in a table meal.

A 30-minute drinking up time on top of the last permitted sale of alcohol to allow customers to use the toilet facilities and disperse from the premises.

Prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV will be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. The system will enable frontal identification of every person entering the premises. The system will record in real time and operate whilst the premises are open for licensable activities. The recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days.

Recordings shall be made available immediately on request to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer (subject to GDPR) throughout the 31-day period following any incident.

A member of staff with knowledge of the CCTV system will be present on site whilst the premises are open to the public to aid any enquiry from a Police Officer or Authorised Officer requiring recent CCTV recordings with the minimum of delay when requested.

Off sales are to be taken off the area marked on the licensed plan in sealed containers only.

Public Safety

Appropriate fire safety measures will be installed and maintained as shown on the drawings accomplanying this application.

Staff will be trained in First Aid.

Adequate and appropriate first aid equipment and materials will be kept on site, regularly checked and kept in an easily accessible place for staff.



Please accept this as formal notification of the Greater Manchester Police objection to the premises licence application in relation to the above premises on the grounds of the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

The application seeks to allow the premises to operate as a licensed restaurant until 0300hrs Friday to Sunday each week with a closing time of 0330hrs. Alcohol sales are for consumption both on and off the premises but one of the conditions offered by the applicant is that alcohol will only be sold to customers who are seated and partaking in a table meal so this contradicts itself.

The location where the premises are situated is on the corner of a busy main road and a quiet residential street and the hours requested are not what GMP would regard as acceptable in this location.

It is believed that many of the customers will drive to the premises and will therefore park on Park Grove which is where there are several residential properties and the noise from these vehicles leaving the location will create a noise disturbance. It is also a concern that smokers who are using the premises will create an unacceptable level of noise when they are standing outside the premises in the sensitive early hours.

Another condition offered by the applicant states in part that the premises will predominantly operate as a restaurant, which suggests that a small part of the business may operate as something else and again this causes concern as to what else the premises may be used for.

Therefore GMP have concerns regarding the hours of operation in this residential area and also by some of the conditions offered by the applicant and as such we ask that the application is refused.

The Licensing and Out of Hours Team (LOOHT) have assessed the likely impact of the late night premises opening at 818a Stockport Road, Longsight, Manchester, M19 3AW taking into account a number of factors. This includes the location of nearby residential properties, the hours applied for and any potential risk that the granting of this licence, could lead to issues of Public Nuisance.

LOOHT have given particular consideration to Manchester City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, specifically s.7.25 in that the licensing authority will ensure that due consideration will be given to the proximity of licensed premises not only to local residents and businesses, but also in relation to other licensed premises; as well as s.7.28 in that the licensing authority will give consideration to the appropriateness of hours applied for, having regard for the location of premises and their likely effect of the promotion of the four Licensing Objectives.

The premises is situated on Stockport Road and is part of a busy area on the boundary of the Longsight and Levenshulme wards, it is also on a main arterial route in and out of the City Centre.

Above the premises are flats/offices which are currently vacant and are advertised to let. There are a number of residential properties in close distance both to the left and right and on opposite side of the road. To the left hand side facing the premises on Park Grove, there are a number of semi-detached residential properties. To the right hand side facing the premises on Pennington Street, there are a large number of residential terraced properties. On the opposite side of Stockport Road there are also residential flats above the commercial premises; also directly behind these flats there are a number of residential bungalows on Jean Close and, multiple residential premises on Mathews Lane.

The application is for a new premises licence for the following licensable activities:

Recorded music:

Supply of alcohol both on and off the premises:

There are currently no licensed premises which sell alcohol within 400m either way of the premises.

LOOHT believe there is a potential for public nuisance in the form of noise generated from customers leaving the premises during the later hours to 3:00 hours and noise from people congregating and using the external smoking area, within such close proximity to residential properties will lead to potential noise disturbances, which would significantly undermine the public nuisance objective.

If the application is granted we are of the opinion that the increased traffic to the premises either by car or foot would generate noise nuisance not normally experienced by nearby local residents.

There is also insufficient detail in relation to how noise nuisance will be monitored in regards to patrons smoking outside the premises.

With this information and that of our night time visits, Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance are of the opinion that the applicant even with the information provided in this application would not be able to uphold the licensing objectives in relation to public nuisance.

We therefore recommend that the application is refused.

Trading Standards has seen the licence application for the company Santaboat Ltd. It is noted that the application refers to "refusal of service to any person who is drunk or underage" "how to seek ID from anyone who appears to be underage", a Challenge 25 policy to be adopted with proportionate signage displayed", and "a refusals to serve log".

In order to clarify the issues regarding protection of children from harm, Trading Standards would like the following model conditions included in the licence if it is to be granted –

- The Challenge 25 scheme must be operated to ensure that any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall provide documented proof that he/she is over 18 years of age. Proof of age shall only comprise a passport, photo card driving licence, an HM Forces warrant card, or a card bearing the PASS hologram.
- 2. The premises shall display prominent signage indicating at any point of sale, at the entrance to the premises and in all areas where alcohol is located that the Challenge 25 scheme is in operation.

- 3. The premises shall display prominent signage indicating at any point of sale, at the entrance to the premises and in all areas where alcohol is located that it is an offence to buy or attempt to buy alcohol for a person who is under 18 and for a person under the age of 18 to buy or attempt to buy alcohol.
- 4. In addition to any other training, the premises licence holder shall ensure all staff are trained to prevent underage sales, to be aware of and prevent proxy sales, to maintain the refusals log, enter sales correctly on the tills so the prompts show as appropriate and monitor staff to ensure their training is put into practice.

I am writing to object to this application, particularly the proposal to open <u>until 03:00h</u> plus thirty minutes drinking up time three days a week and on other specified dates. I feel these hours are more suited to the city centre or an area where other venues have similar opening hours.

This is, on the whole, a quiet residential area particularly after the rush hour has ended and the traffic flow is greatly decreased.

From previous experience of a restaurant on these premises, my personal concerns are noise (particularly from loud music) and parking. The front of the restaurant is mostly glass so unless the music is kept to a level which cannot be heard outside, I can hear it in my home. I am also concerned that which runs alongside my house will become a car park with all the inconveniences of blocked access to my home as well as the noise of people leaving at all hours up to 03:30+h.

I hope that when considering this application my concerns are taken on board particularly that music should not be audible outside the premises at any time.
