1. <u>Introduction</u>

- 1.1 On 03/11/2022, an application for the grant of a Premises Licence under s17 of the Licensing Act 2003 was made in respect of Forty-Seven, 47 Peter Street, Manchester, M2 3NG in the Deansgate ward of Manchester. A location map and photograph of the premises is attached at **Appendix 1**.
- 1.2 A 28-day public consultation exercise was undertaken in accordance with Licensing Act 2003 regulations; requiring the application to be advertised by the displaying of a blue notice at or on the premises, a notice published in a newspaper or similar circulating in the local area, and details of the application published on the Council's website.
- 1.3 Representations may be made for or against an application during the consultation period. To be 'relevant' and, therefore, able to be taken into account in determining the application, they must be about the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives. Where representations are made by persons who are not a responsible authority, they must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 1.4 Relevant representations have been received in respect of this application and so it must be determined by a Licensing Hearing Panel in accordance with the Council's Constitution.

2. The Application

- 2.1 A copy of the application is attached at **Appendix 2.**
- 2.2 The applicant is Kro Hotels Manchester M2 Ltd.
- 2.3 The description of the premises given by the applicant is:

Hotel on the corner of South Mill Street and Peter Street comprised of six floors.

- 2.4 The proposed designated premises supervisor is Miss Ewelina Bastian.
- 2.5 The licensable activities applied for:

Provision of regulated entertainment (live music): Mon to Sun 12noon to 2am

Provision of regulated entertainment (recorded music): Mon to Sun 24 hours per day

Provision of late-night refreshment: Mon to Sun 11pm to 5am

The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises only: Mon to Sun 24 hours per day

Opening hours:

Mon to Sun 24 hours per day

(24 hour mini-bar service and hotel room service menu of both food and drink for hotel guests and their bona fide guests).

- 2.5.1 In accordance with the Live Music Act 2012 and Deregulation Act 2015, performances of Live Music and Recorded Music between the hours of 0800 and 2300 hours have been deregulated and so should not be regarded as licensable activities for the purposes of this application.
- 2.5.2 Any further details provided relating to any of the individual licensable activities are specified on the application form at **Appendix 2**.

2.6 Activities unsuitable for children

2.6.1 The applicant has not highlighted any adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.

2.7 Steps to promote the licensing objectives

- 2.7.1 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by taking the steps identified in the operating schedule.
- 2.7.2 These steps must be translated into conditions by the licensing authority to be included in any granted premises licence, unless the conditions are modified by the Panel following consideration of relevant representations. These conditions are set out in the Schedule of Conditions at **Appendix 4**.

3. Relevant Representations

3.1 A total of 2 relevant representations were received in respect of the application (**Appendix 3**). The personal details of all members of the public have been redacted. Original copies of these representations will be available to the Panel at the hearing.

3.3 Any conditions proposed by objectors are set out in the Schedule of Conditions at **Appendix 4** (N.B.- Not applicable as no conditions are being proposed by those objecting to the application).

4. Key Policies and Considerations

4.1 Legal Considerations

4.1.1 Hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 operate under the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

4.2 **New Information**

4.2.1 In accordance with Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings)
Regulations 2005, the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice either before the hearing or, with the consent of all parties, at the hearing.

4.3 **Hearsay Evidence**

4.3.1 The Panel may accept hearsay evidence and it will be a matter for the Panel to attach what weight to it that they consider appropriate. Hearsay evidence is evidence of something that a witness neither saw nor heard, but has heard or read about.

4.4 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003

4.4.1 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 is provided for all parties involved in licensing. It is a key medium for promoting best practice, ensuring consistent application of licensing powers across England and Wales and for promoting fairness, equal treatment and proportionality.

- 4.4.2 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. The Guidance is therefore binding on all licensing authorities to that extent. However, the Guidance cannot anticipate every possible scenario or set of circumstances that may arise and, as long as licensing authorities have properly understood this Guidance, they may depart from it if they have good reason to do so and can provide full reasons.
- 4.4.3 Departure from the Guidance could give rise to an appeal or judicial review, and the reasons given will then be a key consideration for the courts when considering the lawfulness and merits of any decision taken.

