Greater Manchester Police - WITHDRAWN	Objection withdrawn of basis of agreement with the LOOH team
Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance - AGREED	The LOOH team have agreed a reduction in the hours applied for, the new hours are as above. They also wish to see a number of conditions attached to the licence if granted. The conditions relate to the issues considered likely to arise and are included in full in the next section.
Councillor x 3 Resident x 1 Resident Group x 1 (WDRA() - AGREED	Objections were on the basis of the original proposed finish time on Fridays and Saturdays being too late for a residential area. A number of issues, common to all of these objections, is summarised as follows:
	 That granting the application would lead to: An increase in drunk and disorderly behaviour which could potentially lead to anti- social behaviour or crime and disorder
	 Congregation of people outside and creation of a "pinch point" 2
	 Street noise and disturbances to nearby residents 2
	 The premises being a magnet for large numbers of people, which the premises would struggle to manage
	In addition, WDRA are concerned about the potential increase in littering (particularly non- biodegradable litter); the resident includes a concern over public safety, echoed by Cllr Kilpatrick

Conditions

- Speakers shall not be located/operated in the entrance lobby or outside the premises.
- Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking, requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
- Staff shall monitor customers smoking outside the premises on a regular basis and ensure patrons do not cause a public nuisance.
- All takeaway packaging and wrappers shall clearly identify the premises, ie by way of company logo or name.
- The premises and immediate surrounding area shall be kept clean and free from litter at all times the premises are open to the public.
- No rubbish, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 23:00 and 08:00 hours.
- No deliveries must be made to the premises between 23:00 and 08:00 hours.
- Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly.
