1. <u>Introduction</u>

- 1.1 On 18/02/2019, an application for the variation of an existing premises licence under s34 of the Licensing Act 2003 was made in respect of Victoria's, part basement, 8 Dantzic Street, Manchester, M4 2AD in the Piccadilly ward of Manchester. A location map of the premises is attached at **Appendix 1**.
- 1.2 A 28-day public consultation exercise was undertaken in accordance with Licensing Act 2003 regulations; requiring the application to be advertised by the displaying of a blue notice at or on the premises, a notice published in a newspaper or similar circulating in the local area, and details of the application published on the Council's website.
- 1.3 Representations may be made for or against an application during the consultation period. To be 'relevant' and, therefore, able to be taken into account in determining the application, they must be about the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives. Where representations are made by persons who are not a responsible authority, they must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 1.4 Relevant representations have been received in respect of this application and so it must be determined by a Licensing Hearing Panel in accordance with the Council's Constitution.

2. <u>Current Licence</u>

2.1 The premises licence holder is Roefax Ltd and a copy of the current licence is attached at **Appendix 2.**

3. <u>The Application</u>

- 3.1 A copy of the application is attached at **Appendix 3.**
- 3.2 The variation requests to:
 - a) Extend the hours for licensable activities each Friday and Saturday;
 - b) Extend the hours for licensable activities on Sundays preceding a Bank Holiday Monday and the morning following any UEFA Champions League Football Match played at either the Etihad Stadium (Manchester City) or Old Trafford (Manchester United) until 06:00; and
 - c) Make amendments to conditions

Further details are as follows:

a) Proposed amendments to hours on Fridays and Saturdays

b) Proposed amendments to hours at other times

c) Proposed amendments to conditions/ steps to promote licensing objectives as given by the applicant

The application proposes to add and amend conditions as follows:

Conditions to be added:

There will be no entry or re-entry allowed at the premises after 03:30 apart from smokers returning from the designated smoking area.

A minimum of 1 member of door staff to remain on site for 30 minutes following close on those days when the premises are trading until 06:00.

Condition to be amended:

Annex 2, Number 3: The application request to amend the wording within this condition from "The time of any breaks taken whilst on duty" to "The time of any meal breaks taken whilst on duty".

(For information the full condition is: "A written record shall be kept on the premises of every person employed on the premises as a door supervisor in a register kept for that purpose. That record shall contain the following details: The door supervisor's name, date of birth and home address; His/her Security Industry Authority licence number; The time and date he/she starts and finished duty; The time of any breaks taken whilst on duty; Each entry shall be signed by the door supervisor.")

3.2.1 In accordance with the Live Music Act 2012 and Deregulation Act 2015, performances of Live Music and Recorded Music between the hours of 0800 and 2300 hours have been deregulated and so should not be regarded as licensable activities for the purposes of this application. 3.2.2 Any further details provided relating to any of the individual licensable activities are specified on the application form at **Appendix 3**.

3.3 Activities unsuitable for children

3.3.1 The premises also holds a sex establishment licence.

3.4 **Steps to promote the licensing objectives**

- 3.4.1 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by adding and amending conditions as outlined para 3.2 (c) above. No additional steps have been identified in the operating schedule of the application.
- 3.4.2 The conditions referred to above are to be included in any granted premises licence, unless the conditions are modified by the Panel following consideration of relevant representations. These conditions are set out in the Schedule of Conditions at **Appendix 5**.

4. <u>Relevant Representations</u>

4.1 A total of two relevant representations were received in respect of the application (**Appendix 4**).

4.3 No conditions have been proposed by either of the objectors, and no agreements have been reached.

5. <u>Key Policies and Considerations</u>

5.1 Legal Considerations

5.1.1 Hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 operate under the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

5.2 **New Information**

5.2.1 In accordance with Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice either before the hearing or, with the consent of all parties, at the hearing.

5.3 Hearsay Evidence

5.3.1 The Panel may accept hearsay evidence and it will be a matter for the Panel to attach what weight to it that they consider appropriate. Hearsay evidence is evidence of something that a witness neither saw nor heard, but has heard or read about.

5.4 **The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003**

- 5.4.1 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 is provided for all parties involved in licensing. It is a key medium for promoting best practice, ensuring consistent application of licensing powers across England and Wales and for promoting fairness, equal treatment and proportionality.
- 5.4.2 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. The Guidance is therefore binding on all licensing authorities to that extent. However, the Guidance cannot anticipate every possible scenario or set of circumstances that may arise and, as long as licensing authorities have properly understood this Guidance, they may depart from it if they have good reason to do so and can provide full reasons.
- 5.4.3 Departure from the Guidance could give rise to an appeal or judicial review, and the reasons given will then be a key consideration for the courts when considering the lawfulness and merits of any decision taken.

5.5 Manchester Statement of Licensing Policy

- 5.5.1 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' its statement of licensing policy.
- 5.5.2 The Licensing Policy sets out the vision the licensing authority has for the regulation of licensed premises throughout Manchester and outlines the standards expected in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives in the city. The Panel may depart from the policies should it consider doing so would benefit the promotion of the licensing objectives. Reasons are to be given for any such departure from the Policy.

