Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

Door Supervisors

- 1. Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority shall be used at the premises to undertake security activities, which include guarding against: -
 - (a) Unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision),
 - (b) Outbreaks of disorder, or
 - (c) Damage,

unless otherwise entitled by virtue of section 4 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001 to carry out such activities.

Supply of alcohol

- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence.
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence or,
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 5. (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price, which is less than the permitted price.
 - (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in (1) above—
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (3) Where the permitted price given by paragraph (2)(b) would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that subparagraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (4) (a) Sub-paragraph (4)(b) applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (2)(b) on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (b) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- 6. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic

- in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 8. The responsible person must ensure that
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

For the purposes of conditions 6, 7 and 8 above, a responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. An effective and adequate internal and external CCTV system covering all high-risk areas shall be installed, maintained and operated at the premises.
- 2. The premises shall become a member of, and maintain its membership of, the local Pub and club network and work with City Safe.
- 3. Staff shall be provided with comprehensive, ongoing training to make them aware of all legislation relevant to their employment and shall include first aid/alcohol and drug awareness safety/evacuation procedures and child safety all training shall be logged

and recorded.

- 4. Regular written risk assessments shall be carried out in respect of all activities that take place at the premises.
- 5. The management and staff shall ensure that glasses are collected regularly. Staff shall make regular inspections for broken glass and staff shall clear any broken glass found away immediately.
- 6. Acoustic lobbies on all doors.
- 7. Till monitoring system shall be in place.
- 8. Double glazed windows shall be in place.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 1. The Challenge/Think 25 policy shall be implemented in full and appropriate identification sought from any person who appears to be under the age of 25. The only acceptable forms of identification shall be a passport, photographic driving licence and those carrying the PASS logo.
- 2. Staff training shall include the Challenge/Think 25 policy and its operation. In particular staff shall be trained to take such action as is necessary to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons over the age of 18, where those customers are engaged in the distribution of alcohol for persons under the age of 18. This training shall be given to a new member of staff before they commence paid employment.
- 3. No children under the age of 16 shall be on the premises after 2000. In addition, no children under the age of 18 shall be on the premises unaccompanied after 2100
- 4. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 5. Deliveries/ waste disposal to take place between 0730 and 2000 Monday to Saturday. No deliveries/ waste disposal shall take place on Sundays or Bank Holidays.
- 6. The emptying of bottle bins shall take place between 0900 and 2000.
- 7. All windows and doors shall be kept closed during regulated entertainment except for access and egress to and from the premises.
- 8. No external speakers
- 9. Management shall ensure quiet dispersal of customers at closing time and that they leave the immediate vicinity of the premises in an orderly fashion.
- 10. The exterior of the building shall be cleared of litter during non-operational hours prior to opening and whilst the premises is open.
- 11. Smoking policy shall be submitted and approved by Public Protection prior to opening the premises to the public.
- 12. On a Friday and Saturday SIA registered door staff shall be employed at the premises at a ratio of 1:100 from 2100 hours until 30 minutes after closing to assist with the safe and orderly dispersal of customers. At all other times SIA door staff shall be employed at the premises in accordance with a risk assessment to be carried out by the DPS. When employed, door staff will wear high visibility arm bands.

7 Sins Smoking Policy

- 1. Customers wishing to smoke will be encouraged to smoke to the left hand side of the main entrance on Lever Street. This area is covered by a CCTV system which is installed at the premises.
- 2. The outside smoking area shall be monitored by staff or door staff at all times in use.
- 3. The area will be cleaned regularly through out the day as well as before and after closing.
- 4. A wall ashtray has been installed on the left hand side of the entrance so customers can dispose of cigarette butts in the correct manner.
- 5. Signs are displayed requesting customers to keep the noise to a minimum.
- 6. Patrons who disregard signage and verbal instructions regarding noise will be asked to move inside and/or leave the premises.
- 7. Open containers of alcohol are not permitted to be taken outside, there is adequate signage in place in the main fover and all staff, including security, are aware that no glass or drinks are permitted outside.
