Compliance (LOOH)

LOOH objected to the application on the grounds that residents will be affected by noise nuisance from customers frequenting the premises after 03.00. LOOH requested that the hours of operation are reduced and the applicant has agreed to reduce the operating hours.

Agreements between parties

Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance:

1. At the end of trading each day, the pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, shall be swept or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved waste storage arrangements.
2. The premises and immediate surrounding area shall be kept clean and free from litter at all times the premises are open to the public.
3. Litter bins shall be provided at the premises in sufficient capacity to ensure that customers can adequately dispose of any litter.
4. Signs must be displayed advising customers not to make noise and to consider nearby residents.
5. In addition to any other training, the premises licence holder shall ensure all staff are trained to deal with intoxicated/challenging customers and monitor staff to ensure their training is put into practice. Documented records of training completed shall be kept for each member of staff. Training shall be regularly refreshed and at no greater than 6 monthly intervals.
