1 <u>Introduction</u>

- 1.1 On 10/11/2022, an application for the grant of a Premises Licence under s17 of the Licensing Act 2003 was made in respect of Ya koyo, 55 Kenyon Lane, Manchester, M40 9JG in the Moston ward of Manchester.
- 1.2 A location map and photograph of the premises is attached at **Appendix 1**.
- 1.3 A 28-day public consultation exercise was undertaken in accordance with Licensing Act 2003 regulations; requiring the application to be advertised by the displaying of a blue notice at or on the premises, a notice published in a newspaper or similar circulating in the local area, and details of the application published on the Council's website.
- 1.4 Representations may be made for or against an application during the consultation period. To be 'relevant' and, therefore, able to be taken into account in determining the application, they must be about the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives. Where representations are made by persons who are not a responsible authority, they must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 1.5 Relevant representations have been received in respect of this application and so it must be determined by a Licensing Hearing Panel in accordance with the Council's Constitution.

2 The Application

- 2.1 A copy of the application is attached at **Appendix 2.**
- 2.2 The applicant is Patience Ukonga.
- 2.3 The description of the premises given by the applicant is: Restaurant with approximately 20 Covers.
- 2.4 The proposed designated premises supervisor is Simbiat Matesun
- 2.5 The licensable activities applied for are as below:

<u>Provision of regulated entertainment (live music ,recorded music):</u> Indoors

Live music – Fri and Sat 11pm to 3am, Sun 11pm to 12am-Recorded music Thurs - Sat 8am to 3am, Sun 8am to 12am

<u>Provision of late night refreshment: indoors</u> Fri and Sat 11pm to 3am, Sun 11pm to 12am-

The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises only: Mon to Wed 8am to 11pm, Thurs to Sun 8am to 3am

Opening hours:

Mon to Sun 8am to 3am

Please note Live music and Late-night refreshment activity has been removed from the application see paragraph 3.3

Please also note reduced hours have been agreed for the remaining activities with the Licensing out of hours team see paragraph 3.8

- 2.5.1 In accordance with the Live Music Act 2012 and Deregulation Act 2015, performances of Live Music and Recorded Music between the hours of 0800 and 2300 hours have been deregulated and so should not be regarded as licensable activities for the purposes of this application.
- 2.5.2 Any further details provided relating to any of the individual licensable activities are specified on the application form at **Appendix 2**.
- 2.6 Activities unsuitable for children
- 2.6.1 The applicant has not highlighted any adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.
- 2.7 Steps to promote the licensing objectives
- 2.7.1 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by taking the steps identified in the operating schedule.
- 2.7.2 These steps must be translated into conditions by the licensing authority to be included in any granted premises licence, unless the conditions are modified by the Panel following consideration of relevant representations. These conditions are set out in the Schedule of Conditions at **Appendix 6**.
- 2.8 Further documentation accompanying the application
- 2.8.1 The applicant has not submitted any documents in support of their application,

3 Relevant Representations

3.1 A total of 15 relevant representations were received in respect of the application (**Appendix 3**). The personal details of all members of the public have been redacted. Original copies of these representations will be available to the Panel at the hearing.

- 3.2 Summary of the representations:

Party	Grounds of representation	Recommends
GMP	GMP objected to the application on the grounds that the area suffers from high crime rates and anti-social behaviour. GMP state that the addition of another alcohol licensed premises will exacerbate these problems. GMP also stated that the operating schedule offers very little in terms of enforceable conditions and this demonstrates a limited understanding of the licensing objectives.	Refuse
Ward Councillor	Ward councillor objected to the application based on the grounds that the area has a large number of residents and there are concerns regarding noise generated from patrons at the premises. Councillor also stated that the premises is situated in a high crime area along with anti-social behaviours and the granting of the application will exacerbate these problems.	Not stated
Residents	Residents objected to the application based on the grounds that the hours applied for are excessive and that the premises is in a densely populated area and an area of high crime. Residents states that the premises will add to litter, parking issues in the area and that noise pollution will increase as well as antisocial behaviours.	Refuse

