The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital CCTV system. All public area of the licensed premises, including the street environment shall be covered, enabling facial recognition of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record while the premises are open to either the public or for deliveries, and recordings shall be kept available and unedited for a minimum of 28 days.

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# d) The prevention of public nuisance

The area outside the premises shall be kept clean and tidy and the staff shall be required to remove all store associated litter on a regular basis throughout the licence hours, and in particular shall tidy away any litter at the conclusion of the licensing hours.

Litter bins shall be provided at the premises in sufficient quantity to ensure that customers can adequately dispose of any litter.

All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.

Delivery drivers employed by the premises shall conduct the collection from the premises and delivery to the customers in a manner that shall not cause a noise disturbance to the occupiers of any residential properties surrounding the delivery address. This includes the avoidance of slamming doors, playing loud music, shouting, revving engines and sounding horns to signal their arrival. The driver shall turn the engine off immediately upon arrival at the premises, or the delivery address, and shall park considerately without causing any obstruction to the highway.

Notices shall be displayed at the exit to the premises requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly.

There shall be no noise or odours caused by the kitchen extraction equipment that gives rise to a nuisance.

Should customers from the premises congregate outside the premises or in the immediate vicinity at night, a member of staff shall request that they leave the area quickly and quietly.

All deliveries shall be made from the front of the premises.

No rubbish, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 20:00 and 07:30.

No deliveries or waste collections to take place between the hours of 20:00 and 07:30 hours and no deliveries or waste collections to take place on Sundays or Bank Holidays.

    - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
    - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

  combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance
  number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is
  currently allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from
  doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, **less than 6 months old**, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their
  permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office
  acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the
  person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such
  as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including:-

- evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
- evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
- evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
  - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
- (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
- (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
- (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

**Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities.** If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.
