<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li data-bbox="145 304 1102 882">1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points. The CCTV cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recording shall be kept available and unedited for a minimum of 28 days with the date and time stamping. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present on the premises at all times when they are open to the public and must be able to produce / download / burn CCTV images upon request by a police officer or an authorised officer of the licensing authority. Any footage must be in a format so it can be played back on a standard personal computer or standard DVD player. Where the recording is on a removable medium (i.e. compact disc, flash card etc.), a secure storage system to store those recording mediums shall be provided. <li data-bbox="145 925 1102 1323">2. An incident log (which may be electronically recorded) shall be kept at the premises for at least six months, and made available on request to the Police or an authorised officer of the licensing authority, which shall record the following incidents including pertinent details: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li data-bbox="193 1111 1023 1173">(a) all crimes reported to the venue, or by the venue to the Police <li data-bbox="193 1178 560 1218">(b) all ejections of patrons <li data-bbox="193 1223 576 1263">(c) any incidents of disorder <li data-bbox="193 1267 671 1308">(d) any faults in the CCTV system <li data-bbox="193 1312 991 1352">(e) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service <li data-bbox="145 1366 1102 1615">3. The Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that a written notice of authority is kept at the premises for all staff who sell alcohol. The notice shall be made available for inspection upon request of the police or an authorised officer of the licensing authority and all staff selling alcohol must be in possession of formal identification to enable to verify their identity against the notice. <li data-bbox="145 1659 1102 1700">4. The premises shall have smoke detectors and fire extinguishers <li data-bbox="145 1738 1102 1800">5. Notices shall be displayed requesting patrons to leave the premises quietly. <li data-bbox="145 1839 1102 1912">6. The DPS and staff shall at all times be vigilant, in terms of the monitoring and prevention of litter within the vicinity of the outlet. <li data-bbox="145 1951 1102 2018">7. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The supply of alcohol shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal. This will apply between the hours 12.00 and 21.30 Monday to Sunday. 2. This condition would ensure that alcohol is only consumed as part of a meal during and prevents people using the premises as a bar. 3. The front of the premise must be kept free from litter. 4. No noise shall emanate from the premise. The front door must remain closed except for access and egress. 5. Patrons must be dispersed should they congregate outside premise after closure. 6. There must be no more than 4 patrons at any one time outside at the front of the premise smoking. 7. Suitable smoking receptacles must be provided for cigarette waste. 8.
