Trading Standards	Trading Standards feel that the application is not detailed enough and the applicant has failed to demonstrate how the premises will promote the licensing objective the Protection of Children from Harm.
Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance	Officers are not satisfied that the conditions offered at present are sufficient to uphold the Prevention of Public Nuisance licensing objective.

Agreements between parties

Trading Standards:

- The Challenge 25 scheme must be operated to ensure that any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall provide documented proof that he/she is over 18 years of age. Proof of age shall only comprise a passport, photo card driving licence, an EU/EEA national ID card or similar document, an HM Forces warrant card, or a card bearing the PASS hologram.
- 2. In addition to any other training, the premises licence holder shall ensure all staff are trained to prevent underage sales, to be aware of and prevent proxy sales, to maintain the refusals log, enter sales correctly on the tills so the prompts show as appropriate and monitor staff to ensure their training is put into practice. Documented records of training completed shall be kept for each member of staff. Training shall be regularly refreshed and at no greater than 6 monthly intervals.
- 3. The premises shall display prominent signage indicating in all areas where alcohol is located that the Challenge 25 scheme is in operation indicating that it is an offence to buy, or attempt to buy, alcohol for a person under the age of 18 and for a person under the age of 18 to buy or attempt to buy alcohol

Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance:

- 1. No noise shall emanate from the premises that gives rise to a nuisance.
- 2. Where necessary, entry to and from the premises shall be controlled via a queuing system.
- 3. An incident log (which may be electronically recorded) shall be kept at the premises for at least six months, and made available on request to the police or an authorised officer of the licensing authority, which will record the following incidents including pertinent details:
 - (a) any complaints received
 - (b) any incidents of crime/disorder
 - (c) any faults in the CCTV system
 - (d) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- 4. The Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that a written notice of authority is kept at the premises for all staff who sell alcohol.
- 5. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.
- 6. The premises and immediate surrounding area shall be kept clean and free from litter at all times the premises are open to the public.
- 7. All staff shall be trained in:
 - a. Relevant age restrictions in respect of products
 - b. Recognising signs of drunkenness and vulnerability
 - c. How to refuse service

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- d. The premises' duty of care policy
- e. Action to be taken in the event of an emergency, including the preservation of a crime scene and reporting an incident to the emergency services
- f. The conditions in force under this licence
- 8. Documented records of training completed shall be kept for each member of staff. Training shall be regularly refreshed and at no greater than 6 monthly intervals. Training records shall be made available for inspection upon request by a police officer or an authorised officer of Manchester City Council
- 9. A refusals log must be kept at the premises which details all refusals to sell alcohol. This record must include the date and time of the incident, a description of the customer, the name of the staff member who refused the sale, and the reason the sale was refused.
- 10. The premises shall install and maintain a digital colour CCTV system covering all public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points. CCTV shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and the recording shall be kept available and unedited for a minimum of 28 days with the date and time stamping.
- 11. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present on the premises at all times when they are open to the public and must be able to produce / download / burn CCTV images upon request by a police officer or an authorised officer of the licensing authority. Any footage must be in a format so it can be played back on a standard personal computer or standard DVD player. Where the recording is on a removable medium (i.e. compact disc, flash card etc.), a secure storage system to store those recording mediums shall be provided.
- 12. All areas to which the public have legitimate access must be sufficiently illuminated for the purpose of CCTV.

1. <u>Introduction</u>

- 1.1 On 17/03/2020, an application for the grant of a Premises Licence under s17 of the Licensing Act 2003 was made in respect of Heaton Park Golf Course, Golf Pavillion, Heaton Park, Middleton Road, Manchester, M25 2SW in the Higher Blackley ward of Manchester. A location map and photograph of the premises is attached at **Appendix 1**.
- 1.2 A 28-day public consultation exercise was undertaken in accordance with Licensing Act 2003 regulations; requiring the application to be advertised by the displaying of a blue notice at or on the premises, a notice published in a newspaper or similar circulating in the local area, and details of the application published on the Council's website.
- 1.3 Representations may be made for or against an application during the consultation period. To be 'relevant' and, therefore, able to be taken into account in determining the application, they must be about the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives. Where representations are made by persons who are not a responsible authority, they must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 1.4 Relevant representations have been received in respect of this application and so it must be determined by a Licensing Hearing Panel in accordance with the Council's Constitution.