- 3.3 Due to the number of objections received, on 22/11/2022, the applicant proposed the removal of the activity Live music from their application and a reduction in the hours for licensable activities. The applicant also proposed further conditions as part of their operating schedule.
- 3.4 All objectors were subsequently notified of this on 01/12/2022, and provided details of the proposals stated by the applicant
- 3.5 A record of the emails received from the applicant and the emails sent to the objectors can be found at **Appendix 4**
- 3.6 Following the proposals put forward by the applicant, Resident 6 and the MCC Neighbourhood Delivery team (NDT) withdrew their objections.
- 3.7 The withdrawal email from Resident 6 and the NDT can be found at **Appendix 5.** All personal details have been redacted

- 3.8 On 07/12/2022 the applicant agreed to a further reduction in the licensable hours with the Licensing and out of hours compliance team (LOOH).
- 3.9 LOOH subsequently withdrew their objection.
- 3.10 The agreement with LOOH can be found at **Appendix 5.**
- 3.11 The agreed timings with LOOH are as follows:

Opening hours to the public Monday to Sunday 12:00 to 23:00 Sale by retail of alcohol (no off sales) Monday to Sunday 12:00 to 22:00 Recorded music Monday to Sunday 12:00 to 23:00

- 3.12 All parties were notified of the agreement with LOOH on 09/12/2022, the email to objectors can be found at **Appendix 5**
- 3.13 Following the amendments agreed with LOOH, Councillor 2 subsequently withdrew their objection on 12/12/2022.
- 3.14 A record of Councillor 2's withdrawal can be found at **Appendix 5**
- 3.15 Agreements on conditions have been reached with LOOH and the Trading standards team.
- 3.16 Any conditions proposed by objectors are set out in the Schedule of Conditions at **Appendix 6**.

4 Key Policies and Considerations

4.1 Legal Considerations

4.1.1 Hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 operate under the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

4.2 **New Information**

4.2.1 In accordance with Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings)
Regulations 2005, the authority may take into account documentary or other
information produced by a party in support of their application, representations
or notice either before the hearing or, with the consent of all parties, at the
hearing.

4.3 **Hearsay Evidence**

- 4.3.1 The Panel may accept hearsay evidence and it will be a matter for the Panel to attach what weight to it that they consider appropriate. Hearsay evidence is evidence of something that a witness neither saw nor heard, but has heard or read about.
- 4.4 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003

- 4.4.1 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 is provided for all parties involved in licensing. It is a key medium for promoting best practice, ensuring consistent application of licensing powers across England and Wales and for promoting fairness, equal treatment and proportionality.
- 4.4.2 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. The Guidance is therefore binding on all licensing authorities to that extent. However, the Guidance cannot anticipate every possible scenario or set of circumstances that may arise and, as long as licensing authorities have properly understood this Guidance, they may depart from it if they have good reason to do so and can provide full reasons.
- 4.4.3 Departure from the Guidance could give rise to an appeal or judicial review, and the reasons given will then be a key consideration for the courts when considering the lawfulness and merits of any decision taken.
- 4.5 Manchester Statement of Licensing Policy
- 4.5.1 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' its statement of licensing policy.
- 4.5.2 The Licensing Policy sets out the vision the licensing authority has for the regulation of licensed premises throughout Manchester and outlines the standards expected in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives in the city. The Panel may depart from the policies should it consider doing so would benefit the promotion of the licensing objectives. Reasons are to be given for any such departure from the Policy.
- 4.5.3 Section 4 of the Policy (Operation of the Policy) sets out how the Licensing Policy is intended to be used in practice for licence applications and licensed premises.
- 4.5.4 Relevant to this application and the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following sections of the Policy:

Section 6: What we aim to encourage

This section identifies certain types of venues and initiatives the licensing authority aims to encourage in order to promote an inclusive evening and night-time economy not simply focused on the consumption of alcohol. We aim to encourage:

- Premises that will extend the diversity of entertainment and attract a wider range of participants
- Live music, especially original material, which will provide a range of live performances and styles of music, provided that such entertainment does not undermine the licensing objectives
- National cultural institutions, global sports events and cultural festivals
- Non-drink-led premises, including restaurants, cafes, theatres and cinemas

- Communication and integration with local residents and businesses through licensees consulting with those in the local area prior to an application
- Participation in Pubwatches, off licence forums and other crimereduction partnerships
- Engagement with the NITENET radio scheme and DISC secure information sharing platform by city centre venues through the Cityco Manchester Business Crime Reduction Partnership
- Designing out crime in the layout of the premises

Section 7: Local factors

This section sets out key issues that applicants are expected to take into account relevant to the individual characteristics of the premises when preparing their operating schedule and address any local factors relevant to their premises.

