Greater Manchester Police	The applicant has offered some conditions within the application but GMP would expect more robust conditions to have been offered to ensure that the following Licensing Objectives are upheld: public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the prevention of crime and disorder.				
Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance	There are a number of residential properties near to the premises and LOOH has concerns that noise emanating from the premises could lead to issues of public nuisance. Further measures could be implemented in respect of the control of noise from the premises, and a number of additional conditions have therefore been proposed.

Agreements between parties

Greater Manchester Police:

- 1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points. The CCTV cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recording shall be kept available and unedited for a minimum of 28 days with the date and time stamping. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present on the premises at all times when they are open to the public and must be able to produce / download / burn CCTV images upon request by a police officer or an authorised officer of the licensing authority. Any footage must be in a format so it can be played back on a standard personal computer or standard DVD player. Where the recording is on a removable medium (i.e. compact disc, flash card etc.), a secure storage system to store those recording mediums shall be provided.
- 2. An incident log (which may be electronically recorded) shall be kept at the premises for at least six months, and made available on request to the Police or an authorised officer of the licensing authority, which will record the following incidents including pertinent details:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue, or by the venue to the Police
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any incidents of disorder
 - (d) any faults in the CCTV system
 - (e) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
 - (f) All refusals of sales of alcohol
- 3. The Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that a written notice of authority is kept at the premises for all staff who sell alcohol. The notice shall be made available for inspection upon request of the police or an authorised officer of the licensing authority and all staff selling alcohol must be in possession of identification to enable to verify their identity against the notice.
- 4. The premises shall display prominent signage indicating at any point of sale, the entrance to the premises and in all areas where alcohol is located that it is an offence to buy, or attempt to buy, alcohol for a person under the age of 18.
- 5. In addition to any other training, the premises licence holder shall ensure all staff are trained to prevent underage sales, to be aware of and prevent proxy sales, to maintain the refusals log and monitor staff to ensure their training is put into practice. Documented records of training completed shall be kept for each member of staff. Training shall be regularly refreshed and at no greater than 6 monthly intervals.

Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance:

- 1. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises that gives rise to a nuisance.
- 2. Staff shall monitor customers smoking outside the premises on a regular basis and ensure patrons do not cause a public nuisance.

1. <u>Introduction</u>

- 1.1 On 15/04/2020, an application for the grant of a Premises Licence under s17 of the Licensing Act 2003 was made in respect of Pepe's Piri Piri, 430-432 Wilmslow Road, Manchester, M20 3BW in the Old Moat ward of Manchester. A location map and photograph of the premises is attached at **Appendix 1**.
- 1.2 A 28-day public consultation exercise was undertaken in accordance with Licensing Act 2003 regulations; requiring the application to be advertised by the displaying of a blue notice at or on the premises, a notice published in a newspaper or similar circulating in the local area, and details of the application published on the Council's website.
- 1.3 Representations may be made for or against an application during the consultation period. To be 'relevant' and, therefore, able to be taken into account in determining the application, they must be about the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives. Where representations are made by persons who are not a responsible authority, they must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 1.4 Relevant representations have been received in respect of this application and so it must be determined by a Licensing Hearing Panel in accordance with the Council's Constitution.

2. The Application

- 2.1 A copy of the application is attached at **Appendix 2.**
- 2.2 The applicant is Mr Santhosh Kodari.
- 2.3 The description of the premises given by the applicant is: 'Fast food restaurant and takeaway serving grilled chicken items'
- 2.4 The licensable activities applied for:

The provision of Late Night Refreshment:

Mon to Sun: 11pm to 5am

Opening hours:

Mon to Sun: 11am to 5am

- 2.4.1 In accordance with the Live Music Act 2012 and Deregulation Act 2015, performances of Live Music and Recorded Music between the hours of 0800 and 2300 hours have been deregulated and so should not be regarded as licensable activities for the purposes of this application.
- 2.4.2 Any further details provided relating to any of the individual licensable activities are specified on the application form at **Appendix 2**.
- 2.5 Activities unsuitable for children

2.5.1 The applicant has not highlighted any adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.

2.6 Steps to promote the licensing objectives

- 2.6.1 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by taking the steps identified in the operating schedule.
- 2.6.2 These steps must be translated into conditions by the licensing authority to be included in any granted premises licence, unless the conditions are modified by the Panel following consideration of relevant representations. These conditions are set out in the Schedule of Conditions at **Appendix 4**.