2. <u>The Application</u>

- 2.1 A copy of the application is attached at **Appendix 2**.
- 2.2 The applicant is Heaton Park Golf Ltd.
- 2.3 The description of the premises given by the applicant is: a Purpose built clubhouse.
- 2.4 The proposed designated premises supervisor is Julie Tatton.
- 2.5 The licensable activities applied for are as follows: Provision of regulated entertainment (recorded music indoors only) Mon to Sun 12 Noon to 11.30pm

The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises only: Mon to Sun 10am to 11.30pm Seasonal Variation- Park life weekend: sale of Alcohol to be both on and off the premises.

Opening hours:

Mon to Sun 6am to Midnight Seasonal Variations: November to March 8am to Midnight

- 2.5.1 In accordance with the Live Music Act 2012 and Deregulation Act 2015, performances of Live Music and Recorded Music between the hours of 0800 and 2300 hours have been deregulated and so should not be regarded as licensable activities for the purposes of this application.
- 2.5.2 Any further details provided relating to any of the individual licensable activities are specified on the application form at **Appendix 2**.

2.6 Activities unsuitable for children

2.6.1 The applicant has not highlighted any adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.

2.7 Steps to promote the licensing objectives

- 2.7.1 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by taking the steps identified in the operating schedule.
- 2.7.2 These steps must be translated into conditions by the licensing authority to be included in any granted premises licence, unless the conditions are modified by the Panel following consideration of relevant representations. These conditions are set out in the Schedule of Conditions at **Appendix 4**.

2.8 **Further documentation accompanying the application**

2.8.1 The applicant has not submitted any documents in support of their application

3. <u>Relevant Representations</u>

3.1 A total of 2 relevant representations were received in respect of the application (**Appendix 3**). The personal details of all members of the public have been redacted. Original copies of these representations will be available to the Panel at the hearing.

- 3.4 No Agreements on conditions have been reached between the objectors and the applicant

4. <u>Key Policies and Considerations</u>

4.1 Legal Considerations

4.1.1 Hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 operate under the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

4.2 **New Information**

4.2.1 In accordance with Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice either before the hearing or, with the consent of all parties, at the hearing.

4.3 Hearsay Evidence

4.3.1 The Panel may accept hearsay evidence and it will be a matter for the Panel to attach what weight to it that they consider appropriate. Hearsay evidence is evidence of something that a witness neither saw nor heard, but has heard or read about.

4.4 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003

- 4.4.1 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 is provided for all parties involved in licensing. It is a key medium for promoting best practice, ensuring consistent application of licensing powers across England and Wales and for promoting fairness, equal treatment and proportionality.
- 4.4.2 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. The Guidance is therefore binding on all licensing authorities to that extent. However, the Guidance cannot anticipate every possible scenario or set of circumstances that may arise and, as long as licensing authorities have properly understood this Guidance, they may depart from it if they have good reason to do so and can provide full reasons.

4.4.3 Departure from the Guidance could give rise to an appeal or judicial review, and the reasons given will then be a key consideration for the courts when considering the lawfulness and merits of any decision taken.

4.5 Manchester Statement of Licensing Policy

- 4.5.1 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' its statement of licensing policy.
- 4.5.2 The Licensing Policy sets out the vision the licensing authority has for the regulation of licensed premises throughout Manchester and outlines the standards expected in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives in the city. The Panel may depart from the policies should it consider doing so would benefit the promotion of the licensing objectives. Reasons are to be given for any such departure from the Policy.
- 4.5.3 Section 4 of the Policy (Operation of the Policy) sets out how the Licensing Policy is intended to be used in practice for licence applications and licensed premises.
- 4.5.4 Relevant to this application and the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following sections of the Policy:

Section 6: What we aim to encourage

This section identifies certain types of venues and initiatives the licensing authority aims to encourage in order to promote an inclusive evening and night-time economy not simply focused on the consumption of alcohol. We aim to encourage:

- Premises that will extend the diversity of entertainment and attract a wider range of participants
- Live music, especially original material, which will provide a range of live performances and styles of music, provided that such entertainment does not undermine the licensing objectives
- National cultural institutions, global sports events and cultural festivals
- Non-drink-led premises, including restaurants, cafes, theatres and cinemas
- Communication and integration with local residents and businesses through licensees consulting with those in the local area prior to an application
- Participation in Pubwatches, off licence forums and other crimereduction partnerships
- Engagement with the NITENET radio scheme and DISC secure information sharing platform by city centre venues through the Cityco Manchester Business Crime Reduction Partnership
- Designing out crime in the layout of the premises

Section 7: Local factors

This section sets out key issues that applicants are expected to take into account relevant to the individual characteristics of the premises when

preparing their operating schedule and address any local factors relevant to their premises.

