


Growing our provision in Manchester and aligning to economic/social need

More than 60% of starts at Total People in 2018-19 were on level 3 or above apprenticeships In 2018-19 over 60% of starts were on standards (compared to 8% in 2016-17) in response to the apprenticeship reforms Direct delivery has remained at a steady level despite external landscape changes; sub-contracted provision has reduced to 15% from 50% in 2016-17

Key Sector Challenges

Insufficient funding to deliver Local industrial strategy and Manchester plans.

GM and Manchester SME dominated, Non Levy allocations appear to be significantly below need. Large employer funding for Levy payers significantly underspent and monthly hand back to Treasury This disconnect a significant barrier for Manchester and GM