Having regard to the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following Factors:

- Identified risk factors specific to the licensed premises
- Evidence of pre-existing problems in the area
- Consistency with relevant Council strategies
- The proximity of the premises to local residents and other local businesses, particularly in relation to the potential for nuisance
- · Ability to clean and maintain the street scene

Section 8: Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives

This section identifies the standards that the licensing authority expects of licensed premises in Manchester. It is recognised that not all standards will be appropriate to apply in every situation to every premises, and applicants are not obliged to include all standards in their operating schedule. The degree to which standards would be appropriate is expected to be proportionate to the risk posed against the promotion of the licensing objectives having regard to the individual circumstances of the premises. The standards are not exhaustive and the licensing authority will have regard to any relevant issues raised in any representation that may fall outside them.

- MS2 Effective general management of the premises
- MS3 Responsible promotion and sale of alcohol
- MS5 Prevent on-street consumption of alcohol
- MS7 Maintain a safe capacity
- MS8 Prevent noise nuisance from the premises
- MS9 Effectively manage exterior spaces (e.g. beer gardens, smoking areas, table and chair areas on the highway)
- MS10 Operate effective cleansing arrangements, including ensuring the premises and surrounding area are kept clean and free of litter, and adequate arrangements for the secure and responsible storage of refuse
- MS11 Ensure the wellbeing of children on the premises
- MS12 Prevent underage sales of alcohol, including proxy sales

Conclusion

- 4.6 A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act ("licensing functions") with a view to promoting the licensing objectives:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - the protection of children from harm.
- 4.7 In considering the matter, the Panel should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representations made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be. In reaching the decision, regard must also be had to relevant provisions of the national guidance and the Council's licensing policy statement.
- 4.8 Having regard to the representations, the Panel must take such of the steps set out below that it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - a) To grant the licence subject to:
 - i. the conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, which the Panel may modify to such extent as they consider appropriate, and
 - ii. any mandatory conditions that must be included in the licence;
 - b) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - c) To refuse to specify the person proposed in the application as the designated premises supervisor;
 - d) To reject the application.
- 4.9 The conditions consistent with the operating schedule may be modified to alter or omit any of them or to add any new condition, including restricting the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.
- 4.10 All licensing determinations should be considered on the individual merits of the application.
- 4.11 The Panel's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 4.12 It is important that a licensing authority should give comprehensive reasons for its decisions in anticipation of any appeals. Failure to give adequate reasons could itself give rise to grounds for an appeal.

I am the neighbourhood beat officer for the Moston / New Moston area within Greater Manchester Police.

I am writing to you with regards to the above premises licence application. I wish to object to this application on the following grounds:

- The prevention of crime and disorder: This premises is situated on a residential street within a row of small shop front type premises set between residential terraced housing. It is on the boundary of an area of high crime and ASB within the ward. The introduction of yet another premises for the consumption of alcohol within this confined area would only exacerbate the issues here. GMP and MCC have successfully worked together previously to obtain a closure order on a similar premises, and are in the process of working towards yet another closure order for a similar premises, due to levels of ASB, noise and crime associated with the premises. There are no details concerning the use of SIA approved door staff at the premises.
- **Public safety:** There are concerns regarding parking outside the premises and the risks to road users should there be an increase patrons to such a premise. This is a busy thoroughfare with limited on street parking nearby.
- The prevention of public nuisance: Given these premises are situated within a residential street I cannot foresee the noise of recorded music and live music until 3am reasonably being prevented from disturbing residents. There are residential flats above these premises and on either side with the row bordered by terraced accommodation and housing at the rear of the property. It is not reasonable to expect local residents to cope with this level of noise until such an hour.