Having regard to the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following Factors:

- Identified risk factors specific to the licensed premises
- Evidence of pre-existing problems in the area
- Consistency with relevant Council strategies

Section 8: Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives

This section identifies the standards that the licensing authority expects of licensed premises in Manchester. It is recognised that not all standards will be appropriate to apply in every situation to every premises, and applicants are not obliged to include all standards in their operating schedule. The degree to which standards would be appropriate is expected to be proportionate to the risk posed against the promotion of the licensing objectives having regard to the individual circumstances of the premises. The standards are not exhaustive and the licensing authority will have regard to any relevant issues raised in any representation that may fall outside them.

- MS1 Implement effective security measures at the premises
- MS2 Effective general management of the premises
- MS3 Responsible promotion and sale of alcohol
- MS4 Prevent the use of illegal drugs, new psychoactive substances (NPS) and the spiking of drinks at the premises
- MS6 Provide a Duty of Care for intoxicated or vulnerable customers and medical emergencies
- MS7 Maintain a safe capacity
- MS8 Prevent noise nuisance from the premises
- MS9 Effectively manage exterior spaces (e.g. beer gardens, smoking areas, table and chair areas on the highway)
- MS10 Operate effective cleansing arrangements, including ensuring the premises and surrounding area are kept clean and free of litter, and adequate arrangements for the secure and responsible storage of refuse
- MS11 Ensure the wellbeing of children on the premises
- MS12 Prevent underage sales of alcohol, including proxy sales

Section 12: Premises Licences for large-scale public events


This section sets out particular expectations regarding large scale public events, given the specific associated risks.

5. <u>Conclusion</u>

- 5.1 A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act ("licensing functions") with a view to promoting the licensing objectives:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - the protection of children from harm.

- 5.2 In considering the matter, the Panel should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representations made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be. In reaching the decision, regard must also be had to relevant provisions of the national guidance and the Council's licensing policy statement.
- 5.3 Having regard to the representations, the Panel must take such of the steps set out below that it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - a) To grant the licence subject to:
 - i. the conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, which the Panel may modify to such extent as they consider appropriate, and
 - ii. any mandatory conditions that must be included in the licence;
 - b) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - c) To refuse to specify the person proposed in the application as the designated premises supervisor;
 - d) To reject the application.
- 5.4 The conditions consistent with the operating schedule may be modified to alter or omit any of them or to add any new condition, including restricting the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.
- 5.5 All licensing determinations should be considered on the individual merits of the application.
- 5.6 The Panel's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 5.7 It is important that a licensing authority should give comprehensive reasons for its decisions in anticipation of any appeals. Failure to give adequate reasons could itself give rise to grounds for an appeal.



The Licensing and Out of Hours team will assess how the applicant intends to uphold the licensing objective the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

The application cannot be thoroughly assessed as the steps taken to promote the four licensing objectives have not been addressed correctly.

Under Section 8 of the Statement of Licensing Policy – Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives, applicants are required to set out in their operating schedule the steps they propose to take in operating the premises to promote the four licensing objectives:

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

Under Section 8.3 of the Statement of Licensing Policy it states applicants will be expected to consider and propose all standards they regard as appropriate to promote the licensing objectives with respect to the individual circumstances of their application.

The information contained in the application form does not demonstrate in enough detail how the Licensing Objectives will be upheld and appears to demonstrate a lack of understanding of the Licensing Objectives and therefore the Licensing and Out of Hours team are unable to accept the application.

- 1.2 A 28-day public consultation exercise was undertaken in accordance with Licensing Act 2003 regulations; requiring the application to be advertised by the displaying of a blue notice at or on the premises, a notice published in a newspaper or similar circulating in the local area, and details of the application published on the Council's website.
- 1.3 Representations may be made for or against an application during the consultation period. To be 'relevant' and, therefore, able to be taken into account in determining the application, they must be about the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives. Where representations are made by persons who are not a responsible authority, they must not be frivolous or vexatious.

4.2.1 In accordance with Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice either before the hearing or, with the consent of all parties, at the hearing.

4.3 Hearsay Evidence

4.3.1 The Panel may accept hearsay evidence and it will be a matter for the Panel to attach what weight to it that they consider appropriate. Hearsay evidence is evidence of something that a witness neither saw nor heard, but has heard or read about.

4.4 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003

4.4.1 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 is provided for all parties involved in licensing. It is a key medium for promoting best practice,

ensuring consistent application of licensing powers across England and Wales and for promoting fairness, equal treatment and proportionality.

