<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Custom will not be sought by means of personal solicitation outside or in the vicinity of the premises.</li> <li>2. CCTV shall be installed at the premises.</li> <li>3. Prominent clear and legible notices shall be displayed at the entrance and exit requesting the public to respect the needs of nearby residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.</li> <li>4. Customers will be asked not to stand around talking in the street outside the premises and will be asked to leave quickly and quietly.</li> <li>5. Children shall be accompanied and supervised at all times whilst in the premises.</li> </ol>	N/A	Applicant

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points and the street environment will be covered, enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recording shall be kept available and unedited for a minimum of 28 days with the date and time stamping. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present on the premises at all times when they are open to the public and must be able to produce / download / burn CCTV images upon request by a police officer or an authorised officer of the licensing authority. Any footage must be in a format so it can be played back on a standard personal computer or standard DVD player. Where the recording is on a removable medium (i.e. compact disc, flash card etc.), a secure storage system to store those recording mediums shall be provided.</li> <li>2. An incident log (which may be electronically recorded) shall be kept at the premises for at least six months, and made available on request to the Police or an authorised officer of the licensing authority, which will record the following incidents including pertinent details:               <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) all crimes reported to the venue, or by the venue to the Police</li> <li>(b) all ejections of patrons</li> <li>(c) any incidents of disorder</li> </ol> </li> <li>3. Staff shall be trained to deal with challenging customers and customers who are under the influence of intoxicants. This training shall be repeated at no greater than 6 monthly intervals.</li> </ol>	Yes (all)	GMP

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<p><b><u>Please note:</u></b></p> <p>Conditions 1 and 7 proposed by the Licensing and Out of Hours team below cover the same requirements as conditions 1 and 2 proposed by GMP. The Sub Committee is requested to attach GMP conditions 1 and 2 (rather than 1 and 7 below as the GMP conditions are more robustly worded), but with an amendment to GMP condition 1 to require that recordings are kept for a minimum of 31 days in line with the more stringent request from the Out of Hours team.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. A documented incident log book shall be kept at the premises for at least 6 months, and made available on request to Greater Manchester Police or an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority.</li> <li>2. Staff shall monitor customers smoking outside the premises on a regular basis and ensure patrons do not cause a public nuisance.</li> <li>3. A dispersal and smoking policy will be implemented and adhered to.</li> <li>4. No noise shall emanate from the premises through the structure of the premises that gives rise to a nuisance</li> <li>5. The exterior of the building shall be cleared of litter at regular intervals.</li> <li>6. Notices will be positioned at the exits to the buildings requesting customers to leave in a quiet manner</li> <li>7. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital [colour] CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points, and the street environment will be covered, enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record while the premises are open to the public and recording shall be kept available and unedited for a minimum of [31] days with the date and time stamping.</li> <li>8.
