## Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

### Door Supervisors

1. Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority shall be used at the premises to undertake security activities, which include guarding against: -
  - (a) Unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision),
  - (b) Outbreaks of disorder, or
  - (c) Damage,unless otherwise entitled by virtue of section 4 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001 to carry out such activities.

### Supply of alcohol

2. No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence:
  - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence or,
  - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
3. Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence
4.
  - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either –
    - (a) a holographic mark, or
    - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
5.
  - (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price, which is less than the permitted price.
  - (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in (1) above–
    - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
    - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula–

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where –

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
    - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
    - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
    - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
  - (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
  - (e) “valued added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (3) Where the permitted price given by paragraph (2)(b) would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (4) (a) Sub-paragraph (4)(b) applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (2)(b) on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (b) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

#### **Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule**

1. Any person who tries to gain entry to the premises and appears to be intoxicated or who is involved in disorderly conduct outside the premises shall not be permitted entry to the premises. The premises licence holder shall ensure that any person within the premises who appears to be intoxicated or who is involved in disorderly conduct in the premises is removed from the premises.
1. The Premises Licence Holder shall report any incidents of crime and disorder that occur on or near to the premises to Greater Manchester Police.

#### **Annex 3 – Conditions attached after hearing by the licensing authority**

1. The premises shall operate and promote challenge 21 proof of age scheme whereby any person attempting to buy alcohol who appears to be under 21 should be asked to produce appropriate identification. The only acceptable identification that shall be accepted is a passport, photo driving licence or PASS accredited proof of age card.
1. Notice must be displayed indicating that it is an offence to buy or attempt to buy alcohol for a person who is under 18 and for a person under the age of 18 to buy or attempt to buy alcohol.
2. All staff shall be trained with regards to the challenge 21 policy and forms of acceptable ID. Staff shall also be trained to look out for and take action to prevent proxy sales taking place. This training shall be recorded in writing. Training shall be repeated on a regular basis and details of repeated training shall also be recorded in writing.
3. A refusal book shall be kept at the premises and this shall be checked each week by either the premises licence holder or the designated premises supervisor.
4. The Designated Premises Supervisor to maintain a notice of authority book for all staff who sell alcohol. All staff selling alcohol to be in possession of formal identification in order that officers from Responsible Authorities can check against the authorisation book.
5. CCTV to be installed at the premises and must cover the point of sale at all times. The recordings should be retained for a minimum of 28 days and made available to responsible authorities on request.