- 5.5.3 Section 4 of the Policy (Operation of the Policy) sets out how the Licensing Policy is intended to be used in practice for licence applications and licensed premises.
- 5.5.4 Relevant to this application and the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following sections of the Policy:

Section 6: What we aim to encourage

This section identifies certain types of venues and initiatives the licensing authority aims to encourage in order to promote an inclusive evening and night-time economy not simply focused on the consumption of alcohol. We aim to encourage:

- Premises that will extend the diversity of entertainment and attract a wider range of participants
- Live music, especially original material, which will provide a range of live performances and styles of music, provided that such entertainment does not undermine the licensing objectives
- National cultural institutions, global sports events and cultural festivals
- Non-drink-led premises, including restaurants, cafes, theatres and cinemas
- Communication and integration with local residents and businesses through licensees consulting with those in the local area prior to an application
- Participation in Pubwatches, off licence forums and other crimereduction partnerships
- Engagement with the NITENET radio scheme and DISC secure information sharing platform by city centre venues through the Cityco Manchester Business Crime Reduction Partnership
- Designing out crime in the layout of the premises

Section 7: Local factors

This section sets out key issues that applicants are expected to take into account relevant to the individual characteristics of the premises when preparing their operating schedule and address any local factors relevant to their premises.

Having regard to the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following Factors:

• Identified risk factors specific to the licensed premises

- Evidence of pre-existing problems in the area
- Proximity of takeaways and licences to nightlife entertainment areas
- Consistency with relevant Council strategies
- The proximity of the premises to local residents and other local businesses, particularly in relation to the potential for nuisance
- Ability to clean and maintain the street scene

Section 8: Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives

This section identifies the standards that the licensing authority expects of licensed premises in Manchester. It is recognised that not all standards will be appropriate to apply in every situation to every premises, and applicants are not obliged to include all standards in their operating schedule. The degree to which standards would be appropriate is expected to be proportionate to the risk posed against the promotion of the licensing objectives having regard to the individual circumstances of the premises. The standards are not exhaustive and the licensing authority will have regard to any relevant issues raised in any representation that may fall outside them.

- MS1 Implement effective security measures at the premises
- MS8 Prevent noise nuisance from the premises
- MS9 Effectively manage exterior spaces (e.g. beer gardens, smoking areas, table and chair areas on the highway)
- MS10 Operate effective cleansing arrangements, including ensuring the premises and surrounding area are kept clean and free of litter, and adequate arrangements for the secure and responsible storage of refuse

Section 10: Adult entertainment (including striptease, nudity and other entertainment of a sexual nature)


This section sets out specific considerations in respect of applications to provide adult entertainment, including entertainment of a sexual nature e.g. nudity, striptease and lap dancing.


6. <u>Conclusion</u>

- 6.1 A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act ("licensing functions") with a view to promoting the licensing objectives:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety;

- the prevention of public nuisance; and
- the protection of children from harm.
- 6.2 In considering the matter, the Panel should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representations made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be. In reaching the decision, regard must also be had to relevant provisions of the national guidance and the Council's licensing policy statement.
- 6.3 The Panel must take such of the steps set out below that it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - a) To grant the licence subject to the conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, which the Panel may modify to such extent as they consider appropriate;
 - b) To reject the whole or part of the application
- 6.4 The conditions consistent with the operating schedule may be modified to alter or omit any of them or to add any new condition, including restricting the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.
- 6.5 However, conditions should not be imposed on a licence which are unrelated to the variation sought.
- 6.6 All licensing determinations should be considered on the individual merits of the application.
- 6.7 The Panel's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 6.8 It is important that a licensing authority should give comprehensive reasons for its decisions in anticipation of any appeals. Failure to give adequate reasons could itself give rise to grounds for an appeal.

6.9 **The Panel is asked to determine the application**.

- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence or,
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

- The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

5. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the (1)premises for a price, which is less than the permitted price. For the purposes of the condition set out in (1) above-(2)(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liguor Duties Act 1979 (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula- $P = D + (D \times V)$ where -(i) P is the permitted price, D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were (ii) charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value (iii) added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a (C) premises licence -(i) the holder of the premises licence, the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (ii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such (iii) a licence: "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club (d) premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added (e) Tax Act 1994. Where the permitted price given by paragraph (2)(b) would (apart from this paragraph) not be a (3) whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny. Sub-paragraph (4)(b) applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (2)(b) on a day (4)(a) ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax. (b) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day. The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or 6. (1) participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, (2)or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or (a) encourage, individuals to drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or (i) supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (ii) (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 8. The responsible person must ensure that
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
 - (i) beer or cider: $\frac{1}{2}$ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

For the purposes of conditions 6, 7 and 8 above, a responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

Exhibition of films

- 9. The admission of children under the age of 18 to film exhibitions permitted under the terms of this certificate shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendations made:
 - (a) by the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC) where the film has been classified by that Board, or
 - (b) by the Licensing Authority where no classification certificate has been granted by the BBFC, or where the licensing authority has notified the club which holds the certificate that section 20 (3)
 (b) (74 (3)(b) for clubs) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to the film.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

1. An effective and adequate CCTV system equipped with a recording facility shall be installed, maintained and operated at the premises. Recorded images shall be kept in date order and numbered consequentially.

Recording equipment and tapes shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the DPS or other nominated responsible individual.

