**Representation**

The Licensing and Out of Hours Team (LOOHT) have assessed the likely impact of the grant of the late Temporary Event Notice (TEN) considering several factors, including the activities being applied for, the nature of the area in which the premises is located and any potential risk the granting of the Temporary Events could have on any of the four licensing objectives.

As a result of this assessment the LOOHT have concerns that the grant of the temporary event is likely to lead to the Prevention of Public Nuisance, the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and the Public Safety Licensing objectives being undermined.

The TEN proposes to utilise Dorsey Street, by way of a road closure, to allow for the sale of alcohol (for consumption both on and off the premises) and the placement of 8 tables and 32 chairs on the highway. The event is intended to take place on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of August 2024, 24<sup>th</sup> of August 2024 and 25<sup>th</sup> of August 2024 between 1100hrs to 2200hrs each day for 180 people.

Dorsey Street is adopted highway and to close the street or part of it would require a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order. Enquires have been made with Manchester City Council Highways Team who have confirmed that an application to close Dorsey Street on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of August 2024, 24<sup>th</sup> of August 2024 and 25<sup>th</sup> of August 2024 has not been received.

Furthermore, the placement of tables and chairs on the highway would require the submission and grant of a Pavement Licence under The Business and Planning Act 2010 to allow the premises to utilise the area for this purpose.

The TEN fails to provide any details as to how the premises intend to effectively manage the external area. The LOOHT are concerned that the sale of alcohol (for consumption both on and off the premises) could potentially lead to customers exiting the area with open containers of alcohol therefore creating a heightened risk that the alcohol could be consumed on the street. This would breach the Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) which relates to people drinking alcohol or having open containers of alcohol in the streets, potentially contributing to instances of crime and disorder and public nuisance.

For the above reasons the LOOHT recommend that this Temporary Event is refused.

**Recommendation: Refuse TEN**
