Fri to Sat 11.30 am to 11pm
Non Standard Timings: New Year's Eve: 10am to 1am

Opening hours:

Sun to Thurs 8am to 10pm
Fri to Sat 8am to 11pm
Non Standard Timings New Year's Eve: 8am to 1am

Representations received	
Trading Standards	Trading standards objected to the application based on the grounds that the proposed conditions offered by the applicant do not uphold the licensing objective the protection of children from harm. Trading standards have requested that further conditions are attached to the licence to uphold this objective.
Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance	LOOH objected to the application on the grounds that the supply of alcohol should be in line with other licensed premises in the area. The applicant has agreed to amend the alcohol hours to start from 11.30am each day . LOOH also recommend that further conditions are attached to uphold the four licensing objectives

Agreements between parties
<p>Trading Standards</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The Challenge 25 scheme must be operated to ensure that any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall provide documented proof that he/she is over 18 years of age. Proof of age shall only comprise a passport, photo card driving licence, an HM Forces warrant card, or a card bearing the PASS hologram. 2. All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol will be trained with regards to the Challenge 25 policy and the sale of alcohol by proxy. This training will be documented, and training should be refreshed at no greater than 12 monthly Intervals. 3. The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that signage demonstrating the Challenge 25 policy as well as selling alcohol to children by proxy are placed at the entrance to the premises as well as being displayed in all areas serving alcohol. 4. All staff engaged in the delivery of alcohol will be trained with regards to the Challenge 25 policy. This training will be documented, and training should be refreshed at no greater than 12 monthly Intervals. The Premises Licence holder shall also ensure that all employees of any third party engaged in the delivery of alcohol, i.e. couriers have also been trained by their employers regarding the Challenge 25 policy. This training should also be documented. 5. At the point of delivery, the Challenge 25 policy should be operated. The only ID that should be accepted is a passport, photo driving licence, PASS accredited proof of age card or military identification card. 6. The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that a sticker is applied to all consignments of alcohol. It shall read "Note to delivery service, this package

contains age restricted products. Ensure recipient is over 18”.

7. A log shall be kept and record all instances when alcohol has been refused for the reasons that the person(s) is, or appear to be, under 18 years of age. The log shall record the date and time of the refusal and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The log will be available on request by the police or an authorised officer of Manchester City Council. The log shall be checked on a regular basis by the Designated Premises Supervisor to ensure that it is being used by staff and each check shall be recorded in the log.

Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance:

1. Speakers shall not be located, or operated outside the premises, and music inside should be kept at a background level.
2. Management and staff should prevent customers from congregating outside the premises.
3. The premises and immediate surrounding area shall be kept clean and free from litter at all times the premises is open to the public.
4. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking, requesting patrons to respect the needs of residents and use the area quietly.
5. Staff shall monitor customers smoking outside the premises on a regular basis and ensure that patrons do not cause a public nuisance.