- Notices shall be prominently displayed inside the premises advising patrons that there is a CCTV system in operation.
- 3. A written record shall be kept on the premises of every person employed on the premises as a door supervisor in a register kept for that purpose. That record shall contain the following details:
 - i. The door supervisor's name, date of birth and home address;
 - ii. His/her Security Industry Authority licence number;

- iii. The time and date he/she starts and finished duty;
- iv. The time of any breaks taken whilst on duty;
- v. Each entry shall be signed by the door supervisor.

That register shall be available for inspection on request by an Authorised Officer of the Council, the Security Industry Authority or a Police Constable.

- 4. There shall be provided at the premises Door Supervisors who are registered with the security industry authority from 1900 until the close of business.
- 5. There shall be an adequate number of registered door supervisors on the premises when the authorised entertainment is taking place to ensure good order and the safety of performers and customers. At least one door supervisor shall be positioned at the entrance(s) in use at all times when adult entertainment is taking place.
- 6. Notices providing taxi firm numbers shall be displayed near the exits of the premises.
- 7. Fire fighting equipment shall be maintained and serviced on an annual basis.
- 8. An adequate supply of first aid equipment shall be made available on the premises at all times.
- 9. All electrical equipment shall be inspected on an annual basis.
- 10. Amplified music shall not be played outside the premises.
- 11. Glassware shall not be collected from the premises, or disposed of into outside waste receptacles, between 2000 and 0800.
- 12. All external windows and doors shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is being provided except for access and egress to and from the premises and/or in the event of an emergency.
- 13. Signage shall be displayed at the exits requesting that customers leave the premises quietly.
- 14. No person under the age of 18 shall be permitted on the premises at any time when licensable activities are taking place.
- 15. Signage shall be displayed at all entrances informing the customers that persons under 18 years shall not be admitted on the premises.
- 16. No sale or supply of alcohol shall be made to a person who appears to be under the age of 21, unless before a sale or supply is made the purchaser produces to the seller a document containing a photograph of the purchaser (such as a passport, driving licence or proof of age card) and that purchaser is over the age of 18.
- 17. There shall be no touching of performers by customers before, during or after the performance, other than the placing of banknotes by the customer in a garter worn by the performer for that purpose. There shall be no exchange of personal information between the performers and customers. Notices to this effect shall be clearly displayed at each entrance to the premises.
- 18. Adult entertainment shall only take place in the licensed area as shown on the plan attached to the premises licence.
- 19. Safe and controlled access to the dressing room for performers shall be maintained at all times when the performance is taking place and immediately afterwards. Members of the public shall not be allowed to access the dressing rooms.
- 20. Dancers not performing shall not be in the licensed area in a state of undress.

21.

The performance area shall be supervised by a member of staff at all times when performances are taking place. The management at the premises shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that customers remain seated whilst adult entertainment is taking place.

- 22. Entertainment, including dancing, which involves nudity or sexual performance of any kind shall not be visible from outside the premises.
- 23. There shall be no display outside the premises of photographs or other images which indicate that entertainment involving nudity or sexual performance taking place on the premises.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after hearing by the licensing authority

- 1. CCTV shall cover the point of sale at all times. The recordings shall be retained for a minimum of 28 days and all images shall be made available to responsible authorities on request.
- 2. Noise from music and associated sources (including amplified voices) shall not be a nuisance inside noise sensitive properties.
- 3. All staff shall be trained with regards to Challenge 21 policy and forms of acceptable ID. Staff shall also be trained to look out for and take action to prevent proxy sales taking place. This training shall be recorded on writing. Training shall be repeated on a regular basis and details of repeat training shall also be recorded in writing.
- The premises shall operate a refusals book and this shall be checked on a regular basis by the Designated Premises Supervisor to ensure that it is being used by staff.

Please accept this as formal notification of the Greater Manchester Police objection to the premises licence in relation to the above premises on the grounds of Prevention of Crime and Disorder and the Prevention of Public Nuisance and Public Safety.

The application is seeking to allow the premises to extend its SEV licensable hours and closing time until 0630 hrs on Fridays and Saturdays in an area where there is a high concentration of assaults and disorder. They are also seeking to do the same thing on Sundays preceding a Bank Holiday and whenever Manchester United or Manchester City have a home fixture in the UEFA Champions League.

A significant number of officers who are deployed on the weekend policing operation Custodian are located in the Dantzic Street/Withy Grove area due to the issues that the area attracts and in the early hours a significant number of the calls made to the police relate to the premises in this area and the locality in general.

All but one of the other alcohol licensed venues in this vicinity finish trading by 4am on a weekend and by allowing these premises to remain open for another 2 ½ hours will almost certainly attract this unruly element to the premises and cause issues. This will probably lead to issues on the door, with new customers coming from the other venues in the locality and trying to gain entry. This will then see an increase in calls to service that GMP are already overstretched to deal with.

Between 14th March 2018 and 14th March 2019 there were 112 incidents of violence and 52 incidents of ASB recorded on Dantzic Street and Withy Grove combined and a number of these were in the later hours of the early morning.

We therefore ask that this application is refused.

Outline your representation regarding the above application below. This representation should describe the likely effect of the grant of the licence/certificate on the licensing objectives and on the vicinity of the premises.

