Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

Door Supervisors

1. Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority shall be used at the premises to undertake security activities, which include guarding against: -
 - (a) Unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision),
 - (b) Outbreaks of disorder, or
 - (c) Damage,unless otherwise entitled by virtue of section 4 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001 to carry out such activities.

Supply of alcohol

2. No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence or,
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
3. Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence
4.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either –
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
5.
 - (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price, which is less than the permitted price.
 - (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in (1) above–
 - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula–
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
where –
 - (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) “valued added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (3) Where the permitted price given by paragraph (2)(b) would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (4) (a) Sub-paragraph (4)(b) applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (2)(b) on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (b) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises shall be covered, enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record while the premises are open to the public and recordings shall be kept available and unedited for a minimum of 28 days. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV shall be present on the premises at all times when they are open to the public and shall be able to produce/download/burn CCTV images upon request by a Police Officer or Authorised Officer of the Local Authority. Any footage must be in a format that can be placed on a standard personal computer or DVD player. Where recording is on a removable medium (i.e. compact disc, flash card etc.), a secure storage system to store those recording mediums shall be provided.
2. A Refusals Log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to the Police or an Authorised Officer of the Licensing Authority.
3. All staff shall be trained in the relevant age restrictions in respect of products, recognising signs of drunkenness, how to refuse service and the conditions in force under this premises licence. Documented records of training completed shall be kept for each member of staff. Training shall be regularly refreshed at no greater than 6 monthly intervals. Training records shall be made available for inspection upon request by the police or an Authorised Officer of the Local Authority.
4. All fire-fighting equipment shall be inspected and serviced in line with the manufacturer’s instructions.
5. The premises and its forecourt shall be kept clean and free from litter at all times the premises are open to the public.
6. No deliveries shall be made to the premises between 2100 and 0700 hours.
7. The premises shall install and maintain an EPOS system which identifies age-restricted products and prompts the staff to carry out an ID Check. The system shall have a CCTV camera on the till to record customers being served.
8. A Challenge 25 Policy shall be implemented in full and appropriate identification shall be sought from any person who appears to be under the age of 25. The only acceptable forms of identification shall be passport, photo-card Driving Licence and those carrying the PASS logo.
9. Notices shall be displayed in prominent positions at the premises indicating that a Challenge 25 policy is in force.
10. Staff training shall include a Challenge 25 Policy and its operation. In particular, staff shall be trained to take such action as is necessary to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons over the age of 18 where those customers are engaged in the distribution of alcohol to persons under the age of 18. The training shall be given to all new members of staff before they commence paid employment and all staff shall be retrained at least twice yearly.