3. Relevant Representations

A total of 8 relevant representations were received in respect of the application (**Appendix 3**). The personal details of all members of the public have been redacted. Original copies of these representations will be available to the Panel at the hearing.

3.2 Summary of the representations:

Party	Grounds of representation	Recommends
GMP	The premises is located within a 'Special Policy Area' (known locally as the 'Withington Stress Area') and Greater Manchester Police are submitting a representation against the application as they believe that, if the application were to be granted, the Licensing Objectives relating to the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and the Prevention of Public Nuisance would be undermined. GMP are concerned that the applicant is seeking to provide Late Night Refreshment, 7 days a week, to 5.00am (which would be to a considerably later time than any other premises operating within the Special Policy area). Due to the well documented problems that have affected the local area for a number of years (littering, begging, on-street drinking, noise	Refuse

	disturbance & general antisocial behaviour) GMP believe that allowing a premises to operate to the hours applied for would add substantially to the pre-existing issues affecting the local area and its residents. Furthermore, as the applicant has not sufficiently demonstrated, via his application, how his operations would not add further to the cumulative impact within the Special Policy area (and with there being a general presumption against new applications for Hot Food takeaways within the locality) GMP are requesting that the application be refused.	
Licensing and Out of Hours Compliance	As with GMP, LOOH Compliance are objecting to the application on the basis of there being a substantial risk to the full and correct upholding of the Licensing Objectives (particularly in regard to a licensed premises operating within a 'Special Policy Zone') should the application be granted. LOOH Compliance are concerned that the applicant has demonstrated a noticeable lack of knowledge and understanding regarding his responsibilities under the Licensing Act, and how he should correctly operate a premises within a Special Policy Zone. It is for these reasons that LOOH compliance are recommending that the application be refused.	Refuse
Old Moat Ward Councillors	The Local Ward Councillors have objected to the application as it is believed that the applied for closing time of 5.00am would impact adversely upon the Licensing Objectives, with particular reference to public nuisance, noise disturbance and littering. Following further conversations with the Local Ward Councillors it has been determined that granting of the application would be acceptable providing a reduction in the premises closing times and conditions relating to the prevention of noise breakout/disturbance from the premises and the external maintenance of the premises in regard to the collection of litter were imposed upon any granted premises licence at hearing.	Grant with conditions and amendments to premises operating hours/times
Fallowfield Community Guardians	Fallowfield Community Guardians are objecting to the application for the same reasons as GMP and LOOH Compliance: that the granting of the application will lead to an undermining of the Licensing Objectives within the Special Policy Area and will, in the opinion of the	Refuse

	Residents Association, only serve to add further to the well recorded and on-going antisocial behaviour/public nuisance issues which affect the locality. Fallowfield Community Guardians are requesting that the policy of refusing applications for premises offering Late Night Refreshment within the Special Policy Area be upheld in regard to the application as it is felt that the addition of another Late Night Refreshment takeaway to the local area would only prove to be detrimental. Consequently so Fallowfield Community Guardians are requesting that the application be refused.	
South East Fallowfield Residents Group	The representation submitted against the application by South East Fallowfield Residents Group follows the same line as those representations recorded above that have also requested the refusal of the application for the reasons as already described. SEFRG see no merit in the application and are of the opinion that, should the application be granted, there will be a noticeable, and unacceptable, increase in the already recorded high levels of antisocial behaviour and public nuisance incidents that occur within the Special Policy Area. Consequently so SEFRG are requesting that the application be rejected in its entirety.	Refuse
Residents (x3)	The private residents who have submitted representations against the application are, collectively, of the opinion that the granting of the application will only serve to increase the (existing and on-going) high levels of antisocial behaviour and public nuisance issues that affect those residing within the immediate vicinity and general locality of the main high street zone that runs through the Withington Special Policy Area. 4. Key Policies and Considerations

4.1 **Legal Considerations**

4.1.1 Hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 operate under the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

4.2 **New Information**

4.2.1 In accordance with Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings)
Regulations 2005, the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice either before the hearing or, with the consent of all parties, at the hearing.

