Please accept this as formal notification of the Greater Manchester Police objection to the premises licence in relation to the above premises on the grounds of Prevention of Crime and Disorder and the Prevention of Public Nuisance, Public Safety and the Protection of Children from Harm.

The operating schedule which accompanies the application offers very little in terms of enforceable conditions. The conditions that have been offered are very vague and generic which gives the impression that the applicant has a limited understanding of the Licensing Objectives, which raises concerns about how the premises will be operated.

The likely effect of the grant of the Premises Licence with such a scant operating schedule is that all 4 of the Licensing Objectives will be undermined.

We therefore ask that this application is refused.

Licensing & Out of Hours Compliance Team (LOOH) as the responsible authority have assessed the likely impact of the grant of this application considering a number of factors, including the nature of the area in which the premises is located and the proximity to residential accommodation, the hours applied for and any potential risk that the grant of this application could lead to issues of public nuisance.

General description of premises as given by the applicant:

Thai Restaurant

Proposed hours and licensable activities:

Provision of regulated entertainment (recorded music): Mon to Sun 11.30am to 11pm The provision of regulated entertainment (recorded music) will take place both indoors and outdoors.

The supply of alcohol for consumption both on and off the premises: Mon to Sun 11.30am to 11pm

Opening hours: Mon to Sun 11.30am to 11pm

The proposed premises, a relatively small, former licensed chip shop/restaurant, is located on the busy and popular Burton Road, Didsbury. Located in a row of mixed used commercial and residential premises. There are residential properties directly above, adjacent, to the rear and facing the premises over Burton Road. Of concern for LOOH is the potential for public nuisance problems from customers arriving to and leaving the premises, during later hours and when seated outside when eating/drinking and smoking.

Noise from raised voices, shouting, and laughing and the de regulated entertainment (described by the applicant as standard background soft music from a normal speaker) in such close proximity to residential properties will lead to noise disturbances.

There have been no effective measures or controls offered by the applicant to address these expected noise problems.

There is also the potential for noise disturbances for nearby residents from waste being emptied in to recycling receptacles during noise sensitive times.

Noise from glass and bottles being emptied can be particularly intrusive if there are no measures in place to ensure they are not disposed of during later hours and similarly, noise caused by waste collections must also be controlled.

It was therefore felt by LOOH that the additional conditions, specifically addressing our public nuisance concerns above should be attached to the premise licence subject to the licensing committees' approval.

- 1. Noise from amplified music or voices shall not be such as to cause a noise nuisance to occupants within nearby residential properties.
- 2. Bifold doors and any windows should remain closed after 22:00.
- 3. Front door to remain closed after 22:00 save for access and egress.
- 4. There shall be no external speakers.
- 5. The supply of alcohol shall only be to a person seated, taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.
- 6. Customers must vacate all outside tables and chairs by 22:00 each evening.
- 7. Staff shall monitor any customers smoking outside the premises on a regular basis and ensure patrons do not cause a public nuisance.
- 8. Notice shall be displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local resident and use the are quietly.
- 9. The area outside the premises shall be kept clean and tidy. Staff hall be required to remove litter associated with premises on a regular basis whilst open and shall clear any litter when the premises closes.
- 10. A prominent, clear, and legible notice shall be displayed at the exit to the premises asking customers to respect the needs of residents and to leave the area quietly.

11. The emptying of bins and refuse collections, shall not take place between 22:00 and 08:00 hours.

Section 7 of Manchester City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy sets out considerations that must be taken in to account when assessing the impact of a premises to local residents in relation to the potential for nuisance.

We believe the above conditions are proportionate and necessary to uphold the licensing objectives in relation to preventing public nuisance.

This is a residential area and - while Burton Road benefits from its various food outlets - granting this license will be injurious to the people living nearby. Specifically it risks causing a public nuisance.



To whom it may concern,

we have been made aware of the application for a new licence which allows recorded music to be played both indoors and outdoors until 11pm Monday to Sunday. Whilst we understand the indoor music being allowed, we are raising concerns that the playing of recorded music outdoors will be a significant noise nuisance to our property

We have a **second second** at home and are already experiencing loud music and antisocial behaviour from 174 Burton Road (Sett), which we have already reported to the council. With specific regards to the licensing objectives; the prevention of public nuisance and the prevention of crime and disorder, we have often experienced customers leaving the premises intoxicated, loud, urinating/ vomiting on the side of our house and littering. We believe that the issuing of this licence to MyThai will only exacerbate this problem for us.

With regards to the playing of recorded music indoors, we think it would be reasonable to request restrictions on the volume of indoor music played due to the close proximity of our house to the premises. We would also like to reiterate that we are unsure of the need for outdoor music to be played in a residential area especially till 11pm.