- 4.4.2 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. The Guidance is therefore binding on all licensing authorities to that extent. However, the Guidance cannot anticipate every possible scenario or set of circumstances that may arise and, as long as licensing authorities have properly understood this Guidance, they may depart from it if they have good reason to do so and can provide full reasons.
- 4.4.3 Departure from the Guidance could give rise to an appeal or judicial review, and the reasons given will then be a key consideration for the courts when considering the lawfulness and merits of any decision taken.

4.5 Manchester Statement of Licensing Policy

- 4.5.1 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' its statement of licensing policy.
- 4.5.2 The Licensing Policy sets out the vision the licensing authority has for the regulation of licensed premises throughout Manchester and outlines the standards expected in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives in the city. The Panel may depart from the policies should it consider doing so would benefit the promotion of the licensing objectives. Reasons are to be given for any such departure from the Policy.
- 4.5.3 Section 4 of the Policy (Operation of the Policy) sets out how the Licensing Policy is intended to be used in practice for licence applications and licensed premises.
- 4.5.4 Relevant to this application and the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following sections of the Policy:

Section 6: What we aim to encourage

This section identifies certain types of venues and initiatives the licensing authority aims to encourage in order to promote an inclusive evening and night-time economy not simply focused on the consumption of alcohol. We aim to encourage:

- Premises that will extend the diversity of entertainment and attract a wider range of participants
- Live music, especially original material, which will provide a range of live performances and styles of music, provided that such entertainment does not undermine the licensing objectives
- National cultural institutions, global sports events and cultural festivals
- Non-drink-led premises, including restaurants, cafes, theatres and cinemas
- Communication and integration with local residents and businesses through licensees consulting with those in the local area prior to an application

- Participation in Pubwatches, off licence forums and other crimereduction partnerships
- Engagement with the NITENET radio scheme and DISC secure information sharing platform by city centre venues through the Cityco Manchester Business Crime Reduction Partnership
- Designing out crime in the layout of the premises

Section 7: Local factors

This section sets out key issues that applicants are expected to take into account relevant to the individual characteristics of the premises when preparing their operating schedule and address any local factors relevant to their premises.

Having regard to the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following Factors:

- Evidence of pre-existing problems in the area
- Consistency with relevant Council strategies
- The proximity of the premises to local residents and other local businesses, particularly in relation to the potential for nuisance
- Ability to clean and maintain the street scene

Section 8: Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives

This section identifies the standards that the licensing authority expects of licensed premises in Manchester. It is recognised that not all standards will be appropriate to apply in every situation to every premises, and applicants are not obliged to include all standards in their operating schedule. The degree to which standards would be appropriate is expected to be proportionate to the risk posed against the promotion of the licensing objectives having regard to the individual circumstances of the premises. The standards are not exhaustive and the licensing authority will have regard to any relevant issues raised in any representation that may fall outside them.

- MS2 Effective general management of the premises
- MS5 Prevent on-street consumption of alcohol
- MS10 Operate effective cleansing arrangements, including ensuring the premises and surrounding area are kept clean and free of litter, and adequate arrangements for the secure and responsible storage of refuse

Conclusion

- 4.5.5 A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act ("licensing functions") with a view to promoting the licensing objectives:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - the protection of children from harm.
- 4.5.6 In considering the matter, the Panel should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible

authorities or other persons, and representations made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be. In reaching the decision, regard must also be had to relevant provisions of the national guidance and the Council's licensing policy statement.

- 4.5.7 Having regard to the representations, the Panel must take such of the steps set out below that it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - a) To grant the licence subject to:
 - i. the conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, which the Panel may modify to such extent as they consider appropriate, and
 - ii. any mandatory conditions that must be included in the licence;
 - b) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - c) To refuse to specify the person proposed in the application as the designated premises supervisor;
 - d) To reject the application.
- 4.5.8 The conditions consistent with the operating schedule may be modified to alter or omit any of them or to add any new condition, including restricting the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.
- 4.5.9 All licensing determinations should be considered on the individual merits of the application.
- 4.5.10 The Panel's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 4.5.11 It is important that a licensing authority should give comprehensive reasons for its decisions in anticipation of any appeals. Failure to give adequate reasons could itself give rise to grounds for an appeal.
- 4.6 **The Panel is asked to determine the application**.