4.3 **Hearsay Evidence**

4.3.1 The Panel may accept hearsay evidence and it will be a matter for the Panel to attach what weight to it that they consider appropriate. Hearsay evidence is evidence of something that a witness neither saw nor heard, but has heard or read about

4.4 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003

- 4.4.1 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 is provided for all parties involved in licensing. It is a key medium for promoting best practice, ensuring consistent application of licensing powers across England and Wales and for promoting fairness, equal treatment and proportionality.
- 4.4.2 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. The Guidance is therefore binding on all licensing authorities to that extent. However, the Guidance cannot anticipate every possible scenario or set of circumstances that may arise and, as long as licensing authorities have properly understood this Guidance, they may depart from it if they have good reason to do so and can provide full reasons.
- 4.4.3 Departure from the Guidance could give rise to an appeal or judicial review, and the reasons given will then be a key consideration for the courts when considering the lawfulness and merits of any decision taken.

4.5 Manchester Statement of Licensing Policy

- 4.5.1 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' its statement of licensing policy.
- 4.5.2 The Licensing Policy sets out the vision the licensing authority has for the regulation of licensed premises throughout Manchester and outlines the standards expected in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives in the city. The Panel may depart from the policies should it consider doing so would benefit the promotion of the licensing objectives. Reasons are to be given for any such departure from the Policy.
- 4.5.3 Section 4 of the Policy (Operation of the Policy) sets out how the Licensing Policy is intended to be used in practice for licence applications and licensed premises.
- 4.5.4 Relevant to this application and the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following sections of the Policy:

Section 5: Special Policy Area

The premises is located within the following special policy area: Withington Stress Area

The effect of the Special Policy is to set out a range of specific approaches according to the nature of the premises to be licensed. With respect to this application, the Policy proposes the following approach:

	Closing time	Approach
Hot food	All	Strong presumption against.
Takeaway premises		A genuinely exceptional case would need to be shown. The reasons for the exception should be shown in the operating schedule, and must demonstrate that there will be no harm to the licensing objectives, including from departing customers.

The policy also sets out particular measures it expects operators to pay special attention to in order to ensure their operation will not add to the problems within this area. Operators are not required to do so, but where the authority's discretion is engaged, any applications that fail to address all appropriate measures may be refused or have conditions applied to comply with the policy measures.

Section 6: What we aim to encourage

This section identifies certain types of venues and initiatives the licensing authority aims to encourage in order to promote an inclusive evening and night-time economy not simply focused on the consumption of alcohol. We aim to encourage:

- Premises that will extend the diversity of entertainment and attract a wider range of participants
- Live music, especially original material, which will provide a range of live performances and styles of music, provided that such entertainment does not undermine the licensing objectives
- National cultural institutions, global sports events and cultural festivals
- Non-drink-led premises, including restaurants, cafes, theatres and cinemas
- Communication and integration with local residents and businesses through licensees consulting with those in the local area prior to an application
- Participation in Pubwatches, off licence forums and other crimereduction partnerships
- Engagement with the NITENET radio scheme and DISC secure information sharing platform by city centre venues through the Cityco Manchester Business Crime Reduction Partnership
- Designing out crime in the layout of the premises

Section 7: Local factors

This section sets out key issues that applicants are expected to take into account relevant to the individual characteristics of the premises when preparing their operating schedule and address any local factors relevant to their premises.

