Representation

Outline your representation regarding the above application below. This representation should describe the likely effect of the grant of the licence/certificate on the licensing objectives and on the vicinity of the premises.

The Licensing and Out of Hours Team (LOOH) have assessed the likely impact of granting this Temporary Event Notice (TEN) taking into account a number of factors, including the nature of the area the event is to be held and any potential risk the granting of this licence could lead to undermining the four licensing objectives.

Short Street, the road upon which the entrances to both Crazy Pedro's and NQ64 are located, is a public road maintained by Manchester City Council and freely accessible for use by the public. In order for the event to operate in the manner as indicated in the TEN, a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) would be required to enable the tables, chairs, speakers and DJ equipment to be placed on the street. There does not appear to be a TRO in place in this location for this date.

Carrying out this event without a TRO would undermine the licensing objectives of public safety and prevention of public nuisance. Vehicles attempting to move down the street will pose a risk of injury to the attendees of the event, and there is a secondary risk that the event could cause an obstruction to the fire escape route of 33 Oldham Street, which is located at the top end of Short Street. This is further compounded by the foreseeable obstacle that this event would add to the ability to maintain and manage the capacity across Crazy Pedro's, NQ64 and the proposed TEN area. Additionally, the blockage of a public street to which the public have a right of way also poses the risk of resulting in public nuisance.

LOOH are not satisfied that the TEN offers sufficient assurance that the licensing objectives can be upheld to an acceptable standard; we therefore recommend that the TEN is refused.

Recommendation: Refuse Application
