The Trading Standards Team have assessed the likely impact of the granting of this application taking into account a number of factors, including the conditions offered and times applied for and any potential risk that the granting of this application could lead to issues which do not uphold the licensing objectives specifically the protection of children from harm.

The application is for an alcohol delivery service based in a city centre location.

When considering the application, the Trading Standards Team have given consideration to Manchester City Councils Statement of Licensing Policy 2016 – 2021 especially Section 9 Alcohol Delivery Services.

The original application addresses many of the concerns when protecting children from harm.

Licensing and out of hours have assessed the likely impact of the grant of this application taking into account a numbers of factors, including, the nature of the area in which the premises is located, the hours applied for and any potential risk that the granting of this application could have, taking into account the four licensing objectives below.

- Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Public Safety
- Prevention of Public Nuisance
- Protection of Children from Harm

The premises is situated on Bridge Street at its intersection with Deansgate, and bordered by Southgate and King Street West. The area has limited vehicular parking and loading bays situated on Southgate. The area is a mixture of retail, business premises and licensed premises. Deansgate is a busy throughfare for both vehicular and pedestrian traffic.

LOH have been is discussion with the applicant and agreed the following amendments to the operating schedule emails confirming agreement included below this representation.

To address concerns further to the potential for public nuisance we are willing to limit the hours during which alcohol may be delivered to customers, i.e. from 12:00 to 04:00 daily.

To address the potential for alcohol dependency harm to befall our customers we will be willing to include links on our website to various alcohol dependency support organisations

### Specific conditions in operating schedule:

5 to be amended to include - This staff member shall be able to show Police and/or an authorised officer of the licensing authority recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

6 to be changed to Any promotional activity shall comply with the most current Portman Group code of practice on the rules for naming, packaging and promotion of alcoholic drinks.

13 To be amended to – Customers placing orders shall be asked to verify their age upon delivery of the alcohol if the customer appears to be under the age of 25 or has not payed by credit card. The only forms of acceptable identification are those indicated above.

Include the following condition:

Any promotional material and/or any website home page used as part of the business operating under this licence will clearly state the premises licence number. For the avoidance of doubt this includes flyers, leaflets and business cards promoting the business.

Licensing and out of hours still have concerns that the premises will not uphold the licensing objective prevention of public nuisance. LOH are concerned that the applicant has not considered the potential for their delivery drivers to cause public nuisance at the point of pick up from the premises they have not also considered the likely public nuisance from Deliveroo riders. The applicant These have been raised with the applicant without any proposal being offered to uphold the licensing objective.

LOH recommend that a documented policy as agreed with the Licensing & Out of Hours team managing delivery drivers/ Deliveroo riders to prevent a public nuisance implemented at the premises and a copy lodged with the councils Licensing Unit.