Having regard to the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following Factors:

- Evidence of pre-existing problems in the area
- Proximity of takeaways and off-licences to nightlife entertainment areas
- Consistency with relevant Council strategies
- The proximity of the premises to local residents and other local businesses, particularly in relation to the potential for nuisance
- Ability to clean and maintain the street scene

Section 8: Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives

This section identifies the standards that the licensing authority expects of licensed premises in Manchester. It is recognised that not all standards will be appropriate to apply in every situation to every premises, and applicants are not obliged to include all standards in their operating schedule. The degree to which standards would be appropriate is expected to be proportionate to the risk posed against the promotion of the licensing objectives having regard to the individual circumstances of the premises. The standards are not exhaustive and the licensing authority will have regard to any relevant issues raised in any representation that may fall outside them.

- MS2 Effective general management of the premises
- MS6 Provide a Duty of Care for intoxicated or vulnerable customers and medical emergencies
- MS8 Prevent noise nuisance from the premises
- MS10 Operate effective cleansing arrangements, including ensuring the premises and surrounding area are kept clean and free of litter, and adequate arrangements for the secure and responsible storage of refuse
- MS11 Ensure the wellbeing of children on the premises

5. Conclusion

- A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act ("licensing functions") with a view to promoting the licensing objectives:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - the protection of children from harm.
- In considering the matter, the Panel should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representations made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be. In reaching the decision, regard must also

- be had to relevant provisions of the national guidance and the Council's licensing policy statement.
- 5.3 Having regard to the representations, the Panel must take such of the steps set out below that it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - a) To grant the licence subject to:
 - i. the conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, which the Panel may modify to such extent as they consider appropriate, and
 - ii. any mandatory conditions that must be included in the licence:
 - b) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - c) To refuse to specify the person proposed in the application as the designated premises supervisor;
 - d) To reject the application.
- 5.4 The conditions consistent with the operating schedule may be modified to alter or omit any of them or to add any new condition, including restricting the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.
- 5.5 All licensing determinations should be considered on the individual merits of the application.
- The Panel's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 5.7 It is important that a licensing authority should give comprehensive reasons for its decisions in anticipation of any appeals. Failure to give adequate reasons could itself give rise to grounds for an appeal.
- 5.8 The Panel is asked to determine the application.

Please accept this as formal notification of the Greater Manchester Police objection to the hours requested for a variation to the premises licence in relation to the above premises.

The grounds for the objection are the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

The premises are situated on Wilmslow Road, Withington, which is one of the main arterial routes into and out of Manchester City centre.

It is in very close proximity to residential properties and is also in an area where there are a large number of bars, public houses, off licenses, late night refreshment outlets and one of the largest student populations in Europe.

Specifically the application is seeking to allow late night refreshment and until 0500hrs 7 days a week.

This will undoubtedly create noise disturbance and anti-social behaviour for a longer period, which will obviously add to what is already being suffered by the local residents.

The Wilmslow Road corridor already suffers from begging, street drinking and other anti-social behaviour and to allow the premises to extend their hours each night is likely to exacerbate these problems and undermine the hard work of the local Neighbourhood Policing Team.

The littering, damage and anti-social behaviour caused by late night revelers is something which the local residents have had to endure for far too long and their quality of life needs to be made the priority in all licence applications in this area.

The area where the premises are situated is subject to a Stress Policy, which was introduced at the end of January 2013, due to the problems in the area with night time economy related incidents.

There is therefore a strong presumption against all Hot Food takeaway applications in this area and GMP can see no reason to depart from this policy in this instance. The applicant has not demonstrated how they will not add to the cumulative impact within the area.

A genuinely exceptional case would need to be shown. The reasons for the exception should be shown in the operating schedule, and must demonstrate that there will be no harm to the licensing objectives, including from departing customers, which has not been demonstrated in this case.		
Greater Manchester Police would therefore ask that the application be refused.

Licensing and out of hours team have assessed the likely impact of the grant of this licence taking into account a numbers of factors, including the nature of the area in which the premises is located, the hours applied for and any potential risk that the granting of this licence could lead to issues of public nuisance.

The applicant is requesting Late night refreshment licence, till 5am every day of the week.