A CCTV system will be in operation at the premises and recorded images shall be retained for a period of 31 days. CCTV images will be provided to the police and other responsible authorities as soon as practicable and in any case within 48 hours of a request for such images, subject of the provisions of the DPA.

c) Public safety

A register of refusals of alcohol will be maintained at the premises. The register shall be examined on a regular basis by the duty manager/ DPS and the date and time of each examination will be endorsed in the register. The register will be made available for inspection by the Police and other.

The Licensing and Out of Hours Team have assessed the likely impact of the grant of this application taking into account a number of factors, including the nature of the area in which the premises is located and any potential risk the granting of this licence could lead to issues of public nuisance.

The location of the premises is on Mauldeth Road which is just outside of the main stress area for Withington, however is local to residents and other establishments which could give way to noise nuisance.

The premises wishes to open and serve alcohol from 0700-2300 Monday to Sunday. There are other local shops within feet of this premises, there is a concern that the objectives may not be met with the prevention of noise nuisance. Therefore the LOOH team agree the below conditions should be imposed on the licence.

The LOOH team propose the below conditions are to be upheld -

- 1. A documented incident log and refusals book shall be kept at the premises for at least 6 months, and made available on request to GMP or an authorised officer of the licensing authority.
- 2. Staff shall monitor customers smoking and gathering outside the premises on a regular basis and ensure patrons do not cause a public nuisance. A dispersal and policy will be implemented and adhered to.
- 3. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises that gives rise to a nuisance
- 4. The exterior of the building shall be cleared of litter at regular intervals.
- 5. Notices will be positioned at the exits to the buildings requesting customers to leave in a quiet manner
- 6. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital [colour] CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points, and the street environment will be covered, enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record while the premises are open to the public and recording shall be kept available and unedited for a minimum of [28] days with the date and time stamping.

I am writing on behalf of Fallowfield, Ladybarn & Withington Community Guardians to strongly object to a new off licence for the sale of alcohol Monday-Sunday between 7.00am - 11pm at 120 Mauldeth Road, Ladybarn. Although Ladybarn village does not fall within the Cumulative Impact area, there are very high numbers of students living in this mixed residential area and we believe that the reasons for the CIP being established are equally valid for Ladybarn which is so close by and should be brought into consideration when determining this application.

Residents from our CG group feel that the licensing objectives will be undermined if this application is granted. This convenience store is located amongst a small row of commercial retail units, two of which already sell alcohol for off sales. There have been so many issues with alcohol related anti social behaviour in this area in recent years which have caused much distress for local residents. Some long term elderly resident members of our groups live in very close proximity to this address. They daily litter pick the shop frontages in Ladybarn and alcohol litter forms a large proportion of the litter collected. In addition to this, residents are subjected to sports society events which are fuelled by alcohol and occur during the early evening. Please see example tweets which relate to incidents in the Ladybarn area.

As coordinator of the CG group I regularly get emails from distressed residents like this one from a Community Guardian who lives in Ladybarn. Problems that lead to crime and disorder and anti social behaviour require huge council funding to try and resolve these problems. **How can the addition of another off licence in an area with known problems, not undermine the licensing objectives?**

Hi Sue,

Had problem with next door students, they had a sports meet and greet starting at 7-30pm. About 50+ arrived and lads started to strip to waist and run round the garden urinating at the same time with much applause from the girls. My granddaughter was disgusted by this. The police broke up the party as many neighbours watched on. Speaking to poppy at 4pm tonight. After they went to Kingswood park and started to trash the park.

The location of a new off licence close to so many student Houses in Multiple Occupation is highly likely to add to increased on-street drinking and associated antisocial behaviour given the experiences and history of problems in this student dominated area. It is not a normal residential area because of the skewed population of young people that are located here during University term times. We also note that many University of Salford students now choose to live in Ladybarn because of easy access by train from Mauldeth Road Station to Salford Crescent. Another off licence in Ladybarn is likely to lead to an increase in public nuisance in terms of noise and litter and the possibility of increased crime and disorder. There is a large amount of evidence to suggest this from the history of problems leading to the implementation of the Cumulative Impact Policy for Fallowfield (2013). Despite the introduction of this policy, levels of anti social behaviour are still a problem due to the number of late night licensed premises that are open. Residents are regularly disturbed at night by loud singing, shouting, chanting and screaming. Other anti social behaviour related to alcohol consumption includes bin tipping, tree vandalism and glass smashing. This can happen during the daytime, evening or early hours but alcohol is a key factor. Early opening hours could also fuel house parties which sometimes go on through the night until mid morning the next day.