The Licensing and Out of Hours Team have assessed the likely impact of the granting of this application taking into account a number of factors, including the nature of the business, location of the premise, the Councils Statement of Licensing Policy 2016-2021 and any potential risk that the granting of this variation application will undermine the Council Licensing Policy including the four licensing objectives of public nuisance, crime and disorder, protection of children from harm and public health.

The premise is a Sexual Entertainment Venue situated on Dantzic in Manchester City Centre which is an area of the City Centre with a thriving night time economy close to a number of late night premises including the Printworks. The location of the premise is also located close to the Arndale Shopping Centre which is a focal point of the daytime economy within Manchester City Centre. We therefore have concerns regarding the extension of operating hours requested. There are also a number of residential properties above the venue.

The applicant has applied to:-

- Extend the hours of licensable activities on Fridays, Saturdays to 6am, open to the public until 6.30am.
- Sundays preceding a Bank Holiday Monday and the morning following any UEFA Champions League played at either Old Trafford or Etihad until 6am.
- Make amendments to the Operating schedule

As a result of our assessment we have concerns that the granting of this application is likely to lead to issues of public nuisance and the undermining of the Council's Licensing Policy.

When considering the request to extend the hours of licensable activities on Fridays, Saturdays to 6am, open to the public until 6.30am, we feel these hours will greatly impact on residents in the vicinity of the premise from noise by people leaving at the terminal hour and those permitted to temporarily leave to smoke. In addition to the residents we have also taken into account the effect on the day time economy when the public will be arriving or passing through, on a daily commute or visiting the City. The hours also raise concerns over the ability of the Council to clean and maintain the street scene ahead of the arrival of the day time economy due to the change over time of the Councils Street Cleansing Teams.

When assessing this application we have given particular consideration to Manchester City Council's statement of Licensing Policy 2016-2021 and how the granting of this application would undermine our Policy, specifically to:

Paragraph 7.26 refers to consideration the Authority should make to prevention of nuisance such as noise disturbance from people entering and leaving the premises, prevention of disturbance by people outside the premises, litter from premises. **Paragraph 7.28** in that the licensing authority will give consideration to the appropriateness of hours applied for, having regard for the location of premises and their likely effect of the promotion of the four Licensing Objectives **Paragraph 7.29** the authority considers that late hours will typically be more

sensitive and higher risk in causing problems

Paragraph 7.31 states that the lateness of terminal hour for the premises will often be a contributory factor in the potential for disturbance.

Paragraph 7.39 The night-time economy presents particular service needs in relation to street cleaning to ensure the streets are cleansed following the departure of night-time crowds, but ahead of the arrival of other users the following morning. Use of mechanised equipment, or even broom-sweeping, is often impractical when streets are busy with people and litter continues to be discarded.

As the applicant has also requested to extend the hours of licensable activities until 06:00 hours following UEFA Champions League matches played at either Old Trafford or Etihad.

The Manchester City Council's statement of Licensing Policy 2016-2021 stated that a number of risk factors should be taken into consideration when applying for and granting a licence application, specifically paragraph 7.8

Paragraph 7.8 Relevant factors include:

- Physical design of the premises, including:
- physical hazards arising from type and placement of furniture
- lighting that facilitates deviance and increases anonymity
- insufficient and unclean toilets

- Activities at the premises, including entertainment

- Style of operation, particularly related to the likelihood of alcohol

consumption

- The potential for pre-loading by customers

- Social mix of patrons

— Patron type (age, gender)

— Visible staffing of the local public realm, including policing, wardens, Street Angels etc

— The surrounding locality including:

— public CCTV coverage

— any pedestrian and vehicular pathways likely to be used by customers when leaving the premises late at night.

Given that football and Sexual Entertainment Venues are predominantly frequented by males, a number of these risk factors are met before any other considerations have taken place. Another risk factor to be taken into consideration for events where there is a drinking culture associated, such as football, is the fact that there is a high probability that patrons arriving at the premises will have already been drinking for an extended period of time.

A further concern is that the premises will become a 'go to' location for football fans wanting to continue their stay in the City. It is common amongst football fans to chant and more so

when in large numbers. The concern of the Licensing and Out of Hours Team is that this would lead to an increase of noise disturbance in an area which contains residential properties. It is also worth pointing out that during the week the majority of premises in the area will be closed and therefore there will be less transient noise in the area. The applicant has offered a last entry time of 03:30 however this does not mitigate our concerns about the large numbers of people who may attempt to gain entry but then subsequently loiter outside the premises once refused. From the applicant's proposals, there will be a three hour period between last entry and closing where the premises will appear to be open with staff and customers outside in the smoking area and this may encourage those refused entry to remain outside engaging in conversation directly below residential properties.

The exemption to the standard hours for UEFA Champions League matches means that the hours are extended during weekdays and the Licensing and Out of Hours Team have concerns that these events will have a greater impact on residents and the daytime economy. Given that patrons will have been consuming alcohol until 6:00 hours they are therefore more likely to cause a public nuisance on dispersal.

Therefore given the above concerns the Licensing and Out of Hours Team recommend that this application is refused.