4.5 Manchester Statement of Licensing Policy

- 4.5.1 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' its statement of licensing policy.
- 4.5.2 The Licensing Policy sets out the vision the licensing authority has for the regulation of licensed premises throughout Manchester and outlines the standards expected in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives in the city. The Panel may depart from the policies should it consider doing so would benefit the promotion of the licensing objectives. Reasons are to be given for any such departure from the Policy.
- 4.5.3 Section 4 of the Policy (Operation of the Policy) sets out how the Licensing Policy is intended to be used in practice for licence applications and licensed premises.
- 4.5.4 Relevant to this application and the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following sections of the Policy:

Section 6: What we aim to encourage

This section identifies certain types of venues and initiatives the licensing authority aims to encourage in order to promote an inclusive evening and night-time economy not simply focused on the consumption of alcohol. We aim to encourage:

- Premises that will extend the diversity of entertainment and attract a wider range of participants
- Live music, especially original material, which will provide a range of live performances and styles of music, provided that such entertainment does not undermine the licensing objectives
- National cultural institutions, global sports events and cultural festivals
- Non-drink-led premises, including restaurants, cafes, theatres and cinemas
- Communication and integration with local residents and businesses through licensees consulting with those in the local area prior to an application
- Participation in Pubwatches, off licence forums and other crimereduction partnerships

- Engagement with the NITENET radio scheme and DISC secure information sharing platform by city centre venues through the Cityco Manchester Business Crime Reduction Partnership
- Designing out crime in the layout of the premises

Section 7: Local factors

This section sets out key issues that applicants are expected to take into account relevant to the individual characteristics of the premises when preparing their operating schedule and address any local factors relevant to their premises.

Having regard to the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following Factors:

- Evidence of pre-existing problems in the area
- Consistency with relevant Council strategies
- The proximity of the premises to local residents and other local businesses, particularly in relation to the potential for nuisance
- Ability to clean and maintain the street scene

Section 8: Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives

This section identifies the standards that the licensing authority expects of licensed premises in Manchester. It is recognised that not all standards will be appropriate to apply in every situation to every premises, and applicants are not obliged to include all standards in their operating schedule. The degree to which standards would be appropriate is expected to be proportionate to the risk posed against the promotion of the licensing objectives having regard to the individual circumstances of the premises. The standards are not exhaustive and the licensing authority will have regard to any relevant issues raised in any representation that may fall outside them.

- MS2 Effective general management of the premises
- MS3 Responsible promotion and sale of alcohol
- MS5 Prevent on-street consumption of alcohol
- MS6 Provide a Duty of Care for intoxicated or vulnerable customers and medical emergencies
- MS8 Prevent noise nuisance from the premises
- MS10 Operate effective cleansing arrangements, including ensuring the premises and surrounding area are kept clean and free of litter, and adequate arrangements for the secure and responsible storage of refuse
- MS11 Ensure the wellbeing of children on the premises
- MS12 Prevent underage sales of alcohol, including proxy sales.

5. Conclusion

- A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act ("licensing functions") with a view to promoting the licensing objectives:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and

- the protection of children from harm.
- In considering the matter, the Panel should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representations made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be. In reaching the decision, regard must also be had to relevant provisions of the national guidance and the Council's licensing policy statement.
- 5.3 Having regard to the representations, the Panel must take such of the steps set out below that it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - a) To grant the licence subject to:
 - i. the conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, which the Panel may modify to such extent as they consider appropriate, and
 - ii. any mandatory conditions that must be included in the licence:
 - b) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - c) To refuse to specify the person proposed in the application as the designated premises supervisor;
 - d) To reject the application.
- 5.4 The conditions consistent with the operating schedule may be modified to alter or omit any of them or to add any new condition, including restricting the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.
- 5.5 All licensing determinations should be considered on the individual merits of the application.
- The Panel's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 5.7 It is important that a licensing authority should give comprehensive reasons for its decisions in anticipation of any appeals. Failure to give adequate reasons could itself give rise to grounds for an appeal.
- 5.8 The Panel is asked to determine the application.

The property semi-detached 5 floor building located on Peter Street corner of South Mill Street. It surrounded by office buildings through south mill street and Bootle Street and restaurant/café on 49 Peter Street. The property does not have a parking or outer dining/ meeting area. It consists of 1 guest main entrance on Peter Street.

