Agreement has been reached between the applicant and all parties that submitted relevant representations.

The Sub-Committee is asked to grant the application subject to the modifications agreed between the parties without the need for a hearing.

If the Sub-Committee is not minded to grant the application as above, it is requested to adjourn the matter for a full hearing to be held to determine the application.

Proposed licensable activities and opening hours to be granted

Proposed hours and licensable activities:

Provision of regulated entertainment (live music, recorded music)(indoors): Mon to Sun 10am to 2am

Provision of late night refreshment (indoors): Mon to Sun 11pm to 2am

The supply of alcohol for consumption both on and off the premises: Mon to Sun 10am to 1:30am

Opening hours: Mon to Sun 10am to 2am

Steps to promote licensing objectives as given by the applicant:

1. The Licensee will ensure that all times when the premises are for any licensable activity, there are sufficient competent staff on duty at the premises for the purpose of fulfilling the terms and conditions of the licence and for

preventing crime and disorder.

- 2. We will ensure that all staff will undertake training in their responsibilities in relation to the sale of alcohol, particularly with regard to drunkenness and underage persons. Records will be kept of training and refresher training.
- 3. Any incidents of a criminal nature that may occur on the premises will be reported to the Police.
- 4. The Licensee will install comprehensive CCTV coverage at the premises and it is operated and maintained at the premises.
- 5. Appropriate fire safety procedures are in place including fire extinguishers (foam, H20 and CO2), fire blanket, internally illuminated fire exit signs, numerous smoke detectors and emergency lighting.
- 6. All appliances are inspected annually.
- 7. All emergency exits shall be kept free from obstruction at all times.
- 8. All customers will be asked to leave quietly.
- 9. Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed to remind customers to leave quietly and have regard to our neighbours.
- 10. The licensee and staff will ask persons who appear to be under the age of 25 for photographic ID such as proof of age cards, the Connexions Card and Citizen Card, photographic driving licence or passport, an official identity card issued by HM Forces or by an EU country, bearing the photograph and date of birth of bearer.
- 11. All staff will be trained for UNDERAGE SALES PREVENTION regularly.
- 12. A register of refused sales shall be kept and maintained on the premises.

Agreements between parties

Greater Manchester Police:

The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points and the street environment will be covered, enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recording shall be kept available and unedited for a minimum of 28 days with the date and time stamping. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present on the premises at all times when they are open to the public and must be able to produce / download / burn CCTV images upon request by a police officer or an authorised officer of the licensing authority. Any footage must be in a format so it can be played back on a standard personal computer or standard DVD player. Where the recording is on a removable medium (i.e. compact disc, flash card etc.), a secure storage system to store those recording mediums shall be provided.

The Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that a written notice of authority is kept at the premises for all staff who sell alcohol. The notice shall be made available for inspection upon request of the police or an authorised officer of the licensing authority and all staff selling alcohol must be in possession of formal identification to enable to verify their identity against the notice.

The premises shall display prominent signage indicating at any point of sale, at the entrance to the premises and in all areas where alcohol is located that it is an offence to buy, or attempt to buy, alcohol for a person under the age of 18.

In addition to any other training, the premises licence holder shall ensure all staff are trained to prevent underage sales, to be aware of and prevent proxy sales, to maintain the refusals log, enter sales correctly on the tills so the prompts show as appropriate and monitor staff to ensure their training is put into practice. Documented records of training completed shall be kept for each member of staff. Training shall be regularly refreshed and at no greater than 6 monthly intervals.

The need for security staff will be determined by documented risk assessment. The premises licence holder shall ensure that the provision of door supervisors at the premises is appropriate to ensure the safe control of the premises, and shall review this on a regular basis and upon request from GMP.

All staff engaged outside the entrance to the premises, or supervising or controlling queues, shall wear high-visibility armbands. The need for door staff should also be regularly reviewed and risk assessed, and appropriate security employed.

Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance:

Customers will not be permitted to remove from the premises any drinks supplied by the premises (alcoholic or otherwise) in open containers except for consumption in any delineated external area as shown on the plan attached to the licence.

All external windows and doors must be kept shut at all times when regulated entertainment is being provided. Doors may be opened for normal entrance and egress of people but must be shut immediately thereafter.

No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises that gives rise to a nuisance.
