#### **Notes for Guidance**

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. # **Progress Centre Noise Report 15/04/2023**

The purpose of this document is to assess the noise measurements recorded on 15/04/2023 with the intention of working alongside Manchester City Council to mitigate noise nuisance to residents whilst allowing the Progress Centre events to continue effectively over the planned dates.

These are the first measurements taken at the Progress Centre and have been taken due to the noise complaints received on previous events. It is the plan moving forward that every event will have noise measurements taken throughout so we can work effectively with the Council using quantitative data to ensure sound levels remain acceptable.

This report is written by the sound engineer who will be working a large portion of these events.

# Measurement types and method

Two types of measurements are being assessed in this report, these are:

- LAeq
- 1/3 Octave dB ranging from 31.5 20,000Hz

Both measurement types were taken over a 1 minute period each time ensuring the music was at a normal point when recording (not during particular points of quiet dependent on the act).

Measurements are also taken at different times of the event in order to assess any changes in the sound level as the event progresses.

The LAeq measurements were used in order to take an average level reading relevant to the human ear. This is a useful tool to gauge the overall level of the music.

1/3 Octave measurements were taken in order to assess more in-depth information on the levels at particular frequencies. This may be very useful going forward as if we are able to find the particular problematic frequencies affecting residents then they can be targeted independently reducing noise issues for residents.

## Locations

Three locations have been chosen for these measurements in an attempt to assess the impact on the surrounding area.

It should be noted that these locations were chosen with no knowledge of the actual location of the noise complaints and are instead estimations as to where noise may be an issue. It should also be noted that all these measurements were taken on the ground in public areas and noise levels may differ if you are in a tall flat complex for similar building.

The first location is our 'constant' and will not change moving forward. This will allow for direct comparisons to be made between events in order to ensure we can easily monitor when the sound is becoming too loud.

This first location is onsite of the Progress centre in the direction of the loudspeakers and away from the large areas of people in order to achieve the clearest measurements of the loudspeakers with minimal affect from audience noise.


The second location is at the intersection of Cotter St and Ardwick Green N. This location is behind the direction of the speakers and was chosen due to the residential properties located within close proximity to the Progress Centre.

The third location is Baring Street Carpark which is located next to the 'Unite Students' flats. This location was chosen as it is in the direction of the loudspeakers and next to a large number of residential flats.

#### Measurements

This section of the report will show plots of the measurements, the tables containing the exact measurements is in the appendix of this document.

## Onsite (constant location):



Figure(1) displays the LAeq measurements onsite at Progress Centre at three different times of the night. This shows that the sound level remained largely the same between the hours of 16:20 and 20:50 with only a 1dB(A) increase. This was achieved despite the audience being far larger at 20:50 than 16:20 and likely largely due to the delay speakers put in place for this event. This is also likely to be due to the purposeful reduction in bass frequencies as the music began to get louder therefore reducing the overall average LAeq and reducing the amount of low frequency noise affecting residents.


Figure(2) shows the 1/3 Octave measurements, again measured at 3 separate times throughout the night. We can see lots of crossover in these results and little in the way of a clear change between the different times, this is likely caused by different acts playing different music with different frequency content each time a measurement is taken.


We can however see that on average the low frequencies either remain the same or reduce as the night gets later despite the overall LAeq level increasing slightly. This is likely due to the purposeful reduction in low frequencies as the night got later.

#### **Cotter St:**

No readings were taken at Cotter St due to the fact that at all 3 measuring times the music from Progress Centre was inaudible at this location. Whilst this means that the residents near this location are unlikely to be affected by the events, it does not mean that other buildings in this direction such as tall flat complexes are not affected.

#### **Baring Street Carpark:**





On first inspection of *Figure(1)* one may assume that the levels from the Progress centre are fluctuating significantly. However, if we compare these measurements with the measurements taken onsite they do not match. In theory, these results should change over time relative to the results taken onsite (for example, if the level onsite increases by 2dB, we should expect to see the level in another also increase by approximately the same amount). This however is not the case here as we see very different changes over time. We can therefore conclude that it is noise from different factors affecting these results. For example, whilst attempts were made to avoid road noise during these measurements, there was definitely road noise close to this location for which almost definitely skewed these results. As the night progressed it should also be noted that other bars close to this location started to play music which may also have skewed the results.

## **Plan for Future Events:**

Moving forward we plan on continuing to measure the sound levels for events at the Progress Centre. The onsite location will remain constant throughout these events in order to remain consistent. This allows us to effectively monitor and control the levels mitigating the noise reaching local residents.

For example, if the council did not receive noise complaint on the 15/04/2023 and are happy with the noise created by the event on this date, we are able to ensure future events have the same treatment and remain at the same level.

We would also like to request of Manchester City Council any information which may help us mitigate noise nuisance. For example, if knowledge of problematic locations or even access to flats is available then this will allow better measurements to be attained. This may allow us to find particular frequencies which are affecting the residents, we would then be able to reduce these specific frequencies therefore reducing the noise nuisance.