The property consists of 5 floors of public spaces. Lower ground contains a public space, kitchen, 2 sets of toilets, cellar, access to the lift and access to the basement. Upper-level floor contains of a restaurant area, service bar, disabled toilet, access to guest lift and restaurant lift. Hotel levels: 1st floor containing: 1 accessible bedroom, 2 large suites, 7 standard bedrooms, hotel refuse store, linen storeroom, electrical plant room, 2nd floor containing: 1 accessible bedroom, 2 large suites, 8 standard bedrooms, linen storeroom, electrical plant room, 3rd floor containing: 2 standard bedrooms, 2 large suites, 7 duplex style bedrooms, linen storeroom, electrical plant room. All floors accessible via guest lift and main hotel staircase. Hotel also contains a basement level for internal use only. It is a large space used as a dry store, chiller space and pump room.

The lower and upper ground floor (bar and restaurant) caters for both food and alcohol service for outside dinners and hotel guests. It is suitable for small party dining, large parties, conference events. All hotel bedrooms and suites include

The premises is located on Peter Street, the basement and mezzanine/first floor is Asha's restaurant which has a premises licence, the floors above are a new hotel. This application is for a licence to cover the whole of the premises.

- 2.7.2 These steps must be translated into conditions by the licensing authority to be included in any granted premises licence, unless the conditions are modified by the Panel following consideration of relevant representations. These conditions are set out in the Schedule of Conditions at **Appendix 4**.

3. Relevant Representations

3.1 A total of 3 relevant representations were received in respect of the application (**Appendix 3**). The personal details of all members of the public have been redacted. Original copies of these representations will be available to the Panel at the hearing.

4. Key Policies and Considerations

4.1 Legal Considerations

4.1.1 Hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 operate under the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

4.2 **New Information**

4.2.1 In accordance with Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings)
Regulations 2005, the authority may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations

or notice either before the hearing or, with the consent of all parties, at the hearing.

4.3 **Hearsay Evidence**

4.3.1 The Panel may accept hearsay evidence and it will be a matter for the Panel to attach what weight to it that they consider appropriate. Hearsay evidence is evidence of something that a witness neither saw nor heard, but has heard or read about

4.4 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003

- 4.4.1 The Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003 is provided for all parties involved in licensing. It is a key medium for promoting best practice, ensuring consistent application of licensing powers across England and Wales and for promoting fairness, equal treatment and proportionality.
- 4.4.2 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. The Guidance is therefore binding on all licensing authorities to that extent. However, the Guidance cannot anticipate every possible scenario or set of circumstances that may arise and, as long as licensing authorities have properly understood this Guidance, they may depart from it if they have good reason to do so and can provide full reasons.
- 4.4.3 Departure from the Guidance could give rise to an appeal or judicial review, and the reasons given will then be a key consideration for the courts when considering the lawfulness and merits of any decision taken.

4.5 Manchester Statement of Licensing Policy

- 4.5.1 Section 4 of the 2003 Act provides that, in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must 'have regard to' its statement of licensing policy.
- 4.5.2 The Licensing Policy sets out the vision the licensing authority has for the regulation of licensed premises throughout Manchester and outlines the standards expected in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives in the city. The Panel may depart from the policies should it consider doing so would benefit the promotion of the licensing objectives. Reasons are to be given for any such departure from the Policy.
- 4.5.3 Section 4 of the Policy (Operation of the Policy) sets out how the Licensing Policy is intended to be used in practice for licence applications and licensed premises.
- 4.5.4 Relevant to this application and the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following sections of the Policy:

Section 6: What we aim to encourage

This section identifies certain types of venues and initiatives the licensing authority aims to encourage in order to promote an inclusive evening and night-time economy not simply focused on the consumption of alcohol. We aim to encourage:

- Premises that will extend the diversity of entertainment and attract a wider range of participants
- Live music, especially original material, which will provide a range of live performances and styles of music, provided that such entertainment does not undermine the licensing objectives
- National cultural institutions, global sports events and cultural festivals
- Non-drink-led premises, including restaurants, cafes, theatres and cinemas
- Communication and integration with local residents and businesses through licensees consulting with those in the local area prior to an application
- Participation in Pubwatches, off licence forums and other crimereduction partnerships
- Engagement with the NITENET radio scheme and DISC secure information sharing platform by city centre venues through the Cityco Manchester Business Crime Reduction Partnership
- Designing out crime in the layout of the premises

Section 7: Local factors

This section sets out key issues that applicants are expected to take into account relevant to the individual characteristics of the premises when preparing their operating schedule and address any local factors relevant to their premises.