1. <u>Introduction</u>

- 1.1 On 18/02/2019, an application for the variation of an existing Premises Licence under s34 of the Licensing Act 2003 was made in respect of Obsessions, First Floor, 2b Whitworth Street West, Manchester, M1 5WZ in the Deansgate ward of Manchester. A location map of the premises is attached at **Appendix 1**.
- 1.2 A 28-day public consultation exercise was undertaken in accordance with Licensing Act 2003 regulations; requiring the application to be advertised by the displaying of a blue notice at or on the premises, a notice published in a newspaper or similar circulating in the local area, and details of the application published on the Council's website.
- 1.3 Representations may be made for or against an application during the consultation period. To be 'relevant' and, therefore, able to be taken into account in determining the application, they must be about the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives. Where representations are made by persons who are not a responsible authority, they must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 1.4 Relevant representations have been received in respect of this application and so it must be determined by a Licensing Hearing Panel in accordance with the Council's Constitution.

2. <u>Current Licence</u>

2.1 The premises licence holder is Primehill Properties Limited and a copy of the current licence is attached at **Appendix 2.**

3. <u>The Application</u>

- 3.1 A copy of the application is attached at **Appendix 3.**
- 3.2 The variation requests to
 - a) Extend the hours for licensable activities each Friday and Saturday;
 - b) Extend the hours for licensable activities on Sundays preceding a Bank Holiday Monday and the morning following any UEFA Champions League Football Match played at either the Etihad Stadium (Manchester City) or Old Trafford (Manchester United) until 06:00; and
 - c) Make amendments to conditions

The application proposes to add and amend conditions as follows:

There will be no entry or re-entry allowed at the premises after 03:30 apart from smokers returning from the designated smoking area. A minimum of 1 member of door staff to remain on site for 30 minutes following close on those days when the premises are trading until 06:00.

Condition to be amended:

Annex 3, condition 8: The application request to amend the wording within this condition from "The time of any breaks taken whilst on duty" to "The time of any meal breaks taken whilst on duty".

(For information the full condition is: "A written record shall be kept on the premises by the Designated Premises Supervisor of every person employed on the premises as a door supervisor in a register kept for that purpose. That record shall contain the following details: (a) the door supervisor's name, date of birth and home address; (b) his/her Security Industry Authority licence number; (c) the time and date he/she starts and finishes duty; (d) the time of any breaks taken whilst on duty; (e) each entry shall be signed by the door supervisor.")

- 3.2.1 In accordance with the Live Music Act 2012 and Deregulation Act 2015, performances of Live Music and Recorded Music between the hours of 0800 and 2300 hours have been deregulated and so should not be regarded as licensable activities for the purposes of this application.
- 3.2.2 Any further details provided relating to any of the individual licensable activities are specified on the application form at **Appendix 3**.

3.3 Activities unsuitable for children

3.3.1 The premises also holds a sex establishment licence.

3.4 **Steps to promote the licensing objectives**

- 3.4.1 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by adding and amending conditions as outlined para 3.2 (c) above. No additional steps have been identified in the operating schedule of the application.
- 3.4.2 The conditions referred to above are to be included in any granted premises licence, unless the conditions are modified by the Panel following consideration of relevant representations. The conditions are set out in the Schedule of Conditions at **Appendix 5**.

4. <u>Relevant Representations</u>

4.1 A total of two relevant representations were received in respect of the application (**Appendix 4**).

4.3 No conditions have been proposed by either of the objectors, and no agreements have been reached.

5. Key Policies and Considerations

5.1 Legal Considerations

5.1.1 Hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 operate under the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

5.2 **New Information**

5.2.1 In accordance with Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice either before the hearing or, with the consent of all parties, at the hearing.

5.3 Hearsay Evidence

5.3.1 The Panel may accept hearsay evidence and it will be a matter for the Panel to attach what weight to it that they consider appropriate. Hearsay evidence is evidence of something that a witness neither saw nor heard, but has heard or read about.

5.4 **The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003**

- 5.4.1 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 is provided for all parties involved in licensing. It is a key medium for promoting best practice, ensuring consistent application of licensing powers across England and Wales and for promoting fairness, equal treatment and proportionality.
- 5.4.2 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. The Guidance is therefore binding on all licensing authorities to that extent. However, the Guidance cannot anticipate every possible scenario or set of circumstances that may arise and, as long as licensing authorities have properly understood this Guidance, they may depart from it if they have good reason to do so and can provide full reasons.
- 5.4.3 Departure from the Guidance could give rise to an appeal or judicial review, and the reasons given will then be a key consideration for the courts when considering the lawfulness and merits of any decision taken.

5.5 Manchester Statement of Licensing Policy

- 5.5.1 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' its statement of licensing policy.
- 5.5.2 The Licensing Policy sets out the vision the licensing authority has for the regulation of licensed premises throughout Manchester and outlines the standards expected in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives in the city. The Panel may depart from the policies should it consider doing so would benefit the promotion of the licensing objectives. Reasons are to be given for any such departure from the Policy.
- 5.5.3 Section 4 of the Policy (Operation of the Policy) sets out how the Licensing Policy is intended to be used in practice for licence applications and licensed premises.
- 5.5.4 Relevant to this application and the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following sections of the Policy:

Section 6: What we aim to encourage

This section identifies certain types of venues and initiatives the licensing authority aims to encourage in order to promote an inclusive evening and nighttime economy not simply focused on the consumption of alcohol. We aim to encourage:

