Representation

Outline your representation regarding the above application below. This representation should describe the likely effect of the grant of the licence/certificate on the licensing objectives and on the vicinity of the premises.

The Licensing and Out of Hours have assessed the likely impact of the late night premises opening The Shop - Ice Cream Parlour, Unit 3, Bishops Corner, 321 Stretford Road, Manchester, M15 4UW taking into account a number of factors. This includes the location of nearby residential properties, the hours applied for and any potential risk that the granting of this licence, could lead to issues that could rise to Public Nuisance.

The applicant requested a late night refreshment licence Monday – Thursday 15:00 – 01:00 Friday – Sunday 15:00 – 03:00. With opening hours to the public Monday – Thursday 15:00 – 01:00 Friday – Sunday 15:00 – 03:00.

The premises is on Stretford Road and is part of a busy area within the Hulme ward, it is also on a main arterial route in and out of the City Centre, whilst also being apart of a busy, mixed student and residential neighbourhood. Above the premises is residential dwellings. We have concerns that the premises could cause a noise problem for the nearby residents due to noise generated by staff using commercial bins when clearing up, noise from deliveries, delivery drivers, and patrons using the premises. We also have concerns that the external area of the premises will have a lot of litter from takeaways at the premises which are bought from the premises. The timings in which the premises have applied to be open till also allow for the concerns prescribed above.

Section M of the application also requires the applicant to describe any additional steps in order to promote the licensing objectives as a result of the proposed application, the applicant has included some information as to how

they will attempt to prevent noise nuisance but have not given enough detail to satisfy how they will prevent noise emanating from the premises and litter congregating outside the premises.

The LOOH team therefore feel that the following conditions and times shall be implemented on this licence to prevent a public nuisance from occurring at the premises:

Opening times and Late night refreshment times: Monday - Thursday 23:00 - 00:00 Friday - Sunday 23:00 - 01:00

Conditions:

- During the hours of Late Night Refreshment the premises shall operate as a delivery service only. No sit in service shall be provided.
- No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises that gives rise to a nuisance.
- There shall be no admittance to the premises with the exception of delivery drivers after 23:00 hours.
- The premises and immediate surrounding area shall be kept clean and free from litter at all times the premises are open to the public.
- All takeaway packaging and wrappers shall clearly identify the premises, ie. by way of company logo or name.
- Litter bins shall be provided at the premises in sufficient capacity to ensure that customers can adequately dispose of any litter.
- No rubbish, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 22:00 and 08:00 hours.
- No deliveries must be made to the premises between 22:00 and 08:00 hours.
- Delivery drivers shall conduct the delivery in a manner that will not cause a noise disturbance to the occupiers of any residential properties surrounding the delivery address. This includes the avoidance of slamming doors, playing loud music, shouting, over revving engines and sounding horns to signal their arrival. The driver shall turn the engine off immediately upon arrival at the delivery address and will park considerately without causing any obstruction to the highway.