Having regard to the grounds of the representations made, the Panel are recommended to have regard to the following Factors:

- Identified risk factors specific to the licensed premises
- Consistency with relevant Council strategies

Section 8: Manchester's standards to promote the licensing objectives

This section identifies the standards that the licensing authority expects of licensed premises in Manchester. It is recognised that not all standards will be appropriate to apply in every situation to every premises, and applicants are not obliged to include all standards in their operating schedule. The degree to which standards would be appropriate is expected to be proportionate to the risk posed against the promotion of the licensing objectives having regard to the individual circumstances of the premises. The standards are not exhaustive and the licensing authority will have regard to any relevant issues raised in any representation that may fall outside them.


- MS1 Implement effective security measures at the premises
- MS2 Effective general management of the premises
- MS8 Prevent noise nuisance from the premises
- MS11 Ensure the wellbeing of children on the premises
- MS12 Prevent underage sales of alcohol, including proxy sales

Conclusion

- 4.6 A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act ("licensing functions") with a view to promoting the licensing objectives:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - the protection of children from harm.
- 4.7 In considering the matter, the Panel should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representations made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be. In reaching the decision, regard must also be had to relevant provisions of the national guidance and the Council's licensing policy statement.
- 4.8 Having regard to the representations, the Panel must take such of the steps set out below that it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - a) To grant the licence subject to:
 - i. the conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, which the Panel may modify to such extent as they consider appropriate, and
 - ii. any mandatory conditions that must be included in the licence:
 - b) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - c) To refuse to specify the person proposed in the application as the designated premises supervisor;
 - d) To reject the application.
- 4.9 The conditions consistent with the operating schedule may be modified to alter or omit any of them or to add any new condition, including restricting the times at which licensable activities authorised by the licence can take place.
- 4.10 All licensing determinations should be considered on the individual merits of the application.
- 4.11 The Panel's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve. Findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 4.12 It is important that a licensing authority should give comprehensive reasons for its decisions in anticipation of any appeals. Failure to give adequate reasons could itself give rise to grounds for an appeal.
- 4.13 The Panel is asked to determine the application.

Staffs are trained as appropriate in respect of relevant licensing law.

The open nature of the restaurant allows for good viewing coverage. CCTV cameras are installed.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The premises will operate Challenge 25 policy as a minimum in order to ensure that alcohol is sold only to persons of lawful age.

The Designated Premises Supervisor and their staff will at all times remain aware of their responsibilities for the prevention of crime and disorder on the premises and demonstrate a responsible attitude to the marketing and sale of alcohol.

Any person who appears drunk /aggressive will not be permitted on the premises. CCTV recordings will be kept for at least 30 days and made available to responsible authorities.

c) Public safety

A fire alarm system will be installed to meet BS 5839 Part 1 current standards. An emergency lighting system will be installed to meet BS 5266 current standards. Firefighting equipment will be available in the premises to meet BS 5306 current standards.

The Licensing & Out of Hours (LOOH) Team have assessed the application for a new Premises Licence taking into consideration the four Licensing Objectives, trading history at the premises, including ongoing investigations for offences under the Licensing Act 2003 & Health Act 2006.

The premises was previously granted a licence on the 13th July 2018 in the name of _______ The information we have received is that ______ the named Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) for this application & partner of the proposed Premises Licence Holder (PLH), has owned the business since December 2019 but failed to transfer the licence. A check on business rates identifies 'Beilul Lounge East African Restaurant' as liable for the payments from 21st January 2020. Companies house identifies this company as being incorporated on the 23rd October 2019 & ______ is named as the sole director.

A review application was submitted by the LOOH team in February 2022 due to continuously operating well outside of permitted hours, continuously breaching conditions of the licence and in addition to the S136 licensing offences the applicants continuously sold & allowed shisha to be smoked on the premises, an offence under the Health Act 2006.

Before the review application could be heard the licence was surrendered by

A transfer was then submitted to resurrect the licence & to
appoint This subsequently received a Police objection. At
the transfer hearing the applicant withdrew the application
& the licence lapsed again on the 22nd April 2022.

On the 23rd December 2022 LOOH officers visited the premises to assess the new premises licence application and requested to see the 2nd floor room

which is proposed to be licensed. Officers spoke to a female who was working behind the counter who advised officers she was 'just helping out'. The female called the counter who advised officers strongly told her that officers could not view the 2nd floor or any other areas of the premises.

