<p>The Trading Standards Team have assessed the likely impact of the granting of this application taking into account a number of factors, including the conditions offered and times applied for and any potential risk that the granting of this application could lead to issues which do not uphold the licensing objectives specifically the protection of children from harm.</p> <p>The application is for a distribution and supply of alcohol within a small beer craft bar</p> <p>When considering the application, the Trading Standards Team have given consideration to Manchester City Councils Statement of Licensing Policy 2021 – 2026.</p> <p>The original application addresses few points relating to the Licensing Objectives especially in protecting children from harm.</p> <p>Giving consideration to the above application, the Trading Standards Team therefore recommend that the following conditions are applied to the licence.</p>

1. Though training in the challenge 25 scheme is mentioned, I would like to rep this condition with the addition that: "All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol will be trained with regards to the Challenge 25 policy and **sales by proxy**. This training will be documented, and **training should be refreshed at no greater than 6 monthly Intervals.**"
2. The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that signage demonstrating the Challenge 25 policy as well as selling alcohol to children by proxy are placed at the entrance to the premises as well as being displayed in all areas serving alcohol.

Representation

Licensing and out of hours team (LOOHT) have assessed the likely impact of granting the licence, considering a number of factors, including, the nature of the area in which the premises is located, the hours applied for and any potential risk that the granting of this licence could undermine the licensing objectives.

They have applied to run a small craft beer bar on the approach leading up to Oxford Road station, licensable activities of Provision of regulated entertainment (recorded music) (indoors) and the supply of alcohol for consumption both on and off the premises:

Sun to Thu 10am to 12 midnight, Fri to Sat 10am to 1am

Provision of late-night refreshment:

Sun to Thu 11pm to 12 midnight, Fri to Sat 11pm to 1am

Opening hours:

Sun to Thu 10am to 12:30am, Fri to Sat 10am to 1:30am

The applicant has not considered a terminal hour for the outside seating area, nor have they considered public nuisance in terms of deterring people from coming and sitting in that area, ensuring no furniture is left out which would undermine the licensing objectives. Furthermore, the applicant has not offered any conditions to manage the conduct of patrons leaving the premises and the people noise from the premises. There has been no offer of a risk assessment for the need of SIA registered door staff. The premises is located within an area leading up to a busy city centre train station, which could be at a higher risk of a terrorist attack there is no mention of adhering or adopting Martyn's Law to uphold the public safety licensing objective.

LOOH do not believe that the conditions offered by the applicant would fully uphold the licencing objectives and therefore asked that the application in its current form be refused.

Recommendation:

Refuse Application