The premises is a small premises sited with some shops within a row of terrace houses. There are private residences above the shops . This location has experienced numerous issues and incidents of ASB due to street drinking and illegal drinking dens.

For the late-night sale of alcohol license to 3.00 am I have concerns about noise and people leaving the premises in this residential area when there are already issues in the area due to the consumption of alcohol.

The properties that are next to and above are used to house homeless families and vulnerable residents fleeing DV and other issues.

Kenyon Lane is in the main a residential area.

Licensing and Out of Hours team have assessed the likely impact of the granting of this license, considering several factors, including the nature of the area in which the premises is located, the hours applied for and any potential risk that the granting of this licence could lead to issues of public nuisance.

Licensing & Out of Hours are aware of the amended application and have also considered this in my response.

The area has a few nearby restaurants and shops and is in very close proximity to residential accommodation, with flats on top of the terrace row in which the property is located and with residents nearby on Kenyon Lane, Hinde Street, Whittaker Street, and Ivy Street.

There have been reports from nearby residents in terms of noise nuisance and anti-social behaviour in the immediate vicinity of the premises. Some of which are still open cases with ongoing investigation. It is the case that the location of the premises is near residents and any issues relating to public nuisance risk having an impact.

It is therefore a concern to see that the applicant described the location of the premises as "property is situated on Moston Lane...".

The property is located on Kenyon Lane.

The applicant also further states that, "the building sits alone (away) from houses, which would cause less noise and (disturbance)".

The premises has residents closely located across the road, behind and to the side of it, and is also located within a row of terraces with accommodation above these terraces, as can be seen in the photograph below.



Also, from the photograph it can be seen that the parking is limited to some street parking outside the premises. Whilst one part of the application states that there is street parking, it also claims that "the property has a large parking area which allows customers to leave with easy access".

The premises itself does not have any of its own dedicated parking and the current street parking is limited and used by existing restaurants on Kenyon Lane and by residents. There is a risk that parking will spread out to nearby residential roads and noise from dispersal and the use of taxis will become a nuisance for residents, even at the amended request to operate to midnight.

The application also states that there will be "safe capacity limits" although it has not been made clear what these will be, and how it will impact on public nuisance amongst other issues. The applicant states there is room for 20 covers as a restaurant, but it is not clear if this is the only activity planned.

There will also be "limitations or exclusions (of children) when certain activities are taking place". This again concerns me as to what other activities are planned at the premises other than eating at a restaurant? How do these other activities impact on public nuisance?

The applicant does state that there will be "limitations on the hours when children may be present" but does not state what these limitations are exactly.

The application states that "The premises will provide SIA door supervision if needed". This leads me to have some concern over the type of activity at the premises that would warrant door supervision, and when would the requirement for supervision be assessed and by whom?

Licensing & Out of Hours are not confident that we understand what the focus of the business will be and how it will impact on public nuisance. The application describes it as a "restaurant with 20 covers", also as a venue to "host birthday bookings/ celebration bookings", and as a venue "serving alcohol" and where there will be "DJs for people to listen to music"

There is no application for Late Night Refreshment and so Licensing & Out of Hours have noted that the premises will operate from 11pm to midnight solely

as a venue for people to drink alcohol and listen to music, more of a bar or club than a restaurant. The original application requested these activities, including live music up to 3am at weekends.

Licensing & Out of Hours believe that there would be a risk of undermining the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective where the premises is used as a bar and music venue where there are people only drinking and not eating and listening to a DJ. The property is attached to a row of terraces with residential accommodation, and other very close residential property. The application lacks any awareness or recognition of nearby properties and therefore fails to address the impact of its activities on these residents.

Licensing & Out of Hours are not confident that the business has sufficiently identified areas of concern that in our view will lead to public nuisance issues for residents, both in terms of dispersal, parking, noise from music, raised voices from people talking over a DJ.

There is also the issue of people congregating outside to smoke and causing a nuisance from raised voices outside.

Licensing and Out of Hours also has concerns with it becoming a vertical drinking venue and late night destination and how the impact of intoxicated people both inside and outside will be managed to avoid public nuisance issues. There are no confirmed limits on customers who are there to drink alcohol and listen to music.