On the 6th January 2023 LOOH officers viewed the website for the premises. Officers viewed the takeaway section & noted several alcoholic drinks for sale. Officers were able to create an account, add alcohol to the basket & proceed to checkout for the goods. LOOH officers returned to the premises the same date to view the areas which were proposed to be licensed & to investigate the offence of \$136, \$137 & \$138 of the Licensing Act 2003 due to the advertisement of alcohol sales via the website. After entering the premises officers noted a pot at the top of the stairs to the first floor with 2 x lit coals.

The door to the 2nd floor was propped open & the female chef on duty allowed officers to enter the top floor. On entry officers could see there was a large set up of shisha pipes behind the bar/ counter.

Evidence of recent use in the premises were found as follows:

- 2 x smoke detectors covered with foil.
- 2 x empty fruit/ tobacco mixed tubs under the counter next to 2 x bags of shisha tobacco.
- By the sink were several clay pots that had been washed & left to dry.
- Two metal trays were present with partly used charcoal.
- Boxes of charcoal & foil.

As officers believe offences had been committed under the Health Act 2006, 1 x shisha pipe & 1 x box of charcoal were seized as evidence into the investigation for the offence.

Halfway down the last (back) flight of stairs were two bags of refuge, inside one of these bags were multiple empty bottles of Budweiser.

Officers returned to the first floor and asked to look behind the bar. Officers found the following:

- A menu offering several alcoholic drinks.
- 3 x Heineken 50 litre barrels. 1 x empty, 1 x full & 1 x connected to a tap which had been covered over with a black bag. The tap was cold to touch. Officers poured a small amount & noted it was fresh smelling and pouring clearly.
- 6 x empty bottles of Zibib.
- Bottles of partly used Tequila, Gordons Gin & Zibib.
- A can of San Miguel in the fridge.

The proposed PLH & DPS are currently under investigation for the offences and PACE interviews will be taking place in due course.

The food hygiene rating for the premises is currently a 0/5.

the proposed DPS, has continuously misled officers & demonstrated a very poor understanding of the licensing objectives, with a wilful disregard of his responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003 & Health Act 2006. The LOOH team have no faith that the premises can operate without the licensing objectives being seriously undermined.

Recommendation: Refuse Application

The Trading Standards Team have assessed the likely impact of the granting of this application taking into account a number of factors, including the conditions offered and times applied for and any potential risk that the granting of this application could lead to issues which do not uphold the licensing objectives specifically the protection of children from harm.

The application is for a restaurant and lounge.

When considering the application, the Trading Standards Team have given consideration to Manchester City Councils Statement of Licensing Policy 2021 – 2026.

The original application addresses little in relation to the Licensing Objectives especially in protecting children from harm. Reference is made to the Challenge 25 policy, staff training and acceptable I.D used in the application but there are no details of how staff training is conducted, documented, or refreshed. There is no reference to maintaining a refusal log, having appropriate signage placed in areas where alcohol will be served as well as referencing proxy sales.

The conditions that have been offered are very vague and generic which gives the impression that the applicant has a limited understanding of the Licensing Objectives, which raises concerns about how the premises will be operated. This is further supported by fact that the Manchester City Council Licensing and Out of Hours team visited the premises on 6th January 2023 and found evidence of unlicensed activity and

breaches of smoking legislation.
Giving consideration to the above application, the Trading Standards Team therefore recommend that the licence is refused as the Trading Standards team have little faith that the licensing objectives will be met.

The proposed DPS in this application is a male called who has been the operator of the premises since 2019 and the premise was the subject of review application instigated by Manchester City Council Licensing and Out of Hours team in February 2022, when the applicant for this application, Ms. Regeat Negasi, was also involved in the running of the business. This was due to numerous offences which have been committed on the premises including the period whilst and Regeat Negasi were in charge.

The offences which triggered the review include;

- Unauthorised licensable activities
- Breaches of conditions
- Selling shisha & allowing it to be smoked on the premises, including by staff whilst behind the bar
- premises continuously operating well outside of permitted hours

GMP are also aware that officers from the Manchester City Council Licensing and Out of Hours team visited the premises on 6th January 2023 and found evidence of unlicensed activity and breaches of smoking legislation.

Therefore, it is abundantly clear that the operators have learned no lessons since the licence was surrendered prior to the review hearing last year and as such GMP believe that they are wholly unsuitable to hold a premise licence and ask this application to be refused.