- Premises that will extend the diversity of entertainment and attract a wider range of participants
- Live music, especially original material, which will provide a range of live performances and styles of music, provided that such entertainment does not undermine the licensing objectives
- National cultural institutions, global sports events and cultural festivals
- Non-drink-led premises, including restaurants, cafes, theatres and cinemas
- Communication and integration with local residents and businesses through licensees consulting with those in the local area prior to an application
- Participation in Pubwatches, off licence forums and other crime-reduction partnerships
- Engagement with the NITENET radio scheme and DISC secure information sharing platform by city centre venues through the Cityco Manchester Business Crime Reduction Partnership
- Designing out crime in the layout of the premises

Section 7: Local factors

This section sets out key issues that applicants are expected to take into account relevant to the individual characteristics of the premises when preparing their operating schedule and address any local factors relevant to their premises.

Having regard to the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following Factors:

- Identified risk factors specific to the licensed premises
- Evidence of pre-existing problems in the area
- Consistency with relevant Council strategies
- The proximity of the premises to local residents and other local businesses, particularly in relation to the potential for nuisance
- Ability to clean and maintain the street scene

Section 8: Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives

This section identifies the standards that the licensing authority expects of licensed premises in Manchester. It is recognised that not all standards will be appropriate to apply in every situation to every premises, and applicants are not obliged to include all standards in their operating schedule. The degree to which standards would be appropriate is expected to be proportionate to the risk posed against the promotion of the licensing objectives having regard to the individual circumstances of the premises. The standards are not exhaustive and the licensing authority will have regard to any relevant issues raised in any representation that may fall outside them.

- MS1 Implement effective security measures at the premises
- MS8 Prevent noise nuisance from the premises
- MS9 Effectively manage exterior spaces (e.g. beer gardens, smoking areas, table and chair areas on the highway)
- MS10 Operate effective cleansing arrangements, including ensuring the premises and surrounding area are kept clean and free of litter, and adequate arrangements for the secure and responsible storage of refuse


Section 10: Adult entertainment (including striptease, nudity and other entertainment of a sexual nature)

This section sets out specific considerations in respect of applications to provide adult entertainment, including entertainment of a sexual nature e.g. nudity, striptease and lap dancing.

6. <u>Conclusion</u>

- 6.1 A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act ("licensing functions") with a view to promoting the licensing objectives:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - the protection of children from harm.
- 6.2 In considering the matter, the Panel should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representations made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be. In reaching the decision, regard must also be had to relevant provisions of the national guidance and the Council's licensing policy statement.
- 6.3 The Panel must take such of the steps set out below that it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - a) To grant the licence subject to the conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, which the Panel may modify to such extent as they consider appropriate;
 - b) To reject the whole or part of the application
- 6.4 The conditions consistent with the operating schedule may be modified to alter or omit any of them or to add any new condition, including restricting the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.
- 6.5 However, conditions should not be imposed on a licence which are unrelated to the variation sought.
- 6.6 All licensing determinations should be considered on the individual merits of the application.
- 6.7 The Panel's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 6.8 It is important that a licensing authority should give comprehensive reasons for its decisions in anticipation of any appeals. Failure to give adequate reasons could itself give rise to grounds for an appeal.

6.9 **The Panel is asked to determine the application**.

- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence:

 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 5. (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price, which is less than the permitted price.
 - (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in (1) above-

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (3) Where the permitted price given by paragraph (2)(b) would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (4) (a) Sub-paragraph (4)(b) applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (2)(b) on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (b) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- 6. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 8. The responsible person must ensure that -
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –
 - (i) beer or cider: $\frac{1}{2}$ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

For the purposes of conditions 6, 7 and 8 above, a responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. A House Drugs Policy shall be established and staff shall be appropriately trained in its operation.
- 2. Admission Procedures and Search Policies shall be established.
- 3. Staff shall be provided with training in identifying drugs misuse.
- 4. A representative of the premises shall attend any police briefings in respect to drug misuse.
- 5. A sufficient number of adequate and appropriately stocked First Aid Boxes shall be provided at the premises.

- 17. Any complaint shall be immediately dealt with upon receipt through appropriate channels.
- 18. Patrons shall be requested by way of verbal requests and prominent notices to respect nearby neighbours by leaving the premises in a quiet, courteous and orderly fashion.

- 19. Proper training and guidance shall be given to all staff, plus updates and training records, to ensure that all reasonable steps are taken to establish age of patrons.
- 20. All staff shall be requested to disclose any convictions for serving alcohol to underage persons.
- 21. There shall be a clear Policy of Zero Tolerance to violent and antisocial behaviour.
- 22. There shall be clear policies on standards of behaviour and dress.
- 23. The premises shall use recognised Identity Card schemes, e.g. PASS.
- 24. Closing Time procedures shall be implemented and understood by all staff.
- 25. Escape areas shall be routinely checked by a responsible member of senior management when licensable activities are taking place.
- 26. All escape routes shall be clearly marked and lit and duly checked and recorded on a monthly basis
- 27. All fire fighting appliances shall be serviced on an annual basis. All Fire Exit signs and smoke detectors shall be checked on a monthly basis. There shall be weekly checking of Fire Bells. All of these checks shall be duly recorded methodically. There shall be daily checks to ensure that Fire Extinguishers are in their proper location.
- 28. Monthly/bimonthly fire evacuation procedures shall be tested and recorded.
- 29. Training shall be provided to all staff on all aspects of fire safety. All such training shall be recorded.
- 30. Entry Door Staff shall record customer numbers and be able to prove the numbers at any one time (including staff).
- 31. An ID Club Scan or equivalent system shall be operational at the premises whenever they are open to the public.
- 32. Fluorescent high visibility vests shall be worn at all times by security staff working inside and outside the premises.
- 33. A bodycam shall be used by security staff whenever the premises is open to the public. Footage recorded shall be retained in an unedited format for at least 28 days. Any person left in charge of the premises shall be trained in the use of any such bodycam or CCTV equipment and shall be able to produce/download/burn images upon request by a person from a responsible authority. Recordings shall be made available within 24 hours upon such request