There are also a number of rough sleepers in Manchester. An extra off licence facility is likely to attract begging and alcohol dependent people to hang around the village especially as this off licence proposes to open from 7am. Some of these rough sleepers are very aggressive after consuming alcohol and further alcohol supply could also lead to an increase in crime and disorder.

Community Guardians wish to see a reduction in street drinking, noise and anti social behaviour. We feel that another off license premise would add to the significant existing problems and would undermine the Cumulative Impact Policy which exists nearby. Residents therefore request that this application for a new off licence is refused because once an off licence is added to an area it is very difficult and time consuming to prove the harm and get this decision changed.

SEFRG would like to write in support of the objection made by Sue Hare (Community Guardian Coordinator - Fallowfield, Ladybarn and Withington) to this application.

Members of our group are worried that the well documented problems we see in Fallowfield, which have lead to the destruction of a long established residential community, are also now affecting the Ladybarn area. More students are moving to Ladybarn from Salford University because the direct rail service from Mauldeth Road to Salford Crescent and the allure of Fallowfield and this is causing increased levels of anti social behaviour and mob rule. Another licenced premises on this very small strip will only add to these problems and cause more litter, fuel more house parties and create more noise, especially at night.

There is no real community gain to an additional off licence and the effect of another off licence will be damaging. As residents in neighbouring Fallowfield we can clearly see this pattern repeating itself and we know how difficult it is to roll back these licences after they have been granted. The damage has been done. Ladybarn district centre is very small and the effects of an extra off licence will mean that the balance of shops and what they offer to the local community, can soon be skewed towards a very high percentage of licensed premises.

We would like to point out that we are not against all licensed premises per se and we were in fact supportive of a recent planning application to expand a local licensed restaurant but our main concern is about preserving and creating a balanced, diverse and harmonious local community.

- 1.3 The licensing authority must hold a hearing to consider an application to review a premises licence and any relevant representations.

- 2.2 The applicant is Holly Raw on behalf of Trading Standards.
- 2.3 The application for a review was submitted on the grounds that the licence holder has failed to uphold the licensing objective of the protection of children from harm.
- 2.4 Further details of the grounds for the review are as follows: the Premises Licence Holder failed to promote the licensing objective of the prevention of children from harm on an occasion where an employee from the premises sold tobacco to a child under the age of eighteen.

5.1 No additional information has been received from any party to the application.

Key Policies and Considerations

6.1 Legal Considerations

6.1.1 Hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 operate under the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

6.2 **New Information**

6.2.1 In accordance with Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice either before the hearing or, with the consent of all parties, at the hearing.

6.3 Hearsay Evidence

6.3.1 The Panel may accept hearsay evidence and it will be a matter for the Panel to attach what weight to it that they consider appropriate. Hearsay evidence is evidence of something that a witness neither saw nor heard, but has heard or read about.

6.4 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003

- 6.4.1 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 is provided to licensing authorities in relation to the carrying out of their functions under the 2003 Act. It also provides information to magistrates' courts hearing appeals against licensing decisions and has been made widely available for the benefit of those who run licensed premises, their legal advisers and the general public. It is a key medium for promoting best practice, ensuring consistent application of licensing powers across England and Wales and for promoting fairness, equal treatment and proportionality.
- 6.4.2 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. The Guidance is therefore binding on all licensing authorities to that extent. However, the Guidance cannot anticipate every possible scenario or set of circumstances that may arise and, as long as licensing authorities have properly understood this Guidance, they may depart from it if they have good reason to do so and can provide full reasons.

6.4.3 Departure from the Guidance could give rise to an appeal or judicial review, and the reasons given will then be a key consideration for the courts when considering the lawfulness and merits of any decision taken.

6.5 Manchester Statement of Licensing Policy

- 6.5.1 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' its statement of licensing policy.
- 6.5.2 The Licensing Policy sets out the vision the licensing authority has for the regulation of licensed premises throughout Manchester and outlines the standards expected in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives in the city. The Panel may depart from the policies should it consider doing so would benefit the promotion of the licensing objectives. Reasons are to be given for any such departure from the Policy.
- 6.5.3 There are a number of references in the Policy to the licensing authority's expectations of applicants. The licensing authority will not apply the Policy rigidly, but will always have regard to the merits of the case with a view to promoting the licensing objectives.
- 6.5.4 Relevant to this application, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following sections of the Policy:

Section 6: What we aim to encourage

This section identifies certain types of venues and initiatives the licensing authority aims to encourage in order to promote an inclusive evening and night-time economy not simply focused on the consumption of alcohol. We aim to encourage:

- Premises that will extend the diversity of entertainment and attract a wider range of participants
- Live music, especially original material, which will provide a range of live performances and styles of music, provided that such entertainment does not undermine the licensing objectives
- National cultural institutions, global sports events and cultural festivals
- Non-drink-led premises, including restaurants, cafes, theatres and cinemas
- Communication and integration with local residents and businesses through licensees consulting with those in the local area prior to an application
- Participation in Pubwatches, off licence forums and other crimereduction partnerships
- Engagement with the NITENET radio scheme and DISC secure information sharing platform by city centre venues through the Cityco Manchester Business Crime Reduction Partnership
- Designing out crime in the layout of the premises

Section 8: Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives

This section identifies the standards that the licensing authority expects of licensed premises in Manchester. It is recognised that not all standards will be appropriate to apply in every situation to every premises. The degree to which standards would be appropriate is expected to be proportionate to the risk posed against the promotion of the licensing objectives having regard to the individual circumstances of the premises. The standards are not exhaustive and the licensing authority will have regard to any relevant issues raised in any representation that may fall outside them.

- MS2 Effective general management of the premises
- MS3 Responsible promotion and sale of alcohol
- MS12 Prevent underage sales of alcohol, including proxy sales

Conclusion

- 7.1 A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act ("licensing functions") with a view to promoting the licensing objectives:
 - a) the prevention of crime and disorder
 - b) public safety;
 - c) the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - d) the protection of children from harm.
- 7.2 In considering the matter, the Panel should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representations made by the licence holder. In reaching the decision, regard must also be had to relevant provisions of the national guidance and the Council's licensing policy statement.
- 7.3 The authority must take such of the steps below as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are
 - a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
 - b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - c) to remove the designated premises supervisor;
 - d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
 - e) to revoke the licence.
- 7.4 The conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.
- 7.5 All licensing determinations should be considered on the individual merits of the application.
- 7.6 The Panel's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.

- 7.7 It is important that a licensing authority should give comprehensive reasons for its decisions in anticipation of any appeals. Failure to give adequate reasons could itself give rise to grounds for an appeal.
- 7.8 The Panel is asked to take such steps, as set out in 7.3 above, as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

and he was not present. Futher, there was no alcohol license displayed in the shop. When I asked to see it, he said the owner keeps hold of it.

Two letters to invite the seller and the owner of the business to attend an interview were sent on 18th February 2020.

Checks was carried out on the two addresses given by the seller, but there were no records for him linking to those adresses.

Due to no response from the two previous letters, two further letters were sent recorded delivery to both the owner, at the business premises and the seller at his home address () on 27th February 2020. The letter to the owner at the business premises was signed for, by The letter to the seller stated 'no information available'.

Due to no response from the letters, I sent two further letters recorded delivery to the seller at both the addresses given by him (

sent a letter to the owner on 11th March 2020 to the business premises.

On 16th March 2020, I received a phone call from the resident of one of the addresses given by the seller (**Sector**) who stated that there is nobody of that name at that address which leads me to belive it was false details given by the seller. Further, she stated her sister lives at the **Sector** address has also been receiving the letters which she said has no links to the addressee.

The letter to the owner at the business premises was signed for by **Example** and the letters to the seller was signed for by **Example** and the other there was no information available.

On 16th March 2020 I visited the premises and was met by a man called

He told me he was not the owner and gave the name **Here and** and provided an address and a telephone number. I hand delivered two letters, one for the seller and one for the owner. He told me he would pass them on. Again, no licence was displayed.

I rang the number given and also the telephone number on the licence for Mr Abdul Rehman and have never been able to speak with anyone or any of my calls or letters being acknowledged.

I sent a final letter on 22nd April 2020 to Mr Rehman at both his home address, given on the licence and the business premises to request contact but I have not had any reply.

Our proposed course of action was to hold an Action Plan meeting with Mr Abdul Rehman in his capacity as PLH and DPS.The purpose of the meeting; to discuss issues arising from the sale of tobacco to a person underage from the premises and get details of who is running the business and details of the workers .Every effort was made by ourselves to contact the owner, seller and DPS/PLH. Therefore the PLH and DPS has failed to work with us to address the problem of the supply of tobacco to a minor from the premises and the failure to promote the Licensing objectives the Protection of Children from Harm we would ask for the revocation of the Premises Licence.

We are concerned the business owner, DPS and PLH have no control over the business and there is an absence of any duty of care and disregard for promoting any of the licensing objectives.