The premise is located in thriving community in the Old Moat ward and is situated on a main arterial route in and out of Manchester and one of the busiest bus routes in the UK. The area has a mixture of tenures and it has a very large student population.

The premises is situated in the middle of a row of commercial premises, which includes takeaways, restaurants and alcohol led venues. There are residential properties within approximately 50 metres from the premises. Premises is 10 ft away from 2 other late night premises

It would be useful to mention that the premises is situated in a special policy area, known locally as the Withington Stress Area (WSA) (attached- Appendix 8 of WSA). This is highlighted in Section 5 of the licensing policy, which has restrictions in place for all new and variations to premises licences. This is due to the historical evidence that crime and disorder and public nuisance within this concentration area has warranted this policy.



Section 5.20 states that there is a strong presumption against All Hot Food Takeaways and only a genuinely exceptional case would need to be shown. This is reiterated in section 5.28, Departure from the policy is expected only in exceptional circumstances.

The applicant has put forward some steps but not enough to uphold the licensing objectives. They have failed to elaborate on appropriate measures, set out in section 5.25 that are expected of operators within the WSA. This suggests that the operator will not be able to uphold the licensing objectives, thus cannot determine if the operation will add to the problems within the area.

Furthermore, the operating schedule offers no consideration to section 8 of the licensing policy for how the applicant will promote the Licensing Objectives, and how the applicant will disperse the possible congregation of groups and anti-social behaviour that is linked to patrons in the early hours of the morning on Wilmslow Road.

Taking into consideration the above, the applicant has not shown any regards to section 5.30 of the licensing policy and consequently does not have a full understanding of their responsibilities under the Licensing Act. The applicant has failed to produce sufficient evidence to suggest they will be able to uphold the licensing objectives, within the Withington stress area.

To conclude our assessment, the applicants lack of consideration to the WSA and the weak operating schedule, will only undermine the policy.

We therefore recommend that the licence for Late Night Refreshment is refused.

I am writing on behalf of SEFRG (South East Fallowfield Residents' Group) and would like to object in the strongest terms to the above new licence application.

Withington Village is in a special Stress Zone which means that there should be a strong presumption against the granting of new licences (or licence variations). This is a complete reversal of the standard licensing rules which are generally permissive. The reason this special policy was introduced was because this part of Wilmslow Road (running through Withington village) has levels of recorded incidents of antisocial and criminal behaviour which are as a result of the number of licenced premises, the problems that emanate from them and the effect this has on the residential neighbourhood.

The Withington Stress Zone is immediately adjacent to the Cumulative Impact Policy area in Fallowfield and these are the only two areas in the whole of Greater Manchester to have special policies to deal with these issues. Their very existence therefore illustrates just how serious these problems are and how strictly they should be observed. There are many more licensed premises (and more recorded incidents) in Fallowfield and hence the need for a CIP, however the stress area in Withington is a recognition that unless the brakes are applied now, Withington will very sadly follow in Fallowfield's footsteps as more licenced premises move into the next nearest place.

This particular application is for opening hours to be extended from 11pm to 5am, 7 days a week

Relating this to the licensing objectives, the major areas where we anticipate problems are as follows:

This application is obviously an attempt to gain custom from the the pubs and clubs nearby after closing time. Customers leaving these venues often do so in large, rowdy and drunken groups and having another late night place to get a bite to eat after normal hours will mean that they will be hanging around in the village longer than they would otherwise have done so. A very late night eating place also often attracts people from further afield. This increased very late night activity will mean that there will be more noise both in the village and on the surrounding streets as people return home. Withington is still home to a significant number of families but there are also a lot of student houses, so big groups of students returning home from a night out are very likely to wake residents up on their way. This already happens and another late night option will simply add to the problems - it is the cumulative effect. Being woken up by sudden bursts of noise, often several times a night, is not only extremely annoying but it is also dangerous to residents' health and mental

wellbeing. Increasingly it is reported that regular loss of sleep can cause physical illnesses for example; heart problems, cancer and obesity and it is also disruptive to work and children's schooling. To those who haven't experienced this level of sleep deprivation, I realise it can be hard to imagine what it's like - it isn't just the odd night, or the odd week (I think we could, and indeed should, all put up with odd disturbance) but it is the ongoing nature of the problem.