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after hearing by the licensing authority

- 1. Local taxi numbers shall be displayed near the exit of the premises.
- 2. All windows and doors to be kept closed, except for access and egress whilst regulated entertainment is taking place.
- 3. Management shall ensure inaudibility of regulated entertainment at the nearest noise sensitive location, namely the residential premises at the junction of Hewitt Street and Deansgate.
- 4. Staff shall avoid the emptying of bins into skips especially if they contain glass, and early refuse collections before 0800 hours and after 2200 hours.
- 5. No external speakers shall be operated at the premises.
- 6. CCTV must be installed at the premises and all the images recorded by the CCTV system shall be retained in unedited form for a period of not less than 28 days.

There shall be provided at the premises door supervisors, who are registered with the Security Industry Authority from 1200 hours (opening) until the close of business. Door supervisors are to be employed to such a number as the management of the premises consider are sufficient to control the entry of persons to the premises and for the keeping of order in the premises when they are used for a licensable activity.

- 8. A written record shall be kept on the premises by the Designated Premises Supervisor of every person employed on the premises as a door supervisor in a register kept for that purpose. That record shall contain the following details:-
 - (a) the door supervisor's name, date of birth and home address;
 - (b) his/her Security Industry Authority licence number;

- (c) the time and date he/she starts and finishes duty;
- (d) the time of any breaks taken whilst on duty;
- (e) each entry shall be signed by the door supervisor.
- 9. That register shall be available for inspection on demand by an Authorised Officer of the Council, the Security Industry Authority or a Police Constable.

Please accept this as formal notification of the Greater Manchester Police objection to the premises licence in relation to the above premises on the grounds of Prevention of Crime and Disorder and the Prevention of Public Nuisance and Public Safety.

The application is seeking to allow the premises to extend its licensable hours until 0600 hrs on Fridays and Saturdays with a closing time of 6.30 hrs in an area where there is one of the highest concentrations of assaults and disorder within the City Centre. They are also seeking to do the same thing on Sundays preceding a Bank Holiday and whenever Manchester United or Manchester City have a home fixture in the UEFA Champions League.

A significant number of officers who are deployed on the weekend policing operation Custodian are located in the Deansgate Locks/Whitworth Street area due to the issues that the area attracts and in the early hours a significant number of the calls made to the police relate to the premises in this area and the locality in general.

All of the other venues in this vicinity finish trading at 4am on a weekend and by allowing these premises to remain open for another 2 ½ hours will almost certainly attract this unruly element to the premises and cause issues. The applicant has offered a last entry time of 0330 hrs and, whilst this will mean that only existing customers will be allowed in the premises after this time, the fact that they will obviously be open much later than the other premises will probably lead to issues on the door, with new customers coming from the other venues on the Locks and trying to gain entry. This will then see an increase in calls to service that GMP are already overstretched to deal with.

Between 14th March 2018 and 14th March 2019 there were 179 incidents of violence and 114 incidents of ASB recorded on Whitworth Street and a number of these were in the later hours of the early morning.

We therefore ask that this application is refused.

Representation

Outline your representation regarding the above application below. This representation should describe the likely effect of the grant of the licence/certificate on the licensing objectives and on the vicinity of the premises.

The Licensing and Out of Hours Team (LOOHT) have assessed the likely impact of the grant of this application to vary the Sex Establishment Licence and the **Premises Licence**, taking into account a numbers of factors, including the nature of the area the premises is located, the hours applied for, the Council's Sex Establishment Policy, the Council's Licensing Policy and any potential risk that the granting of this could lead to issues of public nuisance.

The premises is a sexual entertainment venue located on Whitworth Street West in the Deansgate Locks area of Manchester City Centre. The surrounding area is a mix of commercial properties including licensed premises and offices. There are a number of bars opposite the premises. The latest time the bars are open is 4:00 hours. There is a large mix of residential properties to the rear of the premises running along Little Peter Street.

Adjacent to the premises approximately 20m away is the entrance Deansgate train station which runs to all the North West stations including Manchester Airport. It is a main commuter station. Opposite the premises is Deansgate Castlefield Metrolink station which is the junction for all Metrolink lines across the network.

The applicant has applied to:-

- Extend the hours of licensable activities on Fridays, Saturdays to 6am, open to the public until 6.30am.
- Sundays preceding a Bank Holiday Monday and the morning following any UEFA Champions League played at either Old Trafford or Etihad until 6am.
- Make amendments to the Operating schedule.

