## Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

### Door Supervisors

1. Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority shall be used at the premises to undertake security activities, which include guarding against: -
  - (a) Unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision),
  - (b) Outbreaks of disorder, or
  - (c) Damage,unless otherwise entitled by virtue of section 4 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001 to carry out such activities.

### Supply of alcohol

2. No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence:
  - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence or,
  - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
3. Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence
4.
  - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either –
    - (a) a holographic mark, or
    - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
5.
  - (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price, which is less than the permitted price.
  - (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in (1) above–
    - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
    - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula–
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
where –
      - (i) P is the permitted price,
      - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
      - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
    - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
    - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
    - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
  - (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
  - (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (3) Where the permitted price given by paragraph (2)(b) would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (4) (a) Sub-paragraph (4)(b) applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (2)(b) on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (b) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

#### **Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule**

1. Staff shall refuse to serve alcohol to persons who appear intoxicated.
2. An effective and adequate CCTV and alarm system shall be operated and maintained at the premises.
3. Crime Prevention Notice shall be prominently displayed at the premises.
4. Firefighting equipment shall be maintained and serviced according to the manufacturer’s instructions on an annual basis.
5. Notices shall be displayed asking patrons not to litter outside the premises.

#### **Annex 3 – Conditions attached after hearing by the licensing authority**

1. Staff shall take all reasonable steps to discourage and prevent people from congregating outside the premises. This shall include monitoring the area outside the premises and asking any people congregating there to leave the area.
2. The area outside the premises shall be kept clean and tidy and the staff shall be required to remove all store associated litter on a regular basis throughout the licensed hours and in particular shall tidy away any litter at the conclusion of the licensing hours.
3. The Challenge/Think 21 policy shall be met in full and appropriate identification sought from any person who appears to be under the age of 21. The only acceptable forms of identification shall be a passport, photographic driving license and those carrying the PASS logo.
4. Notices advising what forms of ID are acceptable shall be clearly displayed.
5. Notices shall be displayed in prominent positions indicating the Challenge/Think 21 policy is in force.
6. The premises shall operate a refusals book in relation to the sale of alcohol.
7. The premises shall display prominent notices explaining the law in relation to purchasing alcohol on behalf of persons under 18.
8. Staff training that includes Challenge/Think 21 policy shall be given to all staff prior to employment and all staff shall receive refresher training every 4 months.

9. Regular checks shall be made by staff around and outside the premises for underage persons encouraging adults to buy alcohol for them.