In addition to the noise nuisance there are the obvious litter problems that come with takeaways. Most customers will eat their food on their way home and local people often wake up to takeaway remnants on the streets, on their car windscreens, in their hedges and in their gardens. More takeaways and longer opening hours lead to even more of these problems.

No proprietor can follow all his customers home making sure they are quiet and take their litter with them. Late night pub and club goers are even more likely to cause a nuisance than they would during the day because drunk people are generally not too fastidious about their noise levels, or where they put their rubbish!

It is very sad that children growing up in Fallowfield and Withington are accustomed to these extreme levels of litter and that dropping litter has become such normalised behaviour.

Finally, reported incidents show that there is a spike in ASB and Criminal activity after 11pm and into the early hours as people become more drunk and skirmishes break out between different gangs or groups. If these groups leave the area straight after the pubs and clubs have closed they are less likely to clash with each other. This part of Wilmslow Road is particularly narrow and there are several venues attracting large numbers of people, all within spitting distance of each other; and there have been recent (and very serious) incidents of this nature very close to these premises.

Conclusion

Over a number of years, many residents have felt compelled to move away from Fallowfield and Withington - Withington has been less affected by this migration than Fallowfield but it is still a significant problem. When our neighbours move away that they often decide to escape the city altogether because they are so worn down by the noise, litter, crime and ASB and they feel powerless to solve the problems. To escape the whole city seems the most certain way of avoiding these issues in future. This is a great loss, not just to our own community, but to our city. We need these people to stay here and we are sure that controlling licensing in a sensible and measured way could have an enormous effect on restoring our communities.

We believe that the Stress policy was introduced for a very good reason, it has been regularly reviewed and is still found to be necessary. There are no conditions to this licence that could be brought in to justify departing from it and any extension in hours beyond 11pm would be undermining the policy. We urge you to reject it in full.

I am writing on behalf of Community Guardian residents in SE Fallowfield and Withington. We are writing to object to the new license application for a 5am license at 430-432 Wilmslow Road.

Withington Stress Licensing Policy

Withington village is covered by a special stress zone licensing policy because of concerns by residents about the excessive problems of antisocial behaviour further up Wilmslow Road in Fallowfield which have arisen due to a large number of pubs, bars, off licenses and takeaways with late licenses. There is concern that now Fallowfield is 'full', alcohol and take away outlets would move further south to nearby Withington causing similar problems to arise there.

Withington already has a number of licensed premises which do cause noise and disturbances. None however have a license until 5am. Residents do not wish to see any additional premises open during the early hours due to associated noise and nuisances that occur

Preventing Public Nuisance & Crime & Disorder

Fallowfield and Withington both have a very high density of students, thousands of young people are concentrated in and around our area and this is a factor which contributes significantly to night time noise for residents. Many young people enjoy the night economy and licensed premises open during the early hours act as a magnet for groups. The provision of late night food adds to this sort of nuisance.

There are often groups of people on the narrow pavements outside the premises that are open. There have also been serious late night assaults in Withington village including an attack on a Manchester University medical student at Khans take away which left him hospitalised in a critical condition. The stress policy has been reviewed and the policy is still in place. Residents feel that another late night take away will undermine the licensing objectives for public safety, public nuisance and could lead to an increase crime and disorder. Littering is likely to increase and this is currently a major concern to Withington residents. There are no measures suggested by the applicant to deal with litter.

Adding another licensed premise with a 5am opening would be very likely to increase the cumulative stress of noise and nuisance in the Withington area. We would ask you to refuse this license and take note of the special license policy that exists for Withington to protect the village. We are keen to make sure that Withington does not turn into a village of bars and take aways and thus create the problems that are so well documented in Fallowfield. We feel that the licensing objectives would be compromised if this take away were to extend opening hours into the early hours and we see no reason to depart from the policy which is to refuse all new late night takeway licences..
