Good afternoon,

I am writing with concerns about the application reference 296175/SMC.

I am concerned about the impact this will have on traffic in the area. The Burnage branch of this restaurant chain constantly has drivers parked outside the restaurant blocking the left turning lane and forcing drivers to navigate around them.

The litter present at the other stores is atrocious and I am concerned that this will be the same case in Chorlton. There is little or no parking available for customers or delivery staff and I am worried that people will end up blocking the roads in the same way they do at the Burnage restaurant. This is both unsafe for pedestrians and motorists.

The extended opening hours are also unsuitable for the area. I believe there is no need for the restaurant to be open until 2am on weekends and feel that this will attract unwanted crowds outside the shop and add to the noise pollution and inevitable litter. I am not aware of any other outlets open this late in the immediate area so can see this becoming a congregation point at unsociable hours.