As a result of this assessment we have concerns regarding the extension of the applicant's licensable hours to 6am (with a 6.30am close) and how this will impact on the day time economy and upholding the licensing objectives, Council's Sex Establishment Policy and Licensing Policy.

The first trains arrive to Deansgate at approximately 6:00hours, and trams to Deansgate Castlefield Metrolink. A significant number of commuters will be making their way into the city centre for work during the daytime economy. How intoxicated customers will be dispersed from the premises at this time, does not appear to have been thought out within the application.

The request to extend the premises opening hours is highly likely to have an impact on issues within the vicinity of the premises and is likely to lead to issues of public nuisance with noise and/or drunken behaviour from customers leaving the premises during the same time the public will be arriving or passing through the area on their daily commute or just visiting the City.

As the applicant has requested an extension of the hours for the morning until 6:00 hours following UEFA Champions League matches played at either Old Trafford or Etihad. Given the lateness of the proposed hours LOOHT have concerns that this will become the 'go to' premises for football fans wanting to stay out after other bars have closed.

The applicant has proposed a last entry time of 03:30 hours, the majority of the licensed premises on a weekday in the area close by this time, this therefore raises concerns. There is also potential for customers leaving the premises would be able to go directly to the airport via public transport having consumed alcohol until 6:00 hours with also a potential to cause public nuisance on dispersal.

The Manchester City Council's statement of Licensing Policy 2016-2021 stated that a number of risk factors should be taken into consideration when applying for and granting a licence application, specifically to:

- Paragraph 7.26 refers to consideration the Authority should make to prevention of nuisance such as noise disturbance from people entering and leaving the premises, prevention of disturbance by people outside the premises, litter from premises.
- Paragraph 7.28 in that the licensing authority will give consideration to the appropriateness of hours applied for, having regard for the location of premises and their likely effect of the promotion of the four Licensing Objectives
- Paragraph 7.31 states that the lateness of terminal hour for the premises will often be a contributory factor in the potential for disturbance.
- Paragraph 7.39 The night-time economy presents particular service needs in relation to street cleaning to ensure the streets are cleansed following the departure of night-time crowds, but ahead of the arrival of other users the following morning. Use of mechanised equipment, or even broom-sweeping, is often impractical when streets are busy with people and litter continues to be discarded.

As a result of our assessment we have concerns that the granting of this application is likely to lead to issues of public nuisance and the undermining of the Council's Licensing Policy.

When considering the request to extend the hours of licensable activities on Fridays, Saturdays to 6am, open to the public until 6.30am, we feel these hours will greatly impact on residents in the vicinity of the premise from noise by people leaving at the terminal hour and those permitted to temporarily leave to smoke. In addition to the residents we have also taken into account the effect on the day time economy when the public will be arriving or passing through, on a daily commute or visiting the City.

The hours also raise concerns over the ability of the Council to clean and maintain the street scene ahead of the arrival of the day time economy due to the change over time of the Council's contracted Street Cleansing Teams.

The Manchester City Council's statement of Licensing Policy 2016-2021 stated that a number of risk factors should be taken into consideration when applying for and granting a licence application, specifically paragraph 7.8

Paragraph 7.8 Relevant factors include:

- Physical design of the premises, including:

- physical hazards arising from type and placement of furniture

— lighting that facilitates deviance and increases anonymity

- insufficient and unclean toilets

- Activities at the premises, including entertainment

- Style of operation, particularly related to the likelihood of alcohol consumption

- The potential for pre-loading by customers

— Social mix of patrons

— Patron type (age, gender)

— Visible staffing of the local public realm, including policing, wardens, Street Angels etc

— The surrounding locality including:

- public CCTV coverage

— any pedestrian and vehicular pathways likely to be used by customers when leaving the premises late at night.

Given that football and Sexual Entertainment Venues are predominantly frequented by males, a number of these risk factors are met before any other considerations have taken place. Another risk factor to be taken into consideration for events where there is a drinking culture associated, such as football, is the fact that there is a high probability that patrons arriving at the premises will have already been drinking for an extended period of time.

A further concern is that the premises will become a 'go to' location for football fans wanting to continue their stay in the City. It is common amongst football fans to chant and more so when in large numbers. The concern of the LOOHT is that this would lead to an increase of noise disturbance in an area which contains residential properties with potential of undermining the public nuisance licensing objective. It is also worth pointing out that during the week the majority of premises in the area will be closed and therefore there will be less transient noise in the area. The applicant has offered a last entry time of 03:30 hours, however this does not mitigate our concerns about the large numbers of people who may attempt to gain entry but then subsequently loiter outside the premises once refused. From the applicant's proposals, there will be a three hour period between last entry and closing where the premises will appear to be open with staff and customers outside in the smoking area and this may encourage those refused entry to remain outside engaging in conversation directly below residential properties.

The exemption to the standard hours for UEFA Champions League matches means that the hours are extended during weekdays and the LOOHT have concerns that these events will have a greater impact on residents and the daytime economy. Given that patrons will have been consuming alcohol until 6:00 hours they are therefore more likely to cause a public nuisance on dispersal.

We therefore recommend that given the concerns raised above this application is refused.

In the event the application goes through to a hearing, I reserve the right to include additional information to support my application.