Please accept this as formal notification of the Greater Manchester Police support of the decision by Manchester City Council Trading Standards to apply for a Review of the Premises Licence of Abduls. GMP are firmly of the opinion that these premises are undermining the Licensing Objectives of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

On Tuesday 19th May 2020 I attended at Abduls off licence, 240 Lightbowne Road, Manchester, in company with

Devon Bennett from the Manchester City Council Licensing & Out of Hours Team, in order to carry out a

licensing inspection.

We spoke to the member of staff who was in charge and began to go through the conditions on the Premises

Licence, several of which were being breached.

My attention was then drawn to a number of packets of cigarettes which were on the counter near to the till and had writing on them which was of a foreign origin and none of the packets were displaying the requisite warning pictures and none of them were in the plain green packaging as is required by law. It was apparent that no duty would have been paid on these cigarettes or that they were counterfeit and therefore I seized them as evidence. In total I seized 10 x Sealed Packets of 20 and 1 x Open Packet of 16 which I then handed to Mr Bennett.

GMP fully support the decision to bring the premises to a review and we also agree with our colleagues from the Manchester City Council Trading Standards that their premises licence should be revoked as they clearly have no regard whatsoever for upholding the Licensing Objectives.

The Licensing and Out of Hours Team received a complaint from Trading Standards that the premises known as Abduls Off-licence, 240 Lightbowne Road had recently failed a test purchase of tobacco to an underage person. The complaint also involved that the Designated Premises Supervisor was not contactable to address the offences committed and the concerns of tobacco being sold to underage persons.

Due to the concerns raised by Trading Standards I conducted a joint visit with PC Alan Isherwood from Greater Manchester Police Licensing Unit. On the 19th May 2020. Myself and PC Isherwood arrived at 240 Lightbowne Road. On arrival myself and PC Isherwood entered the premises where a female was behind the counter. Myself and PC Isherwood showed our Identification and advised we were from Manchester City Council and Greater Manchester Police Licensing. We advised we were visiting to conduct enquiries into who was operating the business at present and to conduct a check on the licensing conditions.

During the visit PC Isherwood spoke with Mr Arslan Asif on the phone Mr Asif stated he was the operator of the premises, he was informed of our visit. I spoke with the shop assistant to check compliance with the conditions on the licence. I noticed a cigarette packet on the till in non-standardised packaging. I asked about the cigarettes and was told by the shop assistant "they are the Russian ones". I asked if there were more. The shop assistant showed me a plastic bag which contained a further ten sealed packets. All in nonstandardised packaging. PC Isherwood seized the cigarettes to be inspected later by Trading Standards Officers.

Myself and PC Isherwood went through the conditions on the licence and found the majority of conditions were not being complied with.

- Annex 2 Condition 1 - An effective and adequate CCTV system equipped with a recording facility shall be installed, maintained and operated at the premises. Recorded images shall be retained for 28 days and shall be available to the Authorities upon request.

- Annex 2 Condition 3- Posters shall be displayed notifying customers of the "Challenge 21 Policy".

- Annex 2 Condition 5 - The premises shall operate a refusals/incident log in relation to the sale of alcohol. The log shall include date/time and details of the incident and the staff member dealing with it. The log shall be inspected by the DPS/Licence Holder on a weekly basis and signed as being checked.

- Annex 2 Condition 6 - All staff shall be trained before making sales of alcohol. This training shall include the "Challenge 21 Policy", identifying and preventing underage sales, proxy sales, sales to drunks and shall include the age verification policy. All training shall be logged and repeated every 3 months. The log shall be made available to authorities upon request.

- Annex 3 Condition 3 - A prominent, clear and legible notice shall be displayed at the exit to the premises asking customers to respect local residents and leave the area quietly.

During the visit it was also identified that the premises was not displaying the summary licence. No licence could be produced when asked. There was also no contact for the Designated Premises Supervisor/ Premises Licence Holder.

I wrote to the Licensing Holder explaining the breaches and warned him that it was an offence to carry out licensable activity otherwise in accordance with his licence. As of 16th June 2020 I have received no response from the licence holder and the new operator has removed all alcohol from the premises.

This illegal activity of sales of tobacco to children, sales of illicit tobacco, operating with no Designated Premises Supervisor in day to day control whilst breaching conditions on the premises licence shows complete distain for the Licensing Objectives but most importantly the safety of the public who frequent the premises

We would like to make our position clear in support of the application lodged by Trading Standards that the premises has its licence revoked. Recommendation: Revocation of Premises Licence
