The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises only:
Monday to Sunday 8.00am to 11.00pm

Opening hours:
Monday to Sunday 8.00am to 11.00pm

Representations received

Greater Manchester Police	GMP are not satisfied that the conditions offered via the applications Operating Schedule are sufficiently robust enough to enable the full and correct upholding of the Four Licensing Objectives and are recommending the imposition of stronger conditions on the premises licence, should it be granted.
Licensing & Out of Hours	Due to the location of the premises within the city centre, LOOH Compliance are concerned that

Compliance	the conditions offered by the applicant are insufficiently worded to enable the correct upholding and enforcement of the Four Licensing Objectives. LOOH Compliance are recommending that specific conditions be imposed on the premises licence, should it be granted, to prevent issues relating to public nuisance and crime and disorder occurring at the premises and in its immediate vicinity.
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Agreements between parties

Greater Manchester Police:

- The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points. The CCTV cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recording shall be kept available and unedited for a minimum of 28 days with the date and time stamping. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present on the premises at all times when they are open to the public and must be able to produce / download / burn CCTV images upon request by a police officer or an authorised officer of the licensing authority. Any footage must be in a format so it can be played back on a standard personal computer or standard DVD player. Where the recording is on a removable medium (i.e. compact disc, flash card etc.), a secure storage system to store those recording mediums shall be provided.
- An incident log (which may be electronically recorded) shall be kept at the premises for at least six months, and made available on request to the Police or an authorised officer of the licensing authority, which will record the following incidents including pertinent details:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue, or by the venue to the Police
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any incidents of disorder
 - (d) any faults in the CCTV system
 - (e) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
 - (f) All refusals of sales of alcohol
- The Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that a written notice of authority is kept at the premises for all staff who sell alcohol. The notice shall be made available for inspection upon request of the police or an authorised officer of the licensing authority and all staff selling alcohol must be in possession of identification to enable to verify their identity against the notice.
- The premises shall display prominent signage indicating at any point of sale, the entrance to the premises and in all areas where alcohol is located that it is an offence to buy, or attempt to buy, alcohol for a person under the age of 18.
- In addition to any other training, the premises licence holder shall ensure all staff are trained to prevent underage sales, to be aware of and prevent proxy sales, to maintain the refusals log and monitor staff to ensure their

training is put into practice. Documented records of training completed shall be kept for each member of staff. Training shall be regularly refreshed and at no greater than 6 monthly intervals.

Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance:

- Between the hours of 08:00 to 11:00 the supply of alcohol shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.
- No off-sales of alcohol shall be served between the hours of 08:00 to 11:00.
- The Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that tables are cleared of all bottles and glasses on a regular basis during trading hours to avoid an accumulation of glassware.
- No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises that gives rise to a nuisance.
- Alcohol consumed outside the premises shall only be consumed by patrons seated at tables.
- Deliveries of goods necessary for the operation of the business shall be carried out at such a time or in such a manner as to prevent nuisance and disturbance to nearby residents.
